Simchat Torah Why *Celebrate* the Scriptures— God's <u>written word</u>?

A. The *Scriptures* reveal to us the <u>Knowledge of God</u>

"My son, if you will receive <u>my sayings</u> and treasure <u>my commandments</u> within you, make your ear attentive to *wisdom*, incline your heart to *understanding*; if you cry for *discernment*, lift your voice for *understanding*; if you seek her as silver and search for her as for hidden treasures;

> then you will **discern** the **fear** of **the LORD** and **discover** the <u>knowledge of God."</u> (Proverbs 2:1-5)

My people are **destroyed** for *lack* of <u>knowledge</u>. Because you have *rejected* knowledge, I also will *reject you* from being My priest.

Since you have *forgotten* the <u>law</u> of your God, I also will *forget* your children. (Hosea 4:6)

B. The Scriptures give us "Light" in a world of Darkness

Your <u>word</u> is a <u>lamp</u> to my feet and a <u>light</u> to my path. (Psalm 119:105)

For the <u>commandment</u> is a <u>lamp</u> and the <u>teaching</u> is <u>light</u>; and <u>reproofs</u> for discipline are the way of *life*. (Proverbs 6:23)

So we have the <u>prophetic word</u> made more sure, to which you do well to pay attention as to a <u>lamp</u> shining in a <u>dark place</u>, until the *day dawns* and the *morning star* arises in your hearts. (II Peter 1:19)

C. The Scriptures declare to us the Way of Salvation

<u>Salvation</u> is far from the wicked, For they do not seek Your <u>statutes</u>. (Psalm 119:155)

...and that from **childhood** you have *known* the <u>sacred writings</u> which are **able** to give you the **wisdom** that *leads* to <u>salvation</u> through <u>faith</u> which is in **Messiah Jesus**. (II Timothy 3:15)

D. The Scriptures reveal to us the Messiah

"You **search** the <u>Scriptures</u> because you think that in *them* you have **eternal life**; it is *these* that *bear witness* of <u>Me;</u>"

Then **beginning** with **Moses** and with **all** the **prophets**, **He (Jesus) explained** to them the things concerning <u>Himself</u> in **all** the <u>scriptures</u>. (Luke 24:27)

And according to **Paul's custom**, he went to them (the **Jews**), and for **three Sabbaths reasoned** with them from the <u>Scriptures</u>, explaining and giving *evidence* that the **Messiah** had to **suffer** and **rise again** from the **dead**, and *saying*, "This **Jesus** whom I am **proclaiming** to you is the <u>Messiah</u>." (Acts 17:2-3)

E. The *Scriptures* declare the Way of <u>Righteousness</u>

With all my heart I have *sought You*; Do <u>not</u> let me wander from Your <u>commandments</u>.

> Your <u>word</u> I have treasured in my heart, That I may <u>not sin</u> against You.

Blessed are You, O LORD; Teach me Your <u>statutes</u>. (Psalm 119:10-12)

All <u>Scripture</u> is *inspired by God* and profitable for **teaching**, for **reproof**, for **correction**, for **training in** <u>righteousness</u>; so that the **man of God** may be adequate, *equipped* for every **good work**. (II Timothy 3:16)

F. The *Scriptures* are "living and active," <u>revealing</u> and <u>transforming</u> the lives of believers

For the **word of God** is *living* and *active* and *sharper* than any two-edged sword, and *piercing* as far as the division of *soul* and *spirit*, of both *joints* and *marrow*, and able to <u>judge</u> the **thoughts** and **intents** of the **heart.** (Hebrews 4:12)

For this reason we also **constantly thank God** that when you *received* the <u>word of God</u> which you heard from us, you accepted *it* not as the word of men, but *for* what it really is, the <u>word of God</u>, which also <u>performs its work</u> *in you* who believe. (I Thessalonians 2:13)

G. The Scriptures, when heard and received produce Faith

How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed?

