Simeon's *Priceless* Gift A Jewish "Christmas" Story

(Luke 2:25-35)

A. Simeon's Pious Character (2:25)

²⁵ And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; and this man was <u>righteous</u> and <u>devout</u>, looking for the *consolation* of Israel; and the <u>Holy Spirit</u> was upon him.

B. Simeon's *Promise* from <u>God</u> (2:26)

²⁶ And it had been **revealed** to him by the **Holy Spirit** that he would **not** see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

C. Simeon's Priceless Gift (2:27-32)

²⁷ And he came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to carry out for Him the custom of the Law,

²⁸ then he took Him into his arms, and blessed God, and said,

²⁹ "Now Lord, You are *releasing* Your **bond-servant** to <u>depart</u> in peace, According to Your word;

³⁰ For my eyes have seen Your <u>salvation</u>,
³¹ Which You have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

³² A LIGHT OF REVELATION TO THE GENTILES,

And the glory of Your people Israel."

D. Simeon's *Prophetic* <u>Announcement</u> (2:33-35)2:25)

³³ And **His father** and **mother** were **amazed** at the things which were being said **about Him**.

³⁴ And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary His mother,

"Behold, **this** *Child* is **appointed** for the <u>fall</u> and <u>rise</u> of **many** in **Israel**, and for a <u>sign</u> to be *opposed*— ³⁵ and a sword will pierce even your own soul—to the end that thoughts from many hearts may be <u>revealed</u>."

<u>Message Summary</u> Simeon's Priceless Gift→ To See and Behold the Messianic <u>Hope</u>

- 1. To *See <u>Him</u>* who would be the "<u>Consolation</u>" of Israel (2:25)
- 2. To See the Lord's "<u>Anointed</u>" (the <u>Messiah</u>) (2:26)
- 3. To *See <u>Him</u>* who would be the <u>Salvation</u> of God (2:30)
 - a. *Who* was "**prepared** in the **presence** of <u>all</u> **peoples**" (2:31)
 - b. *Who* would be "A <u>LIGHT</u> OF **REVELATION** TO THE <u>GENTILES</u>" (2:32a) (Isaiah 49:6)
 - c. *Who* was the "glory" of the people of <u>Israel</u> (2:32b) (Isaiah 60:1-3)
- To See <u>Him</u> who would be Appointed for the "<u>fall</u> and <u>rise</u>" of *many* in <u>Israel</u> (2:34)
 - a. *Appointed* as a "<u>Sign</u>" that would be <u>opposed</u> (2:34b)
 - b. *Appointed* as a "<u>Sword</u>," that would <u>pierce</u> the *soul* of Mary, and <u>reveal</u> the **thoughts** from **many hearts** (2:35)
- 5. To *See <u>Him</u> who would allow Simeon, the Lord's bondservant, to now "<u>depart in peace</u>" (2:29)*

Personal Application Reflecting on the Life of Simeon— A Life "Well-Lived,"

A. *Simeon* lived as a <u>righteous</u> and <u>devout</u> man (2:25a). *We also* should live as righteous and godly men, and women.

But the **path** of the <u>righteous</u> is like the **light of dawn**, That **shines** *brighter* and *brighter* until the **full day**. (Proverbs 4:18) When the **whirlwind passes**, the <u>wicked</u> is *no more*, But the <u>righteous</u> *has* an *everlasting* foundation. (Proverbs 10:25)

In the way of <u>righteousness</u> is *life*, And in *its* **pathway** there is *no death*. (Proverbs 12:28)

B. *Simeon* was <u>taught</u> and <u>led</u> by the <u>Holy Spirit</u> (2:25-27). *We also* are to be **taught** and **led** by the <u>Spirit</u> whom we have from God.

But the *Helper*, the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, whom the **Father** will **send** in *My name*, **He** will <u>teach</u> you all things, and bring to your **remembrance** all that **I said** to **you**. (John 14:26)

> For *all* who are being <u>led</u> by the <u>Spirit of God</u>, these are <u>sons</u> of God. (Romans 8:14)

C. *Simeon* walked in <u>hope</u>, *looking* for the "consolation" of Israel, (the Messiah) (2:25b). *We also* are to walk in <u>hope</u> of a future <u>consolation</u> as we look to the *return* of the Messiah.

For the *grace* of God has appeared, bringing <u>salvation</u> to all men, instructing us to *deny* ungodliness and worldly desires and to live *sensibly*, *righteousl*y and *godly* in the present age,

looking for the <u>blessed hope</u> and the *appearing* of the **glory** of our **great God and Savior**, **Messiah Jesus**, (Titus 2:11-13)

- D. Simeon blessed God as he <u>saw</u>, and even held in his arms what he *believed* to be the "<u>salvation</u>" of God (2:28, 30). He also declared this child to be:
 - 1. The "<u>consolation</u> of Israel" (2:25b)
 - 2. The Lord's "Anointed" (Messiah) (2:26)
 - 3. The "<u>LIGHT</u> OF *REVELATION* TO THE <u>GENTILES</u>" (2:32a)
 - 4. The <u>glory</u> of the people of <u>Israel</u> (2:32)

We also have been **blessed** to "**see**" the <u>salvation</u> of God in the **Person** of **His Son**, **Yeshua**.

"For **God** did not **send the Son** into the world to *judge* the **world**, but that the **world** might be <u>saved</u> *through Him* (John 1:17)." E. Simeon had been given prophetic insight regarding the child Yeshua, and declared to Mary that He was "appointed for the <u>fall</u> and <u>rise</u> of many in Israel, (2:34b)."

We also, along with declaring the **good news** of **salvation** in **Messiah**, carry a **prophetic warning** regarding the "<u>fall</u> and <u>rise</u>" of **those** who would either *reject* or *receive* **His salvation**.

",...let it be **known** to **all** of you and to **all** the **people of Israel**, that by the **name** of **Jesus Messiah the Nazarene**,... this **man** stands here before you in **good health**...

And there is <u>salvation</u> in <u>no one</u> else; for there is <u>no other</u> *name* under heaven that has been given among men by which we must <u>be saved</u>." (Acts 4:10, 12)

F. *Simeon* the Lord's bondservant, having *seen* the Lord's Messiah, could *now* "depart in <u>peace</u> (2:29)."

We also, having "seen" and understood, and having <u>believed</u> in **Jesus** as our **Savior and Lord**, can truly "depart in peace" when our **sojourn** in this **world** ends.

Jesus said to her (Martha), "I am the <u>resurrection</u> and the <u>life;</u> he who *believes* in Me will <u>live</u> even if he <u>dies</u>,

and everyone who **lives** and **believes in Me** will <u>never die</u>. **Do <u>vou</u> believe this?**" (John 11:25-26)

Now may our Lord Jesus the Messiah Himself and God our Father, who has <u>loved us</u> and <u>given us</u> eternal <u>comfort</u> and <u>good hope</u> by <u>grace</u>, comfort and strengthen your hearts in every good work and word. (II Thessalonians 2:16-17)
