The Book of Romans

V. **Paul's** *Discourse* on the **Present** and **Future** <u>Status</u> of the **People of** <u>Israel</u> (9:1-11:36)

- A. He *Expresses* his Personal <u>Burden</u> concerning his people Israel (9:1-5)
- B. He *Explains* how that Israel's *Present* Status is according to the <u>Sovereign Purposes</u> of God (9:6-29)

C. He *Expounds* on Israel's Failure to receive <u>Righteousness</u> by <u>Faith</u> in Messiah (10:1-21)

1. *Expressing* His **Burden** over their **Failure** to **receive** <u>God's</u> <u>**Righteousness**</u> (10:1-4)

10 Brethren, my **heart's desire** and my **prayer to God** for **them** is for *their* **salvation**.

² For I testify about them that they have a *zeal* for God, but <u>not</u> in accordance with *knowledge*.

³ For <u>not</u> *knowing* about <u>God's righteousness</u> and seeking to establish their **own**, they **did** <u>not</u> **subject themselves** to the <u>righteousness of God</u>.

⁴ For **Messiah** is the <u>end</u> of **the law** for **righteousness** to **everyone** who **believes**.

2. *Explaining* by contrast, the <u>Righteousness</u> of the <u>Law</u>, and the <u>Righteousness</u> *based* on <u>Faith</u> in <u>Messiah</u> (10:5-13)

⁵ For **Moses** writes that the **man** who **practices** the *righteousness* which is **based on** <u>law</u> shall *live* by **that** *righteousness*.

⁶ But the *righteousness* based on <u>faith</u> speaks as follows: "DO NOT SAY IN YOUR HEART, '*WHO* WILL <u>ASCEND</u> INTO HEAVEN?' (that is, to bring Messiah down),

> ⁷ or '*WHO* WILL <u>DESCEND</u> INTO THE ABYSS?' (that is, to **bring Messiah** *up* from **the dead**)."

⁸ But what does it say?
"THE WORD IS <u>NEAR</u> YOU, IN YOUR MOUTH AND IN YOUR HEART" that is, the word of <u>faith</u> which we are preaching,

⁹ that if you <u>confess</u> with your mouth <u>Jesus as Lord</u>, and <u>believe</u> in your *heart* that God *raised* Him *from* the dead, you will be <u>saved</u>;

¹⁰ for with **the** *heart* a person <u>believes</u>, resulting in <u>righteousness</u>, and with **the** *mouth* he <u>confesses</u>, resulting in <u>salvation</u>.

¹¹ For the **Scripture** says, "*WHOEVER* <u>BELIEVES</u> IN **HIM** WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED."

 ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same *Lord* is <u>Lord of all</u>, abounding in riches for all who *call* on Him;
 ¹³ for "*WHOEVER* WILL <u>CALL</u> ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE <u>SAVED</u>."

3. *Establishing* their Need to <u>Hear</u> and <u>Believe</u> the <u>Gospel</u> <u>Message</u> (10:14-21)

¹⁴ How then will they <u>call</u> on Him in whom they have <u>not</u> believed? How will they <u>believe</u> in Him whom they have <u>not</u> heard? And how will they <u>hear</u> without a preacher?

¹⁵ How will they <u>preach</u> unless they are <u>sent</u>? Just as it is written, "HOW BEAUTIFUL ARE <u>THE FEET</u> OF THOSE WHO BRING GOOD NEWS OF GOOD THINGS!"

¹⁶ However, they did **not all <u>heed</u>** the **good news**; for **Isaiah** says, **"LORD**, <u>WHO</u> HAS <u>BELIEVED</u> OUR REPORT?"

¹⁷ So <u>faith</u> comes from *hearing*, and *hearing* by the <u>word of Messiah</u>.

¹⁸ But I say, surely they have never <u>heard</u>, have they? *Indeed* they have;

"THEIR VOICE HAS GONE OUT INTO ALL THE EARTH, AND THEIR WORDS TO THE ENDS OF THE WORLD."

¹⁹ But I say, surely Israel did <u>not</u> know, did they? First Moses says,

"I WILL MAKE YOU (ISRAEL) JEALOUS BY THAT WHICH IS NOT A NATION, BY A NATION WITHOUT UNDERSTANDING WILL I ANGER YOU."