How will they <u>believe</u> in Him whom they have not <u>heard</u>? And how will they *hear* without a *preacher?...*

So <u>faith</u> comes from *hearing*, and *hearing* by the <u>word</u> of Messiah. (Romans 10:14, 17)

H. The *Scriptures* strengthen us with <u>Hope</u>

If **Your <u>law</u>** had not been my **delight**, then I would have **perished** in my **affliction.** (Psalm 119:92)

For whatever was <u>written</u> in **earlier times** was *written* for our <u>instruction</u>, so that through *perseverance* and the *encouragement* of the <u>Scriptures</u> we might have <u>hope</u>. (Romans 15:4)

I. The *Scriptures* are a source of <u>Joy</u>

The <u>precepts</u> of the LORD are *right*, <u>rejoicing</u> the heart; the <u>commandment</u> is *pure*, enlightening the eyes. (Psalm 19:8)

> I have <u>rejoiced</u> in the way of Your <u>testimonies</u>, as much as in all *riches*.

I have inherited **Your** <u>testimonies</u> forever, for they are the <u>jov</u> of **my heart**.

I <u>rejoice</u> at Your <u>word</u>, as one who finds great *spoil*. (Psalm 119:14, 111, 162)

J. The *Scriptures* can give us **inward** <u>Peace</u>

Those who **love** Your <u>law</u> have <u>great peace</u>, and *nothing* causes them to **stumble**. (Psalm 119:165)

Now may the **God of hope** *fill you* with all **joy** and <u>peace</u> in <u>believing</u>, so that you will abound **in** *hope* by the **power** of the **Holy Spirit**. (Romans 15:13)

As **believers**, we *believe* and *celebrate* <u>both</u> God's written and His "living" Word

In the **beginning** was the <u>Word</u>, and the <u>Word</u> was <u>with</u> God, and the <u>Word was</u> God. He was in the beginning <u>with</u> God...

And the *Word* <u>became flesh</u>, and dwelt among us, and we saw His *glory*, *glory* as of the <u>only begotten</u> from the Father, full of *grace* and *truth.* (John 1:1-2, 14) A. Like the *written* word, the *"living* Word" reveals to us the <u>Knowledge of God</u>.

In Him (Messiah)..."are *hidden* all the treasures of <u>wisdom</u> and <u>knowledge</u> (Col. 2:3)"

B. Like the *written* word, the *"living* Word" is our <u>Light</u> in a dark world.

Then **Jesus** again spoke to them, saying, "I am the <u>Light</u> of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the *darkness*, but will have the <u>Light of life</u>." (John 8:12)

C. Like the written word, the "living Word" declares to us the way of Salvation.

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son,...

For **God** did *not* send the **Son** into the **world** to *judge* the world, but that the **world** might be <u>saved</u> *through* <u>Him</u>." (John 3:16a, 17)

D. Like the *written* word which <u>reveals</u> the <u>Messiah</u> to come, the "*living* Word" <u>is</u> the <u>revelation</u> and <u>manifestation</u> of the <u>Messiah</u>.

The woman (of Samaria) said to Him, "I know that <u>Messiah</u> is coming... when that **One comes**, **He** will declare *all things* to us." Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you <u>am He</u>." (John 4:25-26)

E. Like the written word, the "living Word" declares the way of Righteousness

He made Him (Messiah) who knew <u>no sin</u> to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the <u>righteousness</u> of God *in Him*. (II Cor. 5:21)

F. Like the *written* word that is "alive" and transformative, the "*living* Word" <u>indwells</u> and <u>transforms</u> believers.

Because *you are sons*, God has sent forth the <u>Spirit</u> of <u>His Son</u> *into* our <u>hearts</u>, crying, "Abba! Father!" (Gal. 4:6) (Rom. 8:29)

G. Like the *written* word, the "living Word" has given us eternal <u>Hope</u>.

,.. looking for the <u>blessed hope</u> and the appearing of the *glory* of our great God and Savior, Messiah Jesus, (Titus 2:13)

H. Like the *written* word, the *"living* Word" is our source of great Joy.

These things **I** (Jesus) have spoken to you so that <u>My joy</u> may be *in you*, and *that* <u>your joy</u> may be **made** *full*. (John 15:11)

I. Like the *written* word, the "living Word" is our <u>Peace</u>.

<u>Peace</u> I leave with you; <u>My peace</u> I give to you; *not* as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful. (John 14:27)
