Preparing a Fisherman for a "Harvest" "Snapshots" in the Life of Peter

I. Peter's Calling

Now as **Jesus** was walking by the **Sea of Galilee**, He saw **two brothers**, **Simon** who was called **Peter**, and **Andrew** his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were **fishermen**.

And **He** said to them, "**Follow Me**, and I will make you **fishers** of **men**." *Immediately* they **left** their **nets** and <u>followed Him</u>.

(Matt. 4:18-20)

II. Peter's "Compulsive" Character

- A. *Requesting* that **he too**, be allowed to <u>walk on water</u> (Matt. 14:28-32)
- B. **Rebuking** the **Lord** concerning **His** impending <u>death</u> (Matt. 16:22-23)
- C. *Refusing* to allow his feet to be washed (John 13:6-11)
- D. *Rashly* cutting off the ear of the high priest's servant (Mark 14:47)

III. Peter's Confession of Faith

Now when **Jesus** came into the district of **Caesaria Philippi**, **He** was asking **His disciples**, "**Who** do **people** say that the **Son of Man** is?"

And they said, "Some say **John the Baptist**; and others **Elijah**; but still others, **Jeremiah**, or **one** of the **prophets**."

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

And **Jesus** said to **him**, "**Blessed** are you **Simon Barjona**, because **flesh** and **blood** did **not reveal** this to **you**, but **My Father** who is **in heaven**. I also say to you that you are **Peter** and upon **this <u>rock</u>** will **I build My church**...

I will give you the **keys** of the **kingdom of heaven**;..." (Matt. 16:13-19a)

IV. Peter's Conceited Claim

Then Jesus said to them (His disciples), "You will all *fall away* because of **Me this night**, for it is written,

'I WILL <u>STRIKE DOWN</u> THE **SHEPHERD**,
AND THE **SHEEP** OF THE **FLOCK** WILL BE **SCATTERED**.'

But after I have been raised, I will go ahead of you to Galilee."

But **Peter** said to **Him**, "Even though **all may fall away** because of **You**, I will **never fall away**." **Jesus** said to **him**, "**Truly** I say to you that **this very night**, before a **rooster crows**, **you** (**Peter**) will **deny Me three times**."

Peter said to Him, "Even if I have to die with You, I will <u>not</u> deny You."

All the disciples said the same thing too.

(Matt. 26:31-35)

V. Peter's *Collapse* in <u>Faith</u>

Having arrested Him (Jesus), they led Him away and brought Him to the house of the high priest; but Peter was following at a distance.

After they had kindled **a fire** in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, **Peter** was sitting among them.

And a **servant-girl**, seeing him as he sat in the firelight and looking intently at him, said, "**This man** was **with Him too.**"

But **he <u>denied it</u>**, saying, "**Woman**, I do <u>not know Him</u>."

A little later **another saw him** and said, "**You** are **one of them too!**"

But **Peter** said, "Man, I **am not!**"

After about an hour had passed, **another man** began to insist, saying, "Certainly **this man** also was with Him, for he is a **Galilean too**."

But **Peter** said, "**Man, I do <u>not</u> know** what you are talking about." Immediately, while he was still speaking, a <u>rooster crowed</u>.

Then **the Lord turned** and *looked* at **Peter**.

And **Peter** *remembered* the **word** of **the Lord**, how **He** had told **him**, "Before a **rooster crows today**, you will **deny Me three times.**"

And he went out and wept bitterly.

(Luke 22:54-62)

VI. Peter's *Charge* from the <u>Lord</u>

So when they had finished **breakfast**, **Jesus** said to **Simon Peter**, "**Simon**, son of **John**, do you **love Me** more than **these**?"

He (Peter) said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I *love* You." He said to him, "Tend My lambs."

He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep."

He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?' And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things;

You know that I love You."

Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep...."
(John 21:15-17)

VII. Peter's Climactic Shavuot Message

When the day of **Pentecost (Shavuot)** had come, they were all together in **one place**....

And they were all *filled* with the **Holy Spirit** and began to speak with **other** *tongues*, as the **Spirit** was **giving them utterance**.

Now there were **devout Jews** living in **Jerusalem**, **devout** men from every **nation** under heaven...

But **Peter**, taking his stand with the *eleven*, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words....

this is what was spoken of through the prophet **Joel**:

'AND IT SHALL BE IN **THE LAST DAYS**,' **God says**, 'THAT I WILL **POUR FORTH** OF **MY SPIRIT** ON ALL MANKIND;'..."

"Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know---

this *Man*, delivered over by the predetermined plan of God, *you* nailed to a <u>cross</u> by the hands of godless men and put *Him* to death.

But **God** <u>raised Him up</u> again, putting an <u>end</u> to the **agony of death**, since it was **impossible** for **Him** to be held in **its power**...."

This Jesus God <u>raised up</u> again, to which we all are <u>witnesses</u>...

Therefore let all the **house of Israel** know for **certain** that **God** has **made Him** both **Lord** and **Messiah**---this **Jesus** whom **you crucified**."

Now when they **heard** this, they were **pierced to the heart**,...

So then, **those** who had <u>received his word</u> were **baptized**: and that day were added about <u>three thousand souls</u>. (Acts 2:1, 4-5, 14, 16-17a, 22-24, 32, 36-37a, 41)

Personal Application Peter's Call to Service, what does it Teach us?

1. God calls and uses **people** who are willing to fully <u>commit</u> themselves to following Him.

And **He** (**Jesus**) said to **them**, "**Follow Me**, and I will make you **fishers** of **men**." *Immediately* they <u>left</u> their **nets** and <u>followed Him</u>. (Matt. 4:19-20)

2. God often uses people who seemingly have glaring weaknesses

Note→ Peter's compulsive character (Matt. 16:21-23, Mark 14:47)
→ Peter's conceited boast (Matt. 26:31-35)
→ Peter's collapse in faith (Luke 22:54-62)

3. God uses people that "step out" in faith

Note → Peter "stepped out" in <u>faith</u> and walked on water (Matt. 14:28-32)

→ Peter's *bold* confession of Messiah

He (Jesus) said to them, "But who do <u>you</u> say that I am?"

Simon Peter answered,

"You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God. (Matt. 16:15-16)

4. God desires *leaders* who will genuinely care for His people

He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You."

He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep." (John 21:16)

5. God will *empower* for service those whom He <u>calls</u> and <u>prepares</u>

He (Jesus) said to them (His disciples):..
"but you will receive <u>power</u> when the <u>Holy Spirit</u> comes on you;
and you will be <u>my witnesses</u> in *Jerusalem*, and in all *Judea*and *Samaria*, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:7a, 8)
