- A. He *Expresses* Personal <u>Comments</u> concerning His Calling and Ministry (15:14-33)
  - 1. *Recognizing* the <u>Character</u> of the Roman Believers (15:14)

<sup>14</sup> And concerning you, my brethren, I myself also am convinced that you yourselves are full of <u>goodness</u>, filled with all <u>knowledge</u> and able also to <u>admonish</u> one another.

2. *Reminding* them of His Ministry Calling (15:15-16)

<sup>15</sup> But I have written very boldly to you on some points so as to remind you again, because of the grace that was given me from God,

 <sup>16</sup> to be a minister of Messiah Jesus to the Gentiles, ministering as a <u>priest</u> the gospel of God,
 so that my offering of the Gentiles may become acceptable, sanctified by the Holy Spirit. 3. *Recounting* the **Power** and **Scope** of his **Ministry** (15:17-21)

<sup>17</sup> Therefore <u>in</u> **Messiah Jesus** I have found reason for <u>boasting</u> in things pertaining to **God.** 

<sup>18</sup> For I will not presume to speak of anything except what <u>Messiah</u> has accomplished <u>through me</u>, resulting in the obedience of the Gentiles by *word* and *deed*,

<sup>19</sup> in the *power* of <u>signs</u> and <u>wonders</u>, in the *power* of the <u>Spirit</u>; so that from Jerusalem and round about as far as Illyricum I have fully <u>preached</u> the gospel of Messiah.

 <sup>20</sup> And thus I aspired to preach the gospel, <u>not</u> where Messiah was *already* named, so that I would <u>not</u> build on another man's foundation;
 <sup>21</sup> but as it is written,

"THEY WHO HAD <u>NO NEWS</u> OF **HIM** SHALL SEE, AND THEY WHO HAVE <u>NOT HEARD</u> SHALL UNDERSTAND."

4. *Repeating* his intent to <u>Visit</u> them (15:22-29)

<sup>22</sup> For this reason I have often been prevented from coming to you;

<sup>23</sup> but now, with no further place for me in these regions, and since I have had for many years a longing to come to you
 <sup>24</sup> whenever I go to Spain—for I hope to see you in passing,

and to be **helped** on **my way** there by **you**, when I have first enjoyed **your company** for a while—

<sup>25</sup> but now, I am going to Jerusalem serving the saints.

<sup>26</sup> For **Macedonia** and **Achaia** have been pleased to make a <u>contribution</u> for the **poor** among the **saints in Jerusalem**.

<sup>27</sup> Yes, they were **pleased** to do so, and they are **indebted** to them.

For if the **Gentiles** have **shared** in their **spiritual things**, they are **indebted** to **minister** to them also in **material things**.

<sup>28</sup> Therefore, when I have finished this, and have put my seal on this fruit of theirs, I will go on by way of you to Spain.

<sup>29</sup> I know that when I come to you,I will come in the fullness of the *blessing* of Messiah.

5. *Requesting* Prayer for his Journey to Judea (15:30-33)

<sup>30</sup> Now I urge you, brethren, by our Lord Jesus the Messiah and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your <u>prayers</u> to God for me,

<sup>31</sup> that I may be *rescued* from those who are **disobedient in Judea**, and *that* my **service** for **Jerusalem** may prove **acceptable** to the **saints**;

<sup>32</sup> so that I may come to you in joy by the will of God and find refreshing rest in your company.

<sup>33</sup> Now the **God of peace** be with you all. Amen.

## Paul's Closing Comments— A Brief *Description* of **Paul's "Amazing" Ministry**

1. A *Ministry* of characterized by personal <u>Encouragement</u> (15:14)

<sup>14</sup> And concerning you, my brethren, I myself also am convinced that you yourselves are full of <u>goodness</u>, filled with all <u>knowledge</u> and *able* also to <u>admonish</u> one another. (15:14)

## 2. A *Ministry* by the <u>Grace</u> of God (15:15)

<sup>15</sup> But I have written very *boldly* to you on some points so as to **remind you again**, **because** of the <u>grace</u> that was given me from God, (15:15)

- 3. A "Priestly" *Ministry* specifically to the <u>Gentiles</u> (15:16)
  - a. *Ministering* "as a <u>priest</u> the gospel of God" to the Gentiles (15:16a)
  - b. *Ministering* as a <u>priest</u> with the goal of **sanctifying**, and making "acceptable" the "<u>offering</u>" of the Gentiles (to God) (15:16b)
- 4. A *Ministry* that he "found **reason** for **boasting**," but *only* in what **Messiah** had **accomplished** *through* **him** (15:17-18)
  - a. A *Ministry* that **resulted** in the <u>Obedience</u> of the <u>Gentiles</u> by *word* and *deed* (15:17-18)
  - b. A *Ministry* characterized by <u>Power</u> (15:19)
    1) the *power* of signs and wonders (15:19a)
    2) the *power* of the Spirit (15:19b)
  - c. A *Ministry* that had 'fully <u>preached</u> the gospel" from Jerusalem to Illyricum (15:19c)

5. A *Ministry* focused on <u>Missions</u> to unreached people (15:20-21)

<sup>20</sup> And thus I aspired to preach the gospel, <u>not</u> where Messiah was *already* named, so that I would not build on another man's foundation; (15:20)

6. A *Ministry* that prioritized <u>Benevolence</u> to the **poor** and **needy** among them (15:25-27)

<sup>25</sup> but now, I am going to Jerusalem serving the saints.

<sup>26</sup> For **Macedonia** and **Achaia** have been pleased to make a <u>contribution</u> for the *poor* among the saints in Jerusalem.

7. A *Ministry* that embraced the **importance** and **need** for <u>prayer</u> (15:30-32)

 <sup>30</sup> Now I urge you, brethren, by our Lord Jesus the Messiah and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your <u>prayers</u> to God for me,

8. A *Ministry* that valued and understood the need for spiritual <u>Fellowship</u> (15:22-24, 32)

<sup>32</sup> so that I may come to you in joy by the will of God and find refreshing rest in your company.
