The Book of Romans

VII. Paul *Dictates* Closing **Personal** <u>Comments</u> and <u>Greetings</u> to the **Roman Believers** (15:13-16:27)

A. He *Expresses* Personal <u>Comments</u> concerning His Calling and Ministry (15:14-33)

B. He *Extends* Personal <u>Greetings</u> to some Specific Believers there (16:1-16)

1. *Commending* sister Phoebe for her <u>Service</u> (16:1-2)

16 I <u>commend</u> to you our sister <u>Phoebe</u>, who is a servant of the church which is at Cenchrea;

² that you **receive her** *in* **the Lord** in a manner **worthy** of the **saints**, and that you **help her** in whatever matter she may have **need** of you; for she herself has also been a **helper of many**, and of *myself* as well.

2. *Conveying* <u>Greetings</u> to Prisca and Aquila, and their house Church (16:3-5a)

 ³ Greet <u>Prisca</u> and <u>Aquila</u>, my fellow workers *in* Messiah Jesus,
 ⁴ who for my life *risked* their own necks, to whom not only do I give *thanks*, but also *all* the churches of the Gentiles;

⁵ also greet the **church** that is in **their house**

3. *Communicating* <u>Greetings</u> to Epaenetus, Mary, Andronicus, and Junias (16:5b-7)

Greet Epaenetus, *my beloved*, who is the <u>first convert</u> to Messiah from Asia.

⁶ Greet Mary, who has <u>worked hard</u> for you.

⁷ Greet Andronicus and Junias, my kinsmen and my fellow prisoners, who are <u>outstanding</u> among the **apostles**, who also were *in* Messiah before me. 4. *Continuing* <u>Greetings</u> to other beloved Servants, Saints, and Households (16:8-16)

⁸ Greet Ampliatus, my beloved in the Lord.

⁹ Greet **Urbanus**, our **fellow worker** *in* **Messiah**, and **Stachys** *my beloved*.

¹⁰ Greet **Apelles**, the <u>approved</u> in Messiah. Greet **those** who are of the *household* of **Aristobulus**.

¹¹ Greet Herodion, my kinsman.

Greet those of the *household* of **Narcissus**, who are **in the Lord**.

¹² Greet Tryphaena and Tryphosa, workers in the Lord.

Greet Persis the *beloved*, who has worked hard in the Lord.

¹³ Greet Rufus, a <u>choice man</u> in the Lord, also his mother and mine.

¹⁴ Greet Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas and the brethren with them.

¹⁵ Greet **Philologus** and **Julia**, **Nereus** and **his sister**, and **Olympas**, and **all the saints** who are with them.

¹⁶ <u>Greet one another</u> with a holy kiss. All the churches of Messiah greet you.

Observations for Application Paul's *Greetings* to fellow Believers, reveal a "People Oriented" <u>Leadership Style</u>

Key Observations →

- A. Although Rabbi Paul had a ministry calling by God to oversee the *entire* body of Gentile believers (15:15-16), he still took time to <u>recognize</u> the important personal contributions of <u>individual</u> believers.
- B. Please note that **Paul** had <u>high regard</u> and **appreciation** for the *vital* contributions of <u>women</u> among the congregations. In our text tonight at least **eight women** are mentioned, many of whom had **important** *impact* in his **own personal ministry**.

16 I commend to you our sister Phoebe,

who is a *servant* of the *church* which is at *Cenchrea*; ² that you *receive her* in the *Lord* in a manner *worthy* of the *saints*, and that you *help her* in whatever matter she may have *need* of you; for *she herself* has also been a *helper* of many, and of *myself* as well (16:1-2).

Greet <u>Prisca</u>...(16:3a) Greet <u>Mary</u>, who has **worked hard** for you (16:6). Greet <u>Tryphaena</u> and <u>Tryphosa</u>, **workers** in the Lord (16:12). Greet **Rufus**,...also <u>his mother</u> and <u>mine</u> (16:13).

C. Paul expressed <u>thankfulness</u> to those who *risked* their <u>lives</u> and <u>suffered</u> personally on *his* behalf, as well as for the sake of the ministry.

³ Greet Prisca and Aquila,..
⁴ who for *my* life <u>risked</u> their *own necks*, to whom not only do I give <u>thanks</u>, but also *all* the churches of the Gentiles; (16:3-4)

⁷Greet Andronicus and Junias, my kinsmen and my fellow <u>prisoners</u>, (16:7a)

- D. Paul acknowledged, and expressed <u>appreciation</u> several times in this text, to **specific believers** who "worked hard" as **fellow** *servants* in the **ministry** of the **Messiah** (see 16:2, 6, 9, 12).
- E. Paul expressed *openly*, in these greetings, his personal <u>love</u> for his fellow brothers and sisters who have served faithfully with him in the Lord.

Greet Epaenetus, <u>my beloved</u>, who is the *first* convert to Messiah from Asia (16:5).

Greet **Ampliatus**, <u>my beloved</u> in the Lord... and **Stachys** <u>my beloved</u> (16:8, 9a).

Greet Persis the beloved,...(16:12:b)

- F. Paul acknowledged those who were his "kinsmen," and were most likely fellow Jewish believers in the Lord (16:7a, 11a). He also greeted and <u>honored</u> those who had proven themselves as "outstanding" and "choice" among the believers (16:7b, 13a).
- G. Rabbi Paul, understanding the importance of "spiritual family," and the *vital* contributions of *each* believer who is serving, exhorts the Roman believers to greet one another with a warm and *holy* embrace (16:16).

Closing Thought

If God saw fit to record in *inspired* scripture, Paul's personal and specific <u>comments</u> of *appreciation*, *gratitude*, and *love* for the <u>life</u> and <u>deeds</u> of his fellow saints and servants *in* the Lord (16:1-16);

do you not think that, as **servants of Messiah**, *our* **individual** "**works** of *faith*, **labors** of *love*, and **steadfastness** of *hope*, as well as our **specific** *sufferings* and *trials* (I Thess. 1:2-3, 6), are also "**written**" **down**, and will **one day** be **acknowledged** in **heavenly realms** ?

You (O God) have taken *account* of my wanderings; Put my tears in Your bottle. Are *they* not in Your <u>book</u>? (Psalm 56:8)

"A river of fire was flowing and coming out from before **Him**; thousands upon thousands were attending **Him**, and **myriads** upon **myriads** were standing before **Him**; the **court sat**, and the **books** were **opened**..." (Daniel 7:10)

Then **those** who *feared* **the LORD** spoke to one another, and **the LORD** gave **attention** and **heard** *it*, and a <u>book of remembrance</u> was written before Him for **those** who *fear* **the LORD** and who *esteem* His name. (Malachi 3:16)

> And **He (Messiah)** said to **them**... "Nevertheless do **not** *rejoice* in this, that the **spirits** are **subject** to you, but *rejoice* that **your names** are <u>recorded</u> *in* heaven." (Luke 10:18a, 20)

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Messiah, so that *each one* may be **recompensed** for <u>his deeds</u> in the body, according to what **he** has **done**, whether **good or bad**. (II Corinthians 5:10)
