A Prelude to Passover

The **Calling** of **Moses**

(Exodus 3:7-10, 4:1-17)

A. His Mission Revealed (3:7-10)

⁷ The Lord said (to Moses),
"I have surely seen the affliction of My people who are in Egypt, and have given heed to their cry because of their taskmasters, for I am aware of their sufferings.

⁸ So I have **come down** to **deliver them** from the **power** of the **Egyptians**, and to **bring them up** from that land to a **good** and **spacious land**, to a land flowing with **milk** and **honey**, to the place of the Canaanite and the Hittite and the Amorite and the Perizzite and the Hivite and the Jebusite.

⁹ Now, behold, **the cry** of the **sons of Israel** has come **to Me**; furthermore, I have **seen** the **oppression** with which the **Egyptians** are **oppressing them**.

¹⁰ Therefore, **come now**, and **I will <u>send you</u>** to **Pharaoh**, so that <u>you</u> may <u>bring</u> My people, the sons of Israel, <u>out</u> of Egypt..."

B. His Many Fears Expressed (4:1-17)

- 1. A *Fear* of <u>Rejection</u> (4:1-9)
- 4 Then Moses said, "What if they will <u>not</u> believe me or listen to what I say?

 For they may say, 'The Lord has not appeared to you."

²The LORD said to him, "What is that in your hand?" And he said, "A staff."

³ Then **He said**, "**Throw it** on the **ground**." So he **threw it** on the **ground**, and it **became** a **serpent**; and **Moses fled** from it.

⁴ But **the Lord** said to **Moses**, "Stretch out **your hand** and grasp *it* by **its tail**"—so he stretched out **his hand** and **caught it**, and it **became** a **staff** in **his hand**—

⁵ "that they may <u>believe</u> that the LORD, the God of their fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has <u>appeared</u> to you."

⁶ The Lord furthermore said to him, "Now put your hand into your bosom."

So he put his hand into his bosom, and when he took it out, behold, his hand was <u>leprous</u> like snow.

⁷Then **He said**, "Put your **hand** into **your bosom** again."
So he put his **hand** into **his bosom** again, and when he **took it out** of **his bosom**, behold, it was **restored** like *the rest of* **his flesh**.

⁸ "If they will **not believe you** or **heed** the **witness** of the **first** <u>sign</u>, they **may believe** the **witness** of the **last** <u>sign</u>.

⁹ But if they will **not believe** even these *two* <u>signs</u> or <u>heed</u> what **you say**, then you shall take **some water** from the **Nile** and **pour it** on the **dry ground**; and the **water** which you take from the **Nile** will **become** blood on the **dry ground**."

2. A *Fear* of <u>Inadequacy</u> (4:10-13)

¹⁰ Then Moses said to the LORD, "Please, Lord, I have never been eloquent, neither recently nor in time past, nor since You have spoken to Your servant; for I am slow of speech and slow of tongue."

¹¹ The LORD said to him, "Who has *made* man's mouth?
Or who *makes him* mute or deaf, or seeing or blind? Is it not I, the LORD?

¹² Now then **go**, and **I**, **even I**, will **be** with **your mouth**, and **teach you** what you are **to say**."

¹³ But he said, "Please, Lord, now send the message by whomever You will."

3. A *Friend* and **Spokesperson** to **Assist Moses** (4:14-17)

¹⁴ Then the **anger** of **the LORD burned** *against* **Moses**, and **He said**, "Is there not your **brother Aaron** the **Levite**? I know that **he speaks** *fluently*.

And moreover, behold, **he** is coming out to **meet you**; when he **sees you**, he will be **glad** in **his heart**.

¹⁵ You are to speak to him and <u>put</u> the *words* in his mouth; and I, even I, will be with your mouth and his mouth, and I will teach you what you are to do.

¹⁶ Moreover, <u>he</u> shall **speak for you** to **the people**; and **he** will be as a **mouth for you** and **you** will be as **God to him**.

¹⁷ You shall take in your hand this *staff*, with which you shall perform the <u>signs</u>."

