II. Paul Declares Man's Need for God's Salvation and Righteousness (1:18-3:20)

- A. He *Declares* that the <u>Wrath</u> of God is <u>Revealed</u> Against all *Ungodliness* and *Unrighteousness* of Men (1:18-32)
- B. He *Denounces* those who are *Passing* <u>Judgment</u> on others, yet are *Practicing* Unrighteousness themselves (2:1-29)
- C. He *Decries* the *Unrighteousness* of the <u>Jews</u> (2:17-3:8)
 - 1. Who *Boast* in the Law and Knowledge of God (2:17-20)

17 But if you bear the name "Jew" and rely upon the Law and boast in God,
 18 and know His will and approve the things that are essential, being instructed out of the Law,

and are confident that you yourself are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness,
 a corrector of the foolish, a teacher of the immature, having in the Law the embodiment of knowledge and of the truth,

2. Who "Break" the very Laws that they Teach (2:21-29)

You, therefore, who teach another, do you not teach yourself?
You who preach that one shall not steal, do you steal?
²² You who say that one should not commit adultery,
do you commit adultery?
You who abhor idols, do you rob temples?

²³ You who boast in the Law, through your <u>breaking</u> the Law, do you dishonor God?

²⁴ For "THE **NAME OF GOD** IS **BLASPHEMED** AMONG THE **GENTILES**BECAUSE OF **YOU**," just as it is written.

- ²⁵ For indeed **circumcision** is of **value** if you **practice the Law**; but if you are a **transgressor** of the **Law**, your **circumcision** has **become uncircumcision**.
- ²⁶ So if the uncircumcised man <u>keeps</u> the requirements of the Law, will not his uncircumcision be regarded as circumcision?
- ²⁷ And he who is **physically uncircumcised**, if he **keeps the Law**, will he not **judge you** who though having the **letter of the Law** and **circumcision** are a **transgressor** of the Law?

²⁸ For he is **not a Jew** who is one *outwardly*, nor is **circumcision** that which is *outward* in the **flesh**.

²⁹ But he is **a Jew** who is one *inwardly;* and **circumcision** is that which is of the <u>heart</u>, by the <u>Spirit</u>, not by the <u>letter</u>; and his **praise** is <u>not</u> from **men**, but **from God.**

Personal Application Spiritual Circumcision— The Circumcision of the Heart

A. A Priority in both Testaments

"Know, then, *it is* <u>not</u> because of **your righteousness** that the **LORD your God** is giving you this **good land** to **possess**, for you are a **stubborn people**...

<u>Circumcise</u> then <u>your heart</u>, and stiffen your neck **no more**." (Deuteronomy 9:6, 10: 16)

"Circumcise yourselves to the LORD and remove the foreskins of your heart, men of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, or else My wrath will go forth like fire..."

"Behold, the days are coming," declares **the LORD**, "that I will **punish** all who are **circumcised** yet **uncircumcised**--..." (Jeremiah 4:4, 9:25)

For he is not a **Jew** who is one **outwardly**, nor is **circumcision** that which is **outward** in the **flesh**.

But he is a **Jew** who is one *inwardly*; and <u>circumcision</u> is that which is of the <u>heart</u>, by the <u>Spirit</u>, not by the <u>letter</u>, and his <u>praise</u> is <u>not</u> from <u>men</u>, but <u>from God</u>. (Romans 2:28-29)

B. A *Procedure* performed on those who are "in Messiah"

...and in Him (Messiah) you were also <u>circumcised</u> with a <u>circumcision</u> made *without hands*, in the removal of the body of the flesh by the <u>circumcision of Messiah</u>;

having been <u>buried</u> with Him in *baptism*, in which you were also <u>raised up</u> with Him through faith in the *working* of God, who raised Him from the dead.

When you were <u>dead</u> in your transgressions and the *uncircumcision* of your flesh,

He made you <u>alive</u> together with Him,
having forgiven us all our transgressions...(Colossians 2:11, 13)

C. A *Process* that "cuts away" the deeds of the flesh

Therefore consider the **members** of your **earthly body as** <u>dead</u> to **immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire,** and **greed,** which amounts to **idolatry**...

Do not **lie to one another**, since you <u>laid aside</u> the *old self* with its **evil practices**, and have <u>put on</u> the *new self* which is being *renewed* to a **true knowledge** according to **the image** of the **One** who **created him**-- (Colossians 3:5, 9-10)

D. A *Practice* that is **secondary** to a <u>righteous life</u>

"Circumcision is nothing, and uncircumcision is nothing, but what matters is the <u>keeping</u> of the <u>commandments</u> of God."

(I Corinthians 7:19)

"For **in Messiah Jesus** neither **circumcision** nor **uncircumcision** means anything, but **faith working through love**." (Galatians 5:6)

"For neither is **circumcision** anything, nor **uncircumcision**, but a **new creation**." (Galatians 6:15)
