A. His *Initial* Greetings (1:1-7)

B. His *Intent* to **Come** and <u>Minister</u> among Them (1:8-17)

⁸ First, I thank my God *through* Jesus the Messiah for you all, because your <u>faith</u> is being proclaimed throughout the whole world.

⁹ For **God**, whom I serve in **my spirit** in the *preaching* of the **gospel** of **His Son**,

is **my witness** as to how **unceasingly** I make mention of you,

10 always in **my prayers** making **request**,
if perhaps now at last by the **will of God** I may succeed in **coming to you**.

¹¹ For I long to see you so that I may impart some spiritual gift to you, that you may be <u>established</u>; ¹² that is, that I may be <u>encouraged</u> together with you while among you, each of us by the other's faith, both yours and mine.

¹³ I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that **often** I have planned to <u>come</u> to you (and have been **prevented** so far)

so that I may obtain some <u>fruit</u> among **you also**, even as among the rest of the **Gentiles**.

¹⁴ I am under <u>obligation</u> both to <u>Greeks</u> and to <u>barbarians</u>, both to the <u>wise</u> and to the <u>foolish</u>.
 ¹⁵ So, for my part, I am *eager* to <u>preach the gospel</u> to <u>you also</u> who are in <u>Rome</u>.

for it is the <u>power</u> of God for <u>salvation</u> to everyone who <u>believe</u>s, to the <u>Jew first</u> and also to the <u>Greek</u>.

¹⁷ For **in it** *the* <u>righteousness</u> **of God** is **revealed** from *faith* **to** *faith*; as it is written, "BUT THE **RIGHTEOUS** *man* SHALL **LIVE BY FAITH**."

Personal Application Reflecting on Paul's Ministry Example

- 1. *Paul* had a <u>thankful heart</u> for the <u>testimony</u> of <u>faith</u> heard "throughout the <u>world</u>" concerning the <u>Roman believers</u> (1:8).
- 2. *Paul* had an active prayer life (1:9-10a).

For **God**,..is **my witness** as to how **unceasingly** I make mention of **you**, **always** in my **prayers**...(1:9-10a)

3. *Paul* desired that his **decisions** be **according** to the <u>will of God</u> (1:10)

"..always in **my prayers** making **request**, if perhaps now at last by the **will of God** I may succeed in **coming to you** (1:10).

- 4. *Paul* had a **strong desire** to **visit** the **Roman believers**, so that he might "impart some **spiritual gift**" that would <u>establish</u> them in their <u>faith</u> (1:11).
- 5. *Paul* acknowledged the **importance** of **spiritual fellowship** for the purposes of **growth**, and **mutual encouragement** (1:12).

For I long to see you so that I may impart some spiritual gift to you, that you may be established; that is, that I may be encouraged together with you while among you, each of us by the other's faith, both yours and mine. (1:11-12)

6. **Paul** had a **zeal** for **evangelism**, and desired to "obtain some **fruit**" among the **people** where he ministered. He felt an "**obligation**" to **preach** the **gospel** to **all people groups** (1:13-14).

...I was made a minister, according to the gift of God's grace which was given to me according to the working of His power.

To me, the very <u>least</u> of all saints, this <u>grace</u> was given, to <u>preach</u> to the **Gentiles** the <u>unfathomable *riches* of Messiah, (Ephesians 3:7-8)</u>

- 7. *Paul* was "eager" to preach, and was <u>not ashamed</u> of the gospel <u>message</u> why?
 - a. It's a *message* that reveals the **power of God** for <u>salvation</u> (1:16)
 - b. It's a *message* declares the <u>righteousness of God</u> by faith (1:17)
- 8. *Paul* declared that **salvation** and the **righteousness of God** are **received** by **faith** in the **gospel** (1:17).

For I am **not ashamed** of the **gospel**, for it is the **power of God** for **salvation** to **everyone** who **believes**,...

For in it *the* **righteousness of God** is **revealed** from **<u>faith</u>** to **<u>faith</u>**; as it is written, "BUT THE **RIGHTEOUS** *man* SHALL LIVE **<u>BY FAITH</u>**."

Closing Exhortations Following Paul's Example

A. *Realizing* our **need** also to **be thankful** for the many **faithful testimonies** of **believers** "throughout the **whole world**." (1:8)

- B. *Recognizing* that we too have "spiritual gifts" that God would have us use to help "establish" the faith of other believers. (1:11)
- C. *Reminding* ourselves of our own <u>need</u> for the "personal" *encouragement* and <u>fellowship</u> of other faithful believers. (1:12)
- D. *Resolving* in ourselves to <u>never</u> be ashamed of the <u>gospel message</u>, because it <u>alone</u> contains the *power* of God for <u>salvation</u> and a <u>righteous standing</u> before an <u>awesome</u> and <u>holy God</u>. (1:16-17)
