### The Book of Romans

- VI. Paul *Directs* the Believers concerning their Spiritual <u>Life</u> and <u>Service</u> before **God** and **One Another** (12:1-15:13)
  - A. He *Exhorts* them to *fully* Commit to Serving God, and Living according to His will (12:1-2)
  - B. **He** *Explains* to them regarding the **Exercise** of the <u>Gifts</u> of Grace that have been **given them** (12:3-8)
- C. He *Expresses* what should **Characterize** their **Life** and **Service** as **Believers** (12:9-13:14)
  - 1. *Describing* what should <u>Characterize</u> their <u>Ministry</u> as a **body of Believers** (12:9-13)
  - 2. **Declaring** what their **Response** should be to **Adversity** (12:14-21)
  - 3. **Determining** what their **Relationship** should be to **Governing Authorities** (13:1-7)
    - a. *Requiring* them to be in <u>Submission</u> to Governing Authorities (13:1-2)
      - 13 Every person is to be in <u>subjection</u> to the <u>governing authorities</u>.

        For there is **no authority** except *from God*,

        and **those** which **exist** are **established** by God.
    - <sup>2</sup>Therefore whoever **resists authority** has **opposed** the **ordinance of God**; and they who have **opposed** will receive **condemnation** upon **themselves**.
    - b. *Recognizing* that **Authorities** are **Established** for the <u>Good</u> of <u>Society</u> (13:3-5)
      - <sup>3</sup> For <u>rulers</u> are <u>not</u> a cause of *fear* for <u>good</u> behavior, but for <u>evil.</u>
        Do you want to have *no fear* of authority?

**Do** what is **good** and you will have **praise** from the same; for it is a **minister** of **God** to you for **good**.

But if you do what is **evil**, be afraid; for it does not **bear the sword** for nothing; for it is a **minister of God**, an **avenger** who brings **wrath** on the one who **practices evil**.

#### c. *Reiterating* the **Reasons** to be **Subject** to **Authorities** (13:5)

<sup>5</sup> Therefore it is **necessary** to be in <u>subjection</u>, not only because of <u>wrath</u>, but also for *conscience' sake*.

d. *Rendering* to **Authorities** that which is **<u>Due</u>** to them (13:6-7)

<sup>6</sup> For because of this you also <u>pay taxes</u>, for *rulers* are **servants of God**, **devoting themselves** to this very thing.

<sup>7</sup> Render to all what is <u>due</u> them: <u>tax</u> to whom tax is due; <u>custom</u> to whom custom; <u>fear</u> to whom fear; honor to whom honor.

#### 4. *Disclosing* their **Obligation** to **Love One Another** (13:8-10)

<sup>8</sup> Owe nothing to anyone except to love one another; for he who loves his neighbor has fulfilled the law.

<sup>9</sup> For this, "YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT **ADULTERY**,
YOU SHALL NOT **MURDER**, YOU SHALL NOT **STEAL**, YOU SHALL NOT **COVET**,"
and if there is any other **commandment**,
it is **summed up** in this saying, "

YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF."

<sup>10</sup> <u>Love</u> does **no wrong** to a neighbor; therefore <u>love</u> is the *fulfillment* of *the* law.

#### 5. **Denoting** their **Need** to **Live** in the **Light** of "**Day**" (13:11-14)

11 Do this, knowing the time, that it is already the hour for you to <u>awaken</u> from sleep; for now <u>salvation</u> is nearer to us than when we <u>believed</u>.

<sup>12</sup> The <u>night</u> is almost gone, and the <u>day</u> is near.
Therefore let us <u>lay aside</u> the deeds of *darkness* and <u>put on</u> the armor of *light*.

Let us behave properly as in the day, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual promiscuity and sensuality, not in strife and jealousy.
 But put on the Lord Jesus the Messiah, and make no provision for the flesh in regard to its lusts.

## Message Summary and Application <u>3 Key Teaching Themes</u>

# Some Challenging Questions → As Believers we are to Submit to Governing Authorities, but... →

- → What if the *governing authorities* are <u>corrupt</u> and <u>dishonest</u>? Do I still need to **submit** to them?
- → What if the *governing authorities* order me to do that which is <u>evil</u>, or to <u>violate</u> what I know to be the <u>will of God</u>? Do I <u>submit</u>?

- → What if the *governing authorities* are using my taxes for <u>corrupt</u> and <u>evil purposes</u>? Do I still have to <u>pay taxes</u>?
- → What if the *governing authorities* are directly and physically <u>persecuting me</u> and my <u>family</u>? Do we have the <u>right</u> to <u>defend ourselves</u>?

Biblical Response  $\rightarrow$  God has ordained that there should be human government (Genesis 9:5), and has established governing authorities (13:1). However, even though they fulfill the role of being His "servants" (13:4), it does not always mean that they are just or righteous in exercising their authority.

Because of this, there are **times** when it becomes **necessary** to **resist** and **disobey governing authorities**, particularly when they **oppress** and **demand** that **believers** violate their **conscience** and **disobey** what they know is a "**higher law**" from **God**. **Messiah's disciples** dealt with this early in their **ministry**:

And when they (the **counsel**) had summoned them, they **commanded them not** to **speak** or **teach** at all in the **name of Jesus**.

But **Peter** and **John** answered and said to them, "Whether it is <u>right</u> in the <u>sight of God</u> to give **heed to you** *rather* than **to God**, *you* be the **judge**;.." (Acts 4:18-19)

But **Peter** and the **apostles** answered and said, "We must **obey God** *rather* than **men**." (Acts 5:29)

Regarding Taxes → They questioned Him, saying, "Teacher, we know that You speak and teach *correctly*,...

Is it lawful for us to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?..."

And **He (Messiah)** said to them, "...

render to **Caesar** the things that are **Caesar's**,
and **to God** the things that are **God's**." (Luke 20:21a, 22, 25)

#### **Regarding Self Defense** →

From that day on, *half* of **my servants** carried on **the work** while *half* of them held the <u>spears</u>, the <u>shields</u>, the <u>bows</u> and the <u>breastplates</u>; and the <u>captains</u> *were* behind the **whole house of Judah**.

Those who were <u>rebuilding</u> the <u>wall</u> and those who <u>carried burdens</u> took *their* load with one hand doing the *work* and the other holding a <u>weapon</u>. As for the *builders*, each *wore* his <u>sword</u> girded at his side *as he built*, while the **trumpeter** *stood* near me. (Nehemiah 4:16-18)
