# The Book of Romans

### VI. Paul *Directs* the Believers concerning their Spiritual <u>Life</u> and <u>Service</u> before God and One Another (12:1-15:13)

- A. He *Exhorts* them to *fully* Commit to Serving God, and Living according to His will (12:1-2)
- B. He *Explains* to them regarding the **Exercise** of the <u>Gifts</u> of Grace that have been given them (12:3-8)

## C. He *Expresses* what should Characterize their <u>Life</u> and <u>Service</u> as Believers (12:9-13:14)

1. *Describing* what should <u>Characterize</u> their Ministry as a body of Believers (12:9-13)

<sup>9</sup> Let <u>love</u> be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is <u>evil</u>; cling to what is <u>good</u>.

<sup>10</sup> Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor;

<sup>11</sup> not lagging behind in diligence, *fervent* in spirit, <u>serving</u> the Lord;

<sup>12</sup> rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer,

<sup>13</sup> contributing to the <u>needs</u> of the saints, practicing <u>hospitality</u>.

2. *Declaring* what their **Response** should be to <u>Adversity</u> (12:14-21)

<sup>14</sup> Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse.

<sup>15</sup> *Rejoice* with those who *rejoice*, and *weep* with those who <u>weep</u>.

<sup>16</sup> Be of the <u>same mind</u> toward one another; do <u>not</u> be *haughty* in mind, but *associate* with the <u>lowly</u>. Do <u>not</u> be wise in your *own* estimation.

<sup>17</sup> Never pay back evil for evil to anyone.

*Respect* what is <u>right</u> in the sight of **all men**.

<sup>18</sup> If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at <u>peace</u> with all men.

<sup>19</sup> *Never* take your **own** <u>revenge</u>, **beloved**, but leave **room** for the **wrath** *of God*, for it is written, "VENGEANCE IS <u>MINE</u>, I WILL REPAY," says the Lord.

<sup>20</sup> "BUT IF YOUR ENEMY IS HUNGRY, FEED HIM, AND IF HE IS THIRSTY, GIVE HIM A DRINK; FOR IN SO DOING YOU WILL HEAP BURNING COALS ON HIS HEAD."

<sup>21</sup> Do not be overcome by <u>evil</u>, but overcome evil with <u>good</u>.

### <u>Message Summary</u> The *Character* of **God's Servants**

#### 1. Characterized by Love

- a. a sincere, unfeigned love (12:9a)
- b. a kindly, affectionate <u>love</u>—as that of a <u>family</u> (12:10a)
- c. a love that prefers or honors others before themselves (12:10b)
- 2. Characterized by Righteousness and Good Works
  - a. *hating* what is <u>evil</u> (12:9b) *clinging* to what is <u>good</u> (12:9c)
  - b. not *slothful*, but <u>diligent</u> (12:11a)
  - c. *fervent* in <u>spirit</u> (12:11b)
  - d. serving the Lord (12:11c)
  - e. *rejoicing* in <u>hope</u> (12:12a)
  - f. *persevering* in times of <u>trouble</u> (12:12b)
  - g. *devoted* to <u>prayer</u> (12:12c)
  - h. *benevolent* to those in <u>need</u> (12:13a)
  - i. *practicing* hospitality (12:13b)
  - j. *blessing*, <u>not</u> *cursing* those who persecute (12:14)

k. *empathetic* to **all** (both the **joyful** and **sorrowful**) (12:15)

1. *treating* all the <u>same</u>, without personal favoritism (12:16)

- → rejecting <u>arrogance</u> (12:16a)
- $\rightarrow$  receiving the "lowly" (12:16b)
- → repudiating personal <u>conceit</u> (12:16c)

### 3. *Characterized* by an Attitude of <u>Grace</u> and <u>Non-Retaliation</u>

- a. *blessing*, <u>not</u> *cursing*, those who **persecute** (12:14)
- b. <u>not *returning* evil</u> for <u>evil</u> (12:17a)
- c. *purposing* to <u>do</u> what is <u>right</u> before all (12:17b)
- d. *pursuing* the **path of** <u>peace</u> with all (12:18)
- e. *forsaking* personal <u>revenge</u>, for "vengeance" will come from <u>God</u> (12:19)
- f. *overcoming* evil by doing that which is good (12:20-21)

### Personal Application Recognizing our *Power* as Believers

A. The *Power* of a <u>Loving</u> and <u>Godly Community</u>

→ *Characterized* by a <u>Genuine</u> "Family" <u>Love</u> (12:9-10)

→ *Characterized* by a *fervent* spirit of <u>Service</u> to God (12:11)

→ *Characterized* by a **Persevering** <u>Hope</u> (12:12:a-b)

→ *Characterized* by a **Devotion** to <u>**Prayer**</u> (12:12c) → *Characterized* by <u>**Benevolence**</u> and <u>**Hospitality**</u> (12:13)

B. The *Power* of true <u>Humility</u> (12:15-16)

Before *destruction* the heart of man is *haughty,* But <u>humility</u> goes before *honor*. (Proverbs 18:12)

C. The *Power* of **doing** what is <u>**Right**</u> before **all** (12:17)

You shall do what is <u>right</u> and <u>good</u> in the **sight** of **the LORD**, that it may be **well** with **you** and that **you** may **go in** and *possess* the **good land** which **the LORD swore** to *give* **your fathers**, (Deuteronomy 6:18)

D. The *Power* of prioritizing <u>Peace</u> (12:18)

"Blessed are the <u>peacemakers</u>, for **they** shall be **called** <u>sons of God</u>." (Matthew 5:9)

E. The *Power* of a <u>Non-Retaliatory</u> spirit (12:14, 17, 19)

Do **not** say, "I will **repay** <u>evil</u>"; **Wait** for **the Lord**, and **He** will <u>save you</u>. (Proverbs 20:22)

He who is <u>slow</u> to anger is *better* than the <u>mighty</u>, And he who <u>rules</u> his *spirit*, than he who <u>captures</u> a city. (Proverbs 16:32)

#### F. The *Power* of <u>Goodness</u> (12:20-21)

"Do <u>not</u> be overcome by <u>evil</u>, but overcome <u>evil</u> with <u>good</u>." (12:21)

"The idea of *overcoming evil with good* never occurred to men until the <u>gospel</u> was preached. It never has been acted on except under the influences of the <u>gospel</u>.

On this *principle* God shows kindness; on this *principle* the Saviour came, and bled, and died; and on this *principle* all (believers) should act in treating their enemies, and in bringing a world to the knowledge of the Lord Jesus.

If (believers) will show <u>benevolence</u>, if they will send forth proofs of <u>love</u> to the ends of the earth, the evils of the world will be <u>overcome</u>.

Nor can the **nations** be **converted** until **(believers)** act on the **great** and **most important** *principle* of their **religion**, on the **largest scale** possible, 'TO **OVERCOME** <u>EVIL</u> WITH <u>GOOD</u>.''' (Barnes Notes, pg. 290)
