The Jewish Feast that Changed the World

A. The *Promise* of <u>Power</u> for Ministry

"He (Jesus) said the them (His disciples)... but you will receive <u>power</u> when the <u>Holy Spirit</u> has come upon you; and you shall be *My witnesses* both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." (Acts 1:7a, 8)

B. The "Pouring Forth" of God's Holy Spirit

1. A Perplexing Sign

When the day of <u>Pentecost</u> (<u>Shavuot</u>) had come, They (<u>Messiah's disciples</u>) were all together in one place. And **suddenly** there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting.

And there appeared to them **tongues** as of *fire* distributing themselves, and they **rested** on **each one** of them. And they were all **filled** with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and began to speak with *other* tongues, as the <u>Spirit</u> was giving them utterance.

Now there were **Jews** living in **Jerusalem**, devout men from **every nation** under **heaven**.

And when this *sound* occurred, the *crowd* came together, and they were *bewildered* because they were *each one* hearing them speak in his <u>own language</u>.

They were **amazed** and **astonished**, saying, "Why, are not **all these** who are **speaking Galileans**? And how is it that we each **hear them** in our **own language** to which we were **born**?..— we hear them in our **own tongues** speaking of the **mighty deeds of God**."

And they **all** continued in **amazement** and **great** <u>perplexity</u>, saying to one another, "*What* does this mean?" But others were **mocking** and **saying**, "**They** are full of **sweet wine**." (Acts 2:1-13)

2. A Prophetic Proclamation

But **Peter**, taking his stand with **the eleven**, raised his voice and **declared** to them:

"Men of Judah...give heed to my words...

...this is what was **spoken of** through the **prophet Joel**:

'AND IT SHALL BE IN THE **LAST DAYS**,' God says, 'THAT I WILL **POUR FORTH** OF **MY SPIRIT** ON **ALL MANKIND**;

AND YOUR SONS AND YOUR DAUGHTERS SHALL PROPHESY, AND YOUR YOUNG MEN SHALL SEE VISIONS, AND YOUR OLD MEN SHALL DREAM DREAMS;

EVEN ON MY BONDSLAVES, BOTH MEN AND WOMEN, I WILL IN THOSE DAYS <u>POUR FORTH</u> OF <u>MY SPIRIT</u> And they shall prophesy...

...let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both <u>Lord and Messiah</u> this <u>Jesus</u> whom you crucified." (Acts 2:14-18, 36)

3. A *Powerful* <u>Result</u>—a great Spiritual "Harvest"

Now when they **(the people)** heard *this*, they were *pierced* to the heart, and said to **Peter** and the rest of the **apostles**, **"Brethren, what** shall we **do**?"

Peter said to them, "<u>Repent</u>, and each of you be <u>baptized</u> in the **name** of **Jesus the Messiah** for the <u>forgiveness</u> of your <u>sins</u>; and you will receive the **gift** of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.

> For the **promise** is for **you** and **your children** and for **all** who are <u>far off</u>, as **many** as the **Lord our God will** *call* to Himself..."

So then, **those** who had <u>received</u> his word were baptized; and **that day** there were added <u>three thousand souls</u>...

And the Lord was <u>adding</u> to their number day by day those who were being <u>saved</u>. (Acts 2:37-39, 41, 47b)

C. The *Powerful* <u>Worldwide Impact</u>

And with <u>great power</u> the apostles were giving testimony to the *resurrection* of the Lord Jesus, and abundant <u>grace</u> was upon them all...(Acts 4:33) But the <u>word of God</u> kept on <u>spreading</u>; and the **number** of the **disciples** continued to <u>increase greatly</u> in **Jerusalem**, and a *great many* of the **priests** were becoming **obedient to the faith**. (Acts 6:7)

> But the <u>word of the Lord</u> continued to *grow* and to be <u>multiplied</u>... (Acts 12:24)

So the <u>word of the Lord</u> was *growing* mightily and <u>prevailing</u>... (Acts 19:20)

When they (**the mob**) did not find them (**Paul and Silas**), they *began* dragging Jason and some brethren before the city authorities, shouting, "**These men** who have <u>upset the world</u> have come here also; (Acts 17:6)

Personal Challenge Preparing for a Future Harvest

→ By faithfully *Sowing* the "seed" of the <u>Word of God</u>

When a large crowd was coming together,... He (Jesus) spoke by way of a parable: "The sower went out to sow his <u>seed</u>; and as he sowed, some fell *beside* the road,... Other **seed** fell on **rocky soil**,... Other **seed** fell amon**g thorns**;... Other **seed** fell into the **good soil**, and **grew up**, and produced a **great crop** a **hundred times** as **great**...

Now the parable is this: the <u>seed</u> is the <u>word of God</u>..." (Luke 8:5-8, 11)

...for you have been **born again** not of <u>seed</u> which is **perishable** but **imperishable**, *that is*, through the **living** and **enduring** <u>word of God</u>. (I Peter 1:23)

→ By faithfully "Watering" the field of God

What then is **Apollos?** And what is **Paul? Servants through** whom **you believed**, even as the **Lord** gave **opportunity** to **each one**.

I planted, Apollos <u>watered</u>, but God was *causing* the growth.... For we are God's fellow workers; you are <u>God's field</u>, God's building. (I Corinthians 3:5-6, 9)

→ By faithfully Praying that God will "send out" workers into His harvest field

Seeing the **people, He (Messiah)** felt **compassion** for them, because they were *distressed* and *dispirited* like **sheep** without a **shepherd**.

Then **He** said to **His disciples**, "The **harvest is** *plentiful*, but the <u>workers</u> are few. Therefore <u>beseech</u> the Lord of the harvest to send out <u>workers</u> into **His harvest**." (Matthew 9:36-38)

→ By patiently *Persevering* until the "latter rains" produce the "final" <u>harvest</u> (a final harvest before the <u>return</u> of the Lord)

> Let us <u>not</u> lose heart in *doing good*, for in due time we <u>will reap</u> if we do <u>not</u> grow weary. (Galatians 6:9)

Therefore **be** <u>patient</u>, **brethren**, until the **coming of the Lord**. The **farmer** *waits* for the <u>precious produce</u> of the **soil**, being <u>patient</u> about it, until it gets the **early and** <u>late</u> rains. You too be <u>patient</u>; strengthen your hearts, for the **coming of the Lord** is *near*. (James 5:7-8)