²⁰ And **Isaiah** is **very bold** and says,

"I WAS FOUND BY THOSE WHO DID NOT SEEK ME, I BECAME MANIFEST TO THOSE WHO DID NOT ASK FOR ME."

²¹ But as for **Israel He says**, "ALL THE DAY LONG I HAVE **STRETCHED OUT MY HANDS** TO A <u>DISOBEDIENT</u> AND <u>OBSTINATE</u> PEOPLE."

Message Summary Why Many among Israel are <u>not Saved</u>

- 1. Israel has a zeal for God, but <u>not</u> according to <u>knowledge</u> (10:1-3)
 - a. *They* did <u>not</u> know about the <u>righteousness</u> that comes <u>from God</u> (10:3a)
 - b. *They* sought to **establish** their *own* **righteousness**, and did <u>not</u> **subject themselves** to the <u>righteousness</u> of God (through <u>faith</u> *in* Messiah) (10:3b)
- 2. *Israel* did <u>not see</u> that Messiah is the <u>end</u> of the <u>law</u> for <u>righteousness</u> (10:4)

Now that **no one** is **justified** by **the Law before God** is *evident;* for, "THE **RIGHTEOUS MAN** SHALL **LIVE** BY **FAITH.**"

But **before** <u>faith</u> came, we were kept in <u>custody</u> under the law, being shut up to the faith which was later to be revealed.

Therefore **the** *Law* has become <u>our tutor</u> to *lead us* to <u>Messiah</u>, so that **we** may be *justified* by <u>faith</u>.

But **now** that <u>faith</u> has come, we are **no longer** under a *tutor*. For you are all *sons* of God through <u>faith</u> *in* <u>Messiah Jesus</u>. (Galatians 3:11, 23-26)

3. *Israel* continues (even to this day) to pursue a <u>righteousness</u> based on the "practice" of the law (10:5), not realizing that by the "<u>works</u> of the Law *no flesh* will be justified in His sight (3:20).

"We are Jews by nature and not sinners from among the Gentiles;...

...even we have <u>believed</u> in Messiah Jesus, so that we may be <u>justified</u> by <u>faith</u> in Messiah and <u>not</u> by the <u>works</u> of the Law; since by the works of the Law *no flesh* will be <u>justified.</u>" (Galatians 2:15-16)

4. Except for a *remnant* of believers (8:27-29), *Israel* has <u>rejected</u> the <u>righteousness</u> of God through <u>faith</u> in Jesus the Messiah.

They have <u>rejected</u> the **message preached** to **them**, that <u>salvation</u> and <u>righteousness</u> are given to **those** who *confess* and *believe* <u>in</u> the <u>Lord Jesus</u>.

> But what does it (the **scripture**) say? "THE **WORD IS NEAR YOU**, IN YOUR *MOUTH* AND IN YOUR *HEART*" that is, the **word of** <u>faith</u> which we are *preaching*,

that if you *confess* with your mouth <u>Jesus as Lord</u>, and *believe* in your heart that God *raised* Him from the dead, you will <u>be saved</u>;

for with the **heart** a person **believes**, resulting in <u>righteousness</u>, and with the **mouth** he **confesses**, resulting in <u>salvation</u>. (Romans 10: 8-10)

5. Although *Israel* has had a history of rebellion and unbelief (10:21),
God has still been saving a "remnant" of Jews in every age.
The *increasing* number of Jewish believers in this generation attests to this.

For this reason, we remain **faithful** to **our** *calling* at **Adat Shalom**, to "<u>share</u> the <u>good news</u> of the Jewish Messiah to the Jewish community," and to "make <u>disciples</u> of all the nations." (Matt. 28:19)

We also have a **personal challenge** that was set forth by **Rabbi Paul** tonight. The "word of <u>faith</u>" is *near*, and ready to be *believed*, and *confessed* for <u>salvation</u> (10:8-10). However \rightarrow

→ "How then will they call on <u>Him</u> in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in <u>Him</u> whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher?

How will they **preach** unless they are <u>sent</u>? Just as it is written, "How BEAUTIFUL ARE <u>THE FEET</u> OF *THOSE* WHO BRING <u>GOOD NEWS</u> OF <u>GOOD THINGS</u>!" (10:14-15)

May *we all* have **"beautiful feet,"** and share *boldly* and *joyfully* the **"good things**" of the <u>gospel</u> throughout this **New Year**
