## The Book of Romans

### VI. Paul *Directs* the Believers concerning their Spiritual <u>Life</u> and <u>Service</u> before God and One Another (12:1-15:13)

- A. He *Exhorts* them to *fully* Commit to <u>Serving</u> God, and <u>Living</u> according to His will (12:1-2)
- B. He *Explains* to them regarding the Exercise of the <u>Gifts</u> of Grace that have been given them (12:3-8)
- C. He *Expresses* what should Characterize their <u>Life</u> and <u>Service</u> as **Believers** (12:9-13:14)

### D. He *Encourages* them to <u>Accept One Another</u>, in spite of *Disputable* Religious Convictions (14:1-15:13)

- 1. Accepting those who have different Dietary Convictions (14:1-4)
- 2. *Acknowledging* those who have differences regarding <u>Days</u> of <u>Observance</u> (14:5-9)
- 3. *Admonishing* those who would show <u>Contempt</u>, and <u>Judge</u> their **Brethren** (14:10-12)

# 4. *Asserting* the **Priority of** <u>Love</u> in the **Practice** of **Religious Convictions** (14:13-23)

a. By *Refraining* from **Dietary Practices** that would <u>Hinder</u> or <u>Harm</u> another **Brother** (14:13-15)

<sup>13</sup> Therefore let us <u>not</u> judge one another anymore, but rather determine this—not to put an obstacle or a stumbling block in a brother's way.

<sup>14</sup> I know and am convinced in the Lord Jesus that *nothing* is unclean in itself; but to him who <u>thinks</u> anything to be *unclean*, to him it is *unclean*. <sup>15</sup> For if because of <u>food</u> your brother is <u>hurt</u>, you are **no longer** *walking* according to <u>love</u>.

Do not destroy with your food him for whom Messiah died.

b. By *Recognizing* the <u>Priority</u> of the Spiritual <u>Welfare</u> of Others (14:16-18)

<sup>16</sup> Therefore **do not let** what is for **you** a <u>good thing</u> be **spoken** of as <u>evil</u>;

<sup>17</sup> for the **kingdom of God** is <u>not</u> eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

<sup>18</sup> For he who in this way serves Messiah is <u>acceptable</u> to God and <u>approved</u> by men.

c. By *Resolving* not to Harm the <u>Work of God</u> for the sake of *Dietary* <u>Freedom</u> (14:19-21)

> <sup>19</sup> So then let us **pursue** the things which make for <u>peace</u> and the <u>building up</u> of one another.

<sup>20</sup> Do not tear down the work of God for the sake of food.

All things indeed are *clean*, but they are <u>evil</u> for the man who eats and gives <u>offense</u>.

<sup>21</sup> It is **good not** to **eat meat** or to **drink wine**, or to do **anything** by which your **brother stumbles**.

d. By *Retaining* One's Faith and Convictions *Personally* before God (14:22-23)

<sup>22</sup> The <u>faith</u> which you have, have as your <u>own</u> conviction before God. Happy is he who does <u>not</u> condemn himself in what he approves.

> <sup>23</sup> But he who <u>doubts</u> is *condemned* if he eats, because *his eating* is not from <u>faith</u>; and whatever is not from <u>faith</u> is *sin*.

### Message Summary and Application

#### Introduction

In our text tonight, **Rabbi Paul** continues his **exhortation** that believers should *not* judge one another in the practice of personal religious

<u>convictions</u> that are *disputable* (14:10-13a). Instead, they are to be determined to *not* "put an obstacle or a stumbling block" in the way of fellow believers (14:13b).

The **rabbi** then declared that with regard to **one's** <u>diet</u>, **he believed** personally that <u>**no food**</u> was **"unclean in itself**." However, to the **one** who **thinks** anything to be **unclean**, **"to him** it <u>is</u> **unclean** (14:14)."

For this reason, **Paul exhorts** those who are "**stronger**" in their **faith**, to **refrain** from their "**freedom**," and from **dietary practices** that would <u>hinder</u> and <u>harm</u> another **brother** who **believed** *otherwise*.

**Paul** declared that "<u>walking in love</u>" towards others takes priority over one's personal faith and "freedom" regarding *disputable* dietary practices (14:13-23)

### Personal Application

- As *believers*, we should be determined in our practice of faith, to <u>not</u> put an obstacle or "stumbling block" in the way of another that would <u>hinder</u> or <u>harm</u> their spiritual walk. (14:13, 15, 21)
- As *believers*, we should prioritize "<u>love</u>" and <u>concern</u> for the well-being of *others* over our <u>own</u> personal desires, and even some of our <u>own</u> personal convictions. (14:15, 13:8)

Do nothing from *selfishness* or *empty conceit*, but with humility of mind regard one another as <u>more important</u> than <u>yourselves</u>; do not *merely* look out for your *own* personal interests, but also for the interests of <u>others</u>. (Philippians 2:3-4)

- 3. As *believers*, we are to **recognize** that in the **sphere** of **God's kingdom**, what takes **precedence** is <u>not</u> "eating and drinking," but "*righteousness* and *peace* and *joy*" in the <u>Spirit</u> (14:17).
- 4. As *believers*, when our **focus** is on <u>loving others</u> (14:15), and the **spiritual** *priorities* of the <u>kingdom</u> (14:17), this is "acceptable to God and approved by men (14:18)."
- 5. As *believers*, we are to **pursue** the things that make for <u>peace</u>, and the "<u>building up</u>" of **one another** (14:19). We are <u>not</u> to "**tear down**" the **work of God** by **offending** and causing others to **stumble**, particularly with regard to **dietary practices** (14:20-21).

- 6. As *believers*, many of us *rejoice* in **our** <u>faith</u>, and the <u>freedom</u> we have **in Messiah** concerning **dietary practices**, and other **debatable religious practices**. However, rather than <u>openly</u> offend others, we are exhorted to have our **faith** and **convictions "before God"** *personally*, and **not** *publicly* (14:22).
- 7. Those of **us** who have **convictions** about not **eating certain foods**, as well **convictions** about the **observance** of **certain days**, should also feel **free** to **embrace** their "**faith**." It is important to know that if **one** has "**doubts**" about the **eating** and **drinking** of things, and yet <u>does them</u>, this is <u>not</u> from (his) <u>faith</u>, and is <u>sin</u> (14:23).
