The Book of Romans

- I. **Paul's Introduction** to his **Letter** (1:1-17)
- II. Paul *Declares* Man's <u>Need</u> for God's <u>Salvation</u> and <u>Righteousness</u> (1:18-3:20)
- III. Paul *Delivers* his Gospel Message of Righteousness by Faith in Messiah (3:21-5:21)
- IV. **Paul** *Describes*, and gives **Instructions** concerning the **Life** and **Walk of Believers** *in* **Messiah** (6:1-8:39)
 - A. **He** *Instructs* them to <u>live</u> as those who have both <u>Died</u> and been <u>Raised</u> in <u>Messiah</u> (6:1-14).
- B. He *Implores* them to <u>live</u> as **Servants of** Righteousness (6:15-23)
- 1. *Exhorting* them to **no longer** <u>sin</u>, though not "under <u>law</u>" (6:15)
- 2. *Explaining* that they become <u>servants</u> to whom which they render **obedience** (6:16)
- 3. *Expressing* thankfulness for their <u>obedience</u> to righteousness (6:17-18)
 - ¹⁵ What then? Shall **we sin** because **we** are **not under** <u>law</u> but <u>under grace</u>? May it never be!
 - ¹⁶ Do you not know that when you present yourselves to someone as slaves for obedience, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness?
 - ¹⁷ But thanks be to God that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to which you were committed,

¹⁸ and having been *freed* from <u>sin</u>, you became *slaves* of righteousness. 4. *Entreating* them to live according to righteousness (6:19-23)

¹⁹I am speaking in **human terms** because of the **weakness** of your **flesh**.

For just as you **presented** your **members** as **slaves** to **impurity** and to **lawlessness**, resulting in **further lawlessness**, so now **present** your **members** as **slaves** to **righteousness**, resulting in **sanctification**.

²⁰ For when you were *slaves* of <u>sin</u>, you were *free* in regard to <u>righteousness</u>.

²¹ Therefore what <u>benefit</u> were you then deriving from the things of which you are now **ashamed?**For the **outcome** of those things is <u>death</u>.

²² But now having been *freed* from <u>sin</u> and *enslaved* to <u>God</u>, you derive your <u>benefit</u>, resulting in <u>sanctification</u>, and the <u>outcome</u>, <u>eternal life</u>.

²³ For the *wages* of sin is <u>death</u>, but the free *gift* of God is <u>eternal life</u> in Messiah Jesus our Lord.

Message Summary

Believers have a *choice*, to become **Servants of <u>Sin</u>** or **Servants of <u>Righteousness</u>**

- 1. **Serving** *sin* results in <u>death</u> (6:16b, 21b, 23a)
- 2. Serving sin manifests itself in impurity and lawlessness (6:19a)
- 3. **Serving** *sin* brings <u>shame</u> (6:21)
- 4. **Servants** of *sin* are "free" from <u>righteousness</u> (6:20)
- 1. **Obedience (to God)** results in <u>righteousness</u> (6:16c)
- 2. Servants of righteousness are "freed from sin" (6:18)
- 3. Serving righteousness results in sanctification (6:19b, 22a)
- 4. **Serving** *righteousness* results in <u>eternal life</u> (6:22b, 23b)

Personal Application

Being servants of sin may be *temporarily* pleasurable and "exciting," but you "earn" terrible "wages" \rightarrow death and corruption

For the wages of sin is death,.. (6:23a)

Do not be **deceived**, **God** is **not mocked**; for whatever a man **sows**, this he will also **reap**.

For the one who **sows** to his **own flesh** will from the **flesh reap corruption**, but the one who **sows** to the **Spirit** will from the **Spirit** reap **eternal life**. (Galatians 6:7-8)

There is a way which seems right to a man, But its end is the way of <u>death</u>. (Proverbs 14:12)

There is <u>no</u> soundness in my flesh because of Your indignation; There is no health in my bones because of my sin. (Psalm 38:3)

Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress; My eye is wasted away from grief, my soul and my body also.

For my **life** is spent with **sorrow**And my **years** with **sighing**;
My **strength** has **failed because** of **my iniquity**,
And my **body** has **wasted away**. (Psalm 31:9-10)

Bread obtained by <u>falsehood</u> is **sweet** to a man, But afterward his **mouth** will be filled with <u>gravel</u>. (Proverbs 20:17)

The wicked earns <u>deceptive wages</u>, But he who sows <u>righteousness</u> *gets* a <u>true reward</u>.

He who is **steadfast in <u>righteousness</u>** will attain to <u>life</u>, And he who pursues **evil** will bring about his own <u>death</u>. (Proverbs 11:18-19)

His **own iniquities** will <u>capture</u> the <u>wicked</u>, And he will be **held** with the *cords* of <u>his sin</u>. (Proverbs 5:22)

Who has woe? Who has sorrow?
Who has contentions? Who has complaining?
Who has wounds without cause?
Who has redness of eyes?

Those who linger long over wine,
Those who go to taste mixed wine.

Do not look on the <u>wine</u> when it is red,
When it sparkles in the cup,
When it goes down smoothly;
At the last it <u>bites</u> like a serpent
And <u>stings</u> like a <u>viper</u>. (Proverbs 23:29-32)

Alas, <u>sinful nation</u>,

People weighed down with <u>iniquity</u>,

Offspring of <u>evildoers</u>,

Sons who act <u>corruptly!</u>

They have *abandoned* the LORD,
They have *despised* the Holy One of Israel,
They have *turned away* from Him.

Where will you be stricken again,
As you continue in your rebellion?
The whole head is sick
And the whole heart is faint.

From the **sole** of the **foot** even to the **head**There is **nothing sound** in it,
Only <u>bruises, welts</u> and <u>raw wounds</u>,
Not pressed out or bandaged,
Nor softened with oil.

Your land is <u>desolate</u>,
Your cities are <u>burned with fire</u>,
Your fields—strangers are devouring them in your presence;
It is <u>desolation</u>, as overthrown by strangers.

The daughter of Zion is left like a *shelter* in a vineyard, Like a watchman's *hut* in a cucumber field, like a *besieged* city.

Unless the **Lord of hosts**Had left us a **few survivors**,
We would be like **Sodom**,
We would be like **Gomorrah**. (Isaiah 1:4-9)

If it is **disagreeable** in your sight to <u>serve the LORD</u>, choose for yourselves today <u>whom</u> you will <u>serve</u>: whether the **gods** which your fathers served which were beyond the River, or the **gods** of the **Amorites** in whose land you are living; but as for <u>me</u> and <u>my house</u>, we will <u>serve the LORD</u>." (Joshua 24:15)
