# Preparing a Fisherman for a "Harvest" {A Shavuot Story}

## Peter's Calling

Now as **Jesus** was walking by the Sea of Galilee, **He** saw two brothers, **Simon** who was called **Peter**, and **Andrew** his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were **fishermen**.

And **He** said to them,

"Follow **Me**, and I will make you **fishers of** *men*."

Immediately they left their nets and **followed Him**. (Matthew 4:18-20)

#### Peter's Compulsive Character

- A. *Requesting* that **he too**, be allowed to **walk on water** (Matthew 14:28-32)
- B. *Rebuking* the **Lord** regarding **His** impending <u>death</u> (Matthew 16:22-23)
- C. **Refusing** to allow his **feet** to be **washed** (John 13:6-11)
- D. *Rashly* cutting off the <u>ear</u> of the high priest's servant (Mark 14:47)

#### Peter's Confession of Faith

Now when **Jesus** came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, **He (Jesus)** was asking **His disciples**, "Who do **people say** that the **Son of Man is?**"

<sup>14</sup> And they said, "Some say John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; but still others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets."
He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

And **Jesus** said to him, "**Blessed** are you, **Simon Barjona**, because **flesh and blood** did **not** reveal *this* to you, but **My Father** who is in **heaven**.

I also say to you that you are *Peter*, and upon **this** *rock* I will build **My church**; and the **gates of Hades** will **not** overpower it. (Matthew 13:16-18)

### Peter's Boastful Claim

Then **Jesus** said to them (**His disciples**),

"You will all fall away because of Me this night, for it is written,

'I WILL **STRIKE DOWN** THE **SHEPHERD**,
AND THE **SHEEP** OF THE FLOCK SHALL BE <u>SCATTERED</u>.'
But after I have been *raised*, I will go ahead of you to **Galilee.**"

But <u>Peter</u> said to Him, "Even though all may fall away because of You, I will <u>never</u> fall away."

Jesus said to him,
"Truly I say to you that this very night, before a rooster crows,
you will deny Me three times."

Peter said to Him,
"Even if I have to die with You, I will not deny You."

All the disciples said the same thing too. (Matthew 26: 31-35)

#### Peter's Collapse

Having arrested Him (Jesus), they led Him away and brought Him to the house of the high priest; but <u>Peter</u> was following at a distance.

After they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together,

Peter was sitting among them.

And a **servant-girl**, seeing him (**Peter**) as he sat in the firelight and looking intently at him, said, "This man was **with Him too**." But **he denied it**, saying, "Woman, I do **not** know **Him.**"

A little later, *another* saw him and said, "You are *one* of them too!" But **Peter** said, "Man, **I am** <u>not</u>!"

After about an hour had passed, *another man began* to insist, saying, "Certainly **this man** also was with **Him**, for he is a **Galilean** too."

But **Peter** said, "Man, I **do** <u>not</u> **know** what you are talking about." *Immediately*, while he was still speaking, a **rooster crowed**.

The **Lord turned** and **looked** at **Peter**. And **Peter remembered** the **word of the Lord**, how **He** had told him,

"Before a rooster crows today, you will <u>deny Me</u> three times."

And he went out and wept bitterly. (Luke 22:54-62)

# **Peter's Ministry Confirmation**

So when they had finished breakfast, **Jesus** said to **Simon Peter**, "**Simon**, *son* of John, do you **love Me** *more* than **these?**"

He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You."
He said to him, "Tend My lambs."

He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?"

**He** said to **Him**, "**Yes**, **Lord**; **You know** that I love You." **He** said to **him**, "**Shepherd My sheep**."

**He** said to **him** the **third** time, "Simon, son of John, do you **love Me**?"

Peter was *grieved* because He said to him the *third* time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know *all* things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep.

(John 21:15-17)

#### **Peter's Ministry Commences**

When the day of <u>Pentecost</u> (Shavuot) had come, they were all together in one place...

And they were all *filled* with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and began to speak with **other tongues**, as the **Spirit** was giving them **utterance**.

Now there were **Jews** living in **Jerusalem**, devout men from **every nation** under heaven...

But <u>Peter</u>, taking his stand with the eleven, raised his voice and declared to them:

"Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words...

...Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with *miracles* and *wonders* and *signs* which God performed *through* Him in your **midst**, just as you yourselves know—

this *Man*, delivered over by the *predetermined* plan and *foreknowledge* of God, you nailed to a <u>cross</u> by the hands of godless men and put *Him* to <u>death</u>.

But God <u>raised Him</u> up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was *impossible* for Him to be held in its power...

Peter said to them, "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus the Messiah for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit...

And with many **other words he (Peter)** solemnly **testified** and kept on **exhorting them**, saying, "Be **saved** from this **perverse generation!**"

So then, those who had *received* his word were *baptized;* and **that day** there were **added** about <u>three thousand souls</u>. (Acts 2:1, 4-5, 14, 22b-24, 38, 40-41)

# **Shavuot Reflections**

A. The **Feast of** *Shavuot* **reminds us** that the **feasts** of the **Lord** are not only times of **celebration** and **remembrance**, but that they point to **events** that are **predicted** to happen according to **God's** *prophetic* **purposes**.

On this *Shavuot*, **fifty days** after **Messiah's resurrection**, when **Peter** boldly stood up and **preached** the **gospel**, these **key biblical <u>events</u>** took place:

- 1. The *coming* of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to indwell believers (Acts 1:6-8, 2:1-3, 16-18)
- 2. The *commencement* of this **present age** known as the "church age," whereby both **Jewish** and **Gentile believers** in **Messiah** are called into <u>one</u> "body" of believers (Ephesians 2:11-16, 3:2-6) (I Corinthians 12:13)
- 3. The *cultivating* of a "spiritual harvest," the *firstfruits* of those who would be <u>saved</u> by faith in the "Lamb of God who takes away the <u>sins</u> of the world!" (John 1:18) (I Peter 1:18-19) (John 3:16) (Romans 3:21-22)
- B. The **Feast of** *Shavuot* is a **yearly reminder** that the "**spiritual harvest,**" begun at the **beginning** of this age (on **Shavuot**), is ongoing, and that we must continue the priorities of **evangelism** and **discipleship**, and "**gather <u>fruit</u>** for **life eternal**." (Joh 4:34-36) (Matthew 28:18-20) (Romans 1:13-17)
- C. The **Feast of** *Shavuot* is a <u>celebration</u> concerning the "first fruits" of the harvest, and is a reminder to give thanks and rejoice in God's gracious provision for both our physical and spiritual needs. (Matthew 6:26) (Philippians 4:19) (II Peter 1:3)
