The Book of Romans

- I. **Paul's Introduction** to his **Letter** (1:1-17)
- II. Paul *Declares* Man's <u>Need</u> for God's <u>Salvation</u> and <u>Righteousness</u> (1:18-3:20)
- III. **Paul** *Delivers* his **Gospel Message** of <u>Righteousness</u> by <u>Faith</u> *in* **Messiah** (3:21-5:21)

IV. **Paul** *Describes*, and gives **Instructions** concerning the **Life** and **Walk of Believers** *in* **Messiah** (6:1-8:39)

What shall we say then?
Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?
May it never be!
How shall we who died to sin still live in it? (6:1-2)

A. He *Instructs* them to <u>live</u> as those who have both <u>Died</u> and been <u>Raised</u> in <u>Messiah</u> (6:1-14).

What then? Shall we sin because we are not under <u>law</u> but under <u>grace</u>? May it never be! (6:15)

- B. He *Implores* them to <u>live</u> as Servants of Righteousness (6:15-23)
- C. **He** *Informs* **them** that they have "<u>Died</u>" to **the Law** *through* the <u>Body of Messiah</u> (7:1-13)
 - 1. The **Example** of the **Married Woman** (7:1-3)

7 Or do you **not know**, brethren (for I am speaking to **those** who **know the <u>law</u>**), that **the law** has **jurisdiction** over a **person** as long as **he lives**?

² For the married woman is bound by <u>law</u> to her husband while **he** is **living**; but if her husband <u>dies</u>, she is <u>released</u> from the law concerning the husband.

³ So then, if while her **husband is living** she is **joined** to **another man**,

she shall be called an **adulteress**; but if her **husband** <u>dies</u>, she is <u>free</u> from the <u>law</u>, so that she is **not** an **adulteress** though she is <u>joined</u> to **another man**.

2. The **Believer's "Death"** and "**Release"** from the Law (7:4-6)

⁴ Therefore, **my brethren**, **you also** were **made to die** to **the Law through** the **body of Messiah**, so that you might be **joined to another**, to **Him** who was **raised** from the **dead**, in order that we might **bear fruit** for **God**.

⁵ For while we were in the <u>flesh</u>, the <u>sinful passions</u>, which were <u>aroused</u> by the <u>Law</u>, were <u>at work</u> in the <u>members</u> of <u>our body</u> to <u>bear fruit</u> for death.

⁶ But <u>now</u> we have been <u>released</u> from <u>the Law</u>, having <u>died</u> to that by which we were bound, so that we serve in *newness* of the <u>Spirit</u> and <u>not</u> in *oldness* of the <u>letter</u>.

3. The "Arousal" of Indwelling Sin through the Law (7:7-13)

⁷ What shall we say then? Is the Law sin? May it never be! On the contrary, I would not have come to know sin except through the <u>Law</u>; for I would not have known about coveting if the Law had not said, "You SHALL NOT COVET."

⁸ But <u>sin</u>, taking **opportunity** *through* the <u>commandment</u>, *producing in me* coveting of every kind; for apart from the Law <u>sin</u> is <u>dead</u>.

⁹ I was **once alive apart** from **the** <u>Law;</u> but when the **commandment** came, **sin became alive** and **I died**;

and this <u>commandment</u>, which was to result in <u>life</u>, proved to result in <u>death</u> for me;
 for <u>sin</u>, taking an <u>opportunity through</u> the <u>commandment</u>, deceived me and through it <u>killed me</u>.

¹² So then, the Law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

¹³ Therefore did that which is **good** become a **cause of** <u>death</u> for **me?**May it never be!

Rather it was <u>sin</u>, in order that it might be shown to <u>be sin</u> by *effecting* my <u>death</u> through that which is *good*, so that *through* the **commandment** <u>sin</u> would become <u>utterly sinful</u>.

Message Summary (7:1-13)

Key Observations

1. <u>The Law</u> has <u>jurisdiction</u> over a person as long as he *lives*. A married woman is bound by <u>law</u> to her husband while he *lives*. If he *dies*, she is <u>free</u> from the <u>law</u> to be <u>joined</u> to another (7:1-3).

Previously we learned that *Believers* have "died to sin," having been <u>baptized</u> *into* Messiah's <u>death</u> and <u>resurrection</u> (6:2-5). Tonight we learned that believers also were made to "<u>die</u> to the <u>Law</u>" *through* the <u>body</u> of Messiah, so that we might be "<u>joined</u> to another," to Him (Jesus) who was "raised from the dead...that we might bear fruit for God (7:4)."

- 2. Paul declared that, while they were "in the <u>flesh</u> (before Messiah) (7:5a)", *sinful* passions, which were "aroused" by the <u>Law</u>, were at work in the members of their bodies, "to bear fruit for death (7:5)."
- 3. **Believers**, having "died" to that which they were bound, have been "released" from the Law, so that we might serve in "newness of the Spirit, and not in oldness of the letter (the Law) (7:6)."
- 4. The <u>Law</u>, even though it may cause the "arousal" of sinful passions in our flesh, <u>is not sin</u>. We would **not** *know* what <u>sin is</u>, if we did not have the <u>Law</u>, and its commandments (7:7). For through "the <u>Law</u> *comes* the **knowledge of sin** (3:20)."

Rather, it is <u>indwelling sin</u>, "taking **opportunity** *through* the <u>commandment</u> (the **Law**)," to **arouse**, **produce**, and bring to "life" <u>sinfulness</u> within our **bodily members**, that results in **death** (7:7-11).

So then, the <u>Law</u> is *holy*, and the <u>commandment</u> is *holy* and *righteous* and *good*.

Therefore did that which is **good** (the **Law**) become a **cause of death** for **me**? May it **never be**!

Rather it was <u>sin</u>, in order that it might be **shown** to **be** <u>sin</u> by **effecting my** <u>death</u> <u>through</u> that which is <u>good</u>, so that <u>through</u> the <u>commandment <u>sin</u> would become <u>utterly sinful</u>. (7:12-13)</u>

Personal Application

But now **we** have been <u>released</u> from the <u>Law</u>, having <u>died</u> to that by which we were **bound**, so that **we serve** in <u>newness</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> and **not** in oldness of the letter. (7:6)

What does it mean to serve in "Newness of the Spirit?"

Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the <u>Spirit</u> he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. (John 3: 5)

Or do you not know that your **body** is a **temple** of the **Holy Spirit** who is **in you**, whom you have **from God**, and that you are **not your own**?

For you have been **bought** with a **price**: therefore **glorify God** in **your body**. (I Corinthians 6:19-20)

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh.

For the <u>flesh</u> sets its *desire* against the <u>Spirit</u>, and the <u>Spirit</u> against the <u>flesh</u>; for these are in **opposition** to one another, so that you may not **do the things** that **you please**.

But if you are **led** by the **Spirit**, you are **not under the Law**.

But the *fruit* of the <u>Spirit</u> is *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control;* against such things there is <u>no law</u>. (Galatians 5:16-18, 22-23)

Closing Comments
