The Book of Romans

I. Paul's <u>Introduction</u> to his Letter (1:1-17)

II. Paul *Declares* Man's <u>Need</u> for God's <u>Salvation</u> and <u>Righteousness</u> (1:18-3:20)

- A. He *Declares* that the <u>Wrath</u> of God is <u>Revealed</u> Against all *Ungodliness* and *Unrighteousness* of Men (1:18-2:16)
 - 1. *Who* have "suppressed the <u>truth</u> of God in unrighteousness" (1:18)
 - 2. *Who* have <u>rejected</u> the true <u>knowledge</u> of God made evident to them (1:18-20)
 - 3. *Who* have <u>exchanged</u> the worship of the true God, for the worship of <u>idolatry</u> (1:21-23)
 - 4. *Who* have been <u>abandoned</u> by God to follow the "lusts" of their own hearts (1:24-31)

5. *Who* know the righteous judgment of God, yet *practice* unrighteousness themselves (1:32-2:16)

- a. *Having* knowledge of God's <u>condemnation</u> of "such things" (1:32a)
- b. *Having* both <u>practiced</u> and <u>approved</u> of the unrighteousness (1:32b)
- c. *Having* passed judgment on others for what they themselves practice (2:1)
 - 1) which leaves them with <u>no excuse</u> before God (2:1a)
 - 2) which results in their own <u>self-condemnation</u> (2:1b)

³² and although they know the ordinance of God, that those who practice such things are worthy of <u>death</u>, they not only <u>do</u> the same, but also give hearty approval to those who practice them.

Therefore **you** have **no excuse**, *everyone* of **you** who **passes** *judgment*, for in that which you **judge** *another*, **you condemn** <u>yourself</u>; for **you** who **judge** <u>practice</u> the *same things*. (1:32, 2:1)

d. Having **failed** to **recognize** their **own** <u>accountability</u> before **God** (2:2-16)

² And <u>we know</u> that the <u>judgment</u> of God *rightly falls* upon those who **practice such things**. ³ But do you suppose this, O man, when you pass judgment on those who practice such things and <u>do</u> the same yourself, that you will escape the judgment of God?

⁴Or do you *think lightly* of the **riches** of **His** *kindness* and *tolerance* and **patience**, not knowing that the <u>kindness</u> of God leads you to <u>repentance</u>?

⁵ But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up <u>wrath</u> for yourself in the day of <u>wrath</u> and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,

⁶ who WILL RENDER TO EACH PERSON ACCORDING TO HIS <u>DEEDS</u>: ⁷ to those who by perseverance in doing <u>good</u> seek for glory and honor and immortality, <u>eternal life</u>;

⁸ but to **those** who are **selfishly ambitious** and do <u>not obey</u> the truth, but <u>obey unrighteousness</u>, <u>wrath</u> and <u>indignation</u>.

⁹ There will be tribulation and distress for every soul of man who does <u>evil</u>, of the Jew first and also of the Greek,
¹⁰ but glory and honor and peace to everyone who does <u>good</u>, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

¹¹ For there is **<u>no partiality</u>** with **God**.

¹² For all who have sinned without the Law will also perish without the Law, and all who have sinned under the Law will be judged by the Law;
¹³ for *it is* not the *hearers* of the Law who are just before God, but the <u>doers</u> of the Law will be justified.

¹⁴ For when Gentiles who do not have the Law <u>do</u> instinctively the things of the Law, these, not having the Law, are a law to themselves,

¹⁵ in that they show the work of the Law written in their <u>hearts</u>, their conscience bearing witness and their thoughts alternately accusing or else defending them,
 ¹⁶ on the day when, according to my gospel, God will judge the secrets of men through Messiah Jesus.

<u>Personal Application</u> There will be *Accountability*

If you say, "See, we did not <u>know</u> this," Does He not consider *it* who weighs the hearts? And does He not know *it* who keeps your soul? And will He not <u>render</u> to man according to <u>his work</u>? (Proverbs 24:12)

A. *Accountability* for <u>Believers</u>

For <u>we</u> must all appear before the <u>judgment seat</u> of Messiah, so that each one may be recompensed for his <u>deeds</u> in the body, according to what he has <u>done</u>, whether <u>good or bad</u>. (II Corinthians 5:10)

For the **Son of Man** is going to **come** in the **glory** of **His Father** with **His angels**, and WILL THEN **REPAY** EVERY MAN ACCORDING TO <u>HIS DEEDS</u>. (Matthew 16:27)

But you, why do you judge your brother?

Or you again, why do you regard **your brother** with **contempt**? For **we** will all **stand before** the **judgment seat** of **God**...

So then **each one** of us will give **an** <u>account</u> of **himself** to **God**. (Romans 14:10, 12)

B. Accountability for Unbelievers

For the wicked boasts of his heart's desire, And the greedy man *curses* and *spurns* the LORD...

Why has the wicked spurned God? He has said to himself, "You will not <u>require it.</u>" (Psalm 10:3, 13)

"I, the LORD, *search* the heart, I *test* the mind, Even to give to each man according to <u>his ways</u>, According to the **results** of his <u>deeds</u>. (Jeremiah 17:10)

Many of those who **sleep** in the dust of the **ground** will **awake**, **these** to **everlasting** <u>life</u>, but the **others** to **disgrace** and **everlasting contempt**. (Daniel 12:2)

Then I saw a **great white throne** and **Him** who **sat upon it**,.. And I saw the **dead**, the **great** and the **small**, *standing* before the **throne**, and **books were opened**; and another **book** was **opened**, which is *the book* of life; and the **dead** were <u>judged</u> from the **things** which were **written** in the **books**, according to their <u>deeds</u>...

And if anyone's **name** was <u>**not**</u> found written in the **book of life**, he was thrown into the <u>**lake of fire**</u>. (Revelation 20:11a, 12, 15)

C. Accountability for Satan and his Angels

When the **thousand years** are completed, <u>Satan</u> will be **released** from **his prison**, and will come out to **deceive** the **nations** which are in the **four corners** of the **earth**,.. and **fire** came down from **heaven** and **devoured them** (the **deceived** of **Satan**).

And the **devil** who **deceived them** was thrown into the <u>lake of fire</u> and <u>brimstone</u>, where the **beast** and the **false prophet** are also; and they will be **tormented** day and night **forever and ever**. (Revelation 20:7-8, 9b,10)

"Then **He** (**Jesus**) will also say to those on His left, '**Depart** from Me, **accursed ones**, into the **eternal fire** which has been **prepared** for the **<u>devil</u>** and <u>**his angels**</u>;..' " (Matthew 25:41)
