## II. Paul Declares Man's Need for God's Salvation and Righteousness (1:18-3:20)

- A. He *Discloses* that God's <u>Wrath</u> is revealed against all *Ungodliness* and *Unrighteousness* of Men (1:18-32)
- B. He *Denounces* those who <u>Judge</u> the *Unrighteousness* of others, yet <u>Practice it</u> themselves (2:1-29)
- C. He *Decries* the *Unrighteousness* of the <u>Jews</u> (2:17-3:20)
  - 1. Who *Boast* in the <u>Law</u> and <u>Knowledge of God</u> (2:17-20)
  - 2. Who "Break" the very Laws that they Teach (2:21-29)

## 3. Who *Bear* Accountability before a Righteous God (3:1-20)

a. A God who Entrusted them with His Word (3:1-2)

**3** Then what **advantage** has the **Jew**? Or what is the **benefit** of **circumcision**? <sup>2</sup> *Great* in every respect. First of all, that they were **entrusted** with the **oracles of God**.

b. A God who is <u>Faithful</u> and True to His Promised <u>Word</u> (3:3-4)

<sup>3</sup> What then? If some did not believe, their unbelief will not nullify the faithfulness of God, will it?

<sup>4</sup> May it **never be**! Rather, let **God** be found **true**, though **every man** be found a **liar**, as it is **written**,

"THAT **YOU** MAY BE **JUSTIFIED** IN **YOUR WORDS**, AND **PREVA**IL WHEN **YOU** ARE **JUDGED.**" c. A God who will <u>Judge</u> them for their Unrighteousness (3:5-8)

<sup>5</sup> But if our <u>unrighteousness</u> <u>demonstrates</u> the <u>righteousness</u> of God, what shall we say? The God who *inflicts wrath* is not unrighteous, is He? (I am speaking in *human terms*.)

<sup>6</sup> May it **never be!** For otherwise, **how** will **God** *judge* the **world**?

<sup>7</sup> But if through my <u>lie</u> the <u>truth</u> of God abounded to <u>His glory</u>, why am I also still being judged as a sinner?

<sup>8</sup> And why not *say* (as **we** are **slanderously reported** and as **some claim** that **we say**), "Let us **do evil** that **good may come**"? Their **condemnation** is **just.** 

d. **A** *God* who has **charged** *all* **Men** (*Jews* and *Gentiles*) to be **hopelessly** "under sin" (3:9-20)

<sup>9</sup> What then? Are we *better* than they? Not at all; for we have already charged that both Jews and Greeks are all under sin; <sup>10</sup> as it is written,

"THERE IS **NONE RIGHTEOUS**, NOT EVEN **ONE**;

11 THERE IS **NONE** WHO **UNDERSTANDS**,

THERE IS **NONE** WHO **SEEKS FOR GOD**;

12 **ALL** HAVE **TURNED ASIDE**, TOGETHER THEY HAVE BECOME **USELESS**; THERE IS **NONE** WHO **DOES GOOD**, THERE IS **NOT EVEN ONE**."

13 "THEIR THROAT IS AN OPEN GRAVE,
WITH THEIR TONGUES THEY KEEP DECEIVING,"
"THE POISON OF ASPS IS UNDER THEIR LIPS";
14 "WHOSE MOUTH IS FULL OF CURSING AND BITTERNESS";

15 "THEIR **FEET** ARE SWIFT TO **SHED BLOOD**,

16 **DESTRUCTION** AND **MISERY** ARE IN THEIR **PATHS**,

17 AND THE **PATH** OF **PEACE** THEY HAVE **NOT KNOWN**."

18 "THERE IS **NO FEAR** OF **GOD** BEFORE THEIR **EYES**."

<sup>19</sup> Now **we know** that whatever the **Law** says, it speaks to **those** who are **under the Law**, so that **every mouth** may be **closed** and **all** the **world** may become **accountable to God**:

<sup>20</sup> because by the works of the Law no flesh will be <u>justified</u> in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin.

## Personal Application

# Man's condition seems *Hopeless*, but for the **Grace** of God

### A. Our Source of Grace

For the **LORD God** is a **sun** and **shield**;
The **LORD** gives **grace** and **glory**; **No good thing** does **He withhold** from those who **walk** *uprightly*.
(Psalm 84:11)

And the <u>Word</u> became flesh, and *dwelt* among us, and we saw **His glory**, glory as of the only begotten from the **Father**, full of <u>grace</u> and truth...

For of **His fullness we** have **all received**, and **grace** upon **grace**. For the **Law** was given through **Moses**; **grace** and **truth** were **realized** through **Jesus** the **Messiah**. (John 1:14, 16-17)

But I (Paul) do not consider my life of any account as dear to myself, so that I may *finish* my course and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify solemnly of the gospel of the grace of God. (Acts 20:24)

### B. Our Salvation by the Grace of God

And <u>you</u> were *dead* in your trespasses and sins, in which you *formerly walked* according to the **course** of this **world**, according to the **prince** of the **power** of the **air**, of the *spirit* that is **now working** in the **sons** of *disobedience*.

Among them we too all *formerly lived* in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of *wrath*, even as the rest.

But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Messiah (by grace you have been saved),..

For by **grace** you have been; **saved through faith** and that **not** of **yourselves**, *it is* the **gift of God**; (Ephesians 2:1-5, 8)

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For the <u>grace</u> of God has *appeared*, bringing <u>salvation</u> to <u>all men</u>, instructing us to deny <u>ungodliness</u> and <u>worldly desires</u> and to <u>live sensibly</u>, <u>righteously</u> and <u>godly</u> in the <u>present age</u>,.. (Titus 2:11-12)

But the **free gift** is **not** like the **transgression**.

For if by the **transgression** of the **one** (Adam) the **many** died,

much more did the **grace** of God and the **gift** by the **grace** of the **one** Man,

Jesus the Messiah, abound to the many...

For if by the *transgression* of the **one** (Adam), *death* reigned through the **one**, much more those who receive the abundance of <u>grace</u> and of the *gift* of <u>righteousness</u> will *reign* in **life** through the *One*,

Jesus the Messiah. (Romans 5:15, 17)

#### C. Our *Security* by the <u>Grace</u> of God

For we do not have a **high priest** who cannot **sympathize** with our **weaknesses**, but **One** who has been **tempted** in **all things** as **we are**, yet without sin.

Therefore let us **draw near** with **confidence** to the **throne of grace**, so that we may receive **mercy** and find **grace** to **help** in **time of need**. (Hebrews 4:15-16)

Therefore, **prepare your minds** for action, **keep sober** *in spirit*, **fix your <u>hope</u>** completely on the <u>grace</u> to be brought to **you** at the **revelation** of **Jesus the Messiah**. (I Peter 1:13)

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Now may our Lord Jesus the Messiah Himself and God our Father, who has *loved us* and given us eternal *comfort* and good *hope* by <u>grace</u>, comfort and strengthen your hearts in every good work and word.
