## The Book of Romans

I. Paul's Introduction to his Letter (1:1-17)
II. Paul Declares Man's $\underline{\text { Need for God's Salvation }}$ and Righteousness (1:18-3:20)
III. Paul Delivers his Gospel Message of

Righteousness by Faith in Messiah (3:21-5:21)
IV. Paul Describes, and gives Instructions concerning the Life and Walk of Believers
in Messiah (6:1-8:39)
A. He Instructs them to live as those who have both Died and been Raised in Messiah (6:1-14).

## B. He Implores them to live as Servants of Righteousness (6:15-23)

1. Exhorting them to no longer sin, though not "under law" (6:15)
2. Explaining that they become servants to whom which they render obedience (6:16)
3. Expressing thankfulness for their obedience to righteousness (6:17-18)
${ }^{15}$ What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? May it never be!
${ }^{16}$ Do you not know that when you present yourselves to someone as slaves for obedience, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness?
${ }^{17}$ But thanks be to God that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to which you were committed,
${ }^{18}$ and having been freed from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.
4. Entreating them to live according to righteousness (6:19-23)
${ }^{19} \mathrm{I}$ am speaking in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh.

For just as you presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness, resulting in further lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness, resulting in sanctification.
${ }^{20}$ For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness.
${ }^{21}$ Therefore what benefit were you then deriving from the things of which you are now ashamed?

For the outcome of those things is death.
${ }^{22}$ But now having been freed from sin and enslaved to God, you derive your benefit, resulting in sanctification, and the outcome, eternal life.
${ }^{23}$ For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Messiah Jesus our Lord.

## Message Summary

Believers have a choice, to become Servants of Sin or Servants of Righteousness

1. Serving $\sin$ results in death ( $6: 16 \mathrm{~b}, 21 \mathrm{~b}, 23 \mathrm{a}$ )
2. Serving sin manifests itself in impurity and lawlessness (6:19a)
3. Serving sin brings shame ( $6: 21$ )
4. Servants of sin are "free" from righteousness (6:20)
5. Obedience (to God) results in righteousness (6:16c)
6. Servants of righteousness are "freed from sin" (6:18)
7. Serving righteousness results in sanctification (6:19b, 22a)
8. Serving righteousness results in eternal life (6:22b, 23b)

Personal Application
Being servants of sin may be temporarily pleasurable and "exciting," but you "earn" terrible "wages" $\rightarrow$ death and corruption

## For the wages of sin is death,.. (6:23a)

Do not be deceived, God is not mocked;
for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap.
For the one who sows to his own flesh
will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. (Galatians 6:7-8)

There is a way which seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death. (Proverbs 14:12)

There is no soundness in my flesh because of Your indignation; There is no health in my bones because of my sin. (Psalm 38:3)

Be gracious to me, O Lord, for I am in distress; My eye is wasted away from grief, my soul and my body also.

For my life is spent with sorrow
And my years with sighing;
My strength has failed because of my iniquity, And my body has wasted away. (Psalm 31:9-10)

Bread obtained by falsehood is sweet to a man, But afterward his mouth will be filled with gravel.
(Proverbs 20:17)
The wicked earns deceptive wages,
But he who sows righteousness gets a true reward.
He who is steadfast in righteousness will attain to life, And he who pursues evil will bring about his own death.
(Proverbs 11:18-19)
His own iniquities will capture the wicked,
And he will be held with the cords of his sin. (Proverbs 5:22)
Who has woe? Who has sorrow?
Who has contentions? Who has complaining?
Who has wounds without cause?
Who has redness of eyes?
Those who linger long over wine,
Those who go to taste mixed wine.

Do not look on the wine when it is red,
When it sparkles in the cup,
When it goes down smoothly;
At the last it bites like a serpent
And stings like a viper. (Proverbs 23:29-32)

Alas, sinful nation,
People weighed down with iniquity, Offspring of evildoers,

Sons who act corruptly!
They have abandoned the LORD, They have despised the Holy One of Israel, They have turned away from Him.

Where will you be stricken again, As you continue in your rebellion?

The whole head is sick
And the whole heart is faint.
From the sole of the foot even to the head
There is nothing sound in it,
Only bruises, welts and raw wounds,
Not pressed out or bandaged,
Nor softened with oil.
Your land is desolate,
Your cities are burned with fire,
Your fields-strangers are devouring them in your presence; It is desolation, as overthrown by strangers.

The daughter of Zion is left like a shelter in a vineyard, Like a watchman's hut in a cucumber field, like a besieged city.

Unless the LORD of hosts
Had left us a few survivors,
We would be like Sodom,
We would be like Gomorrah. (Isaiah 1:4-9)