Message Summary Moses' Fears....God's Response

1. Moses' $Fear \rightarrow \underline{Rejection}$...

"What if they will <u>not believe me</u> or listen to what I say?"
For they may say, 'The LORD has <u>not</u> appeared to you." (4:1)

God's *Response* → He promises to establish Moses' <u>authority</u>, and then *reassures* him with three signs of His power

2. Moses' $Fear \rightarrow Personal Inadequacy...$

"Please, Lord, I have <u>never</u> been eloquent, neither recently nor in time past, nor since You have spoken to Your servant; for I am <u>slow</u> of speech and <u>slow</u> of tongue." (4:10)

God's *Response*→ He would make Moses <u>adequate</u> for the task

Now then **go**, and **I**, **even I**, will be <u>with</u> your mouth, and <u>teach</u> you what you are to say." (4:12)

3. Moses's continued *Reluctance* → ...

But **he (Moses)** said, "Please, Lord, now send *the message* by <u>whomever</u> You will."(4:13)

God's *Response* → He would provide for Moses a <u>spokesman</u> and companion—Aaron the Levite

"Is there not your brother Aaron the Levite? I know that he speaks fluently...

You are to speak to him and *put* the words in his mouth; and I, even I, will be with *your* mouth and *his* mouth, and I will teach you what you are to do.

Moreover, <u>he</u> shall <u>speak</u> for you to the people; and he will be as a mouth for you and you will be as God to him. (4:14b-16)

Personal Application

Like **Moses**, *we too* may have similar *Fears* with regard to our **Ministry Calling**—However, like **He** did with **Moses**, **God** *assures us* of **His Presence** and **Power**

1. Like **Moses**, we may **fear** <u>Rejection</u>, but **God promises** to establish our witness and testimony through His <u>Spirit</u> and <u>Power</u>.

The LORD is my *light* and my *salvation*; Whom shall I <u>fear?</u>
The LORD is the *defense* of my life; Whom shall I <u>dread</u>? (Psalm 27:1)

but *you* (disciples) will receive <u>power</u> when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and *you* shall be <u>My witnesses</u> both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

I (Paul) was with you in *weakness* and in *fear* and in *much trembling*, and my <u>message</u> and my <u>preaching</u> were *not* in *persuasive* words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power,

so that **your** *faith* would **not rest** on the **wisdom of men**, but on the **power of God**. (I Corinthians 2:3-5)

2. Like **Moses**, *we* may have **fears** of **Inadequacy**, but **God** has **promised** to make **us adequate**, and **able** to **accomplish** what **He** has *called us* as **believers** to do.

and you (disciples) will even be brought before governors and kings for My sake,...

But when they hand you over, do <u>not</u> worry about how or what you are to say; for it will be <u>given you</u> in that hour what you are to say.

For it is not you who speak, but *it is* the <u>Spirit</u> of your Father who speaks <u>in you</u>. (Matthew 10:18-20)

Not that **we** (**Paul** and **Timothy**) are <u>adequate</u> in **ourselves** to consider anything as *coming* from **ourselves**, but **our** <u>adequacy</u> is from **God**,

who also **made us** <u>adequate</u> as servants of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives <u>life</u>. (II Corinthians 3:5-6)

And **God is <u>able</u>** to make **all** *grace* abound **to you**, so that always having **all** <u>sufficiency</u> in everything, you may have an **abundance** for **every good deed**; (II Corinthians 9:8)

3. Like Moses, *our* <u>fears</u> may be such that we want God to call someone else instead. As believers, God has given us a "<u>Helper</u>," who *indwells* us, *teaches* us, and *strengthens* us for service (Acts 1:8). The Lord also declares that He will "<u>never</u> leave us <u>nor</u> forsake us" (Hebrews 13:5).

I (Jesus) will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may be with you forever; that is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it does not see Him or know Him, but you know Him because He abides with you and will be in you.

"I will **not** leave you as **orphans**; I will come to you. (John 14:16-18)

At my **first defense** *no one* **supported me** (Paul), but **all deserted me**; may it **not** be counted against them.

But the Lord <u>stood</u> with me and <u>strengthened</u> me, so that through me the proclamation might be fully accomplished, and that all the *Gentiles* might hear; and I was <u>rescued</u> out of the lion's mouth. (II Timothy 4:16-17)
