# Staying **Hopeful**, when things seem **Hopeless**

### (The **Healing** of the **Paralytic**)

(John 5:1-15)

#### I. The *Desperate* Circumstances (5:1-4)

After these things there was a **feast** of the **Jews**, and **Jesus** went up to **Jerusalem**.

Now there is in **Jerusalem** by the sheep *gate* **a pool**, which is called in Hebrew **Bethesda**, having **five porticoes**.

In these lay a *great multitude* of those who were **sick**, **blind**, **lame**, and **withered**, [waiting for the moving of the waters; for an **angel** of the **Lord** went down at **certain seasons** into the **pool** and **stirred up** the **water**; whoever then <u>first</u>, after the **stirring up** of the **water**, stepped in was **made well** from whatever **disease** with which he was afflicted.

#### II. The *Divine* Healing (5:5-9)

And a man was there who had been thirty-eight years in his sickness.

When **Jesus saw** him **lying** *there*, and *knew* he had already been a **long** time *in* that condition, **He** said to him, "**Do you** wish to **get well?**"

The **sick man** answered **Him**,

"**Sir**, I have **no man** to put me in the **pool** when the **water**is **stirred up**, but while I am coming, **another** steps down before me."

Jesus said to him, "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk."

Immediately the man became well, and picked up his pallet and began to walk. Now it was the Sabbath on that day.

#### III. The *Disapproving* Inquiry (5:10-13)

So the **Jews** were saying to **him** who was **cured**, "It is the **Sabbath**, and it is **not permissible** for you to **carry your pallet**."

But **he** answered them,

"He who made me well was the one who said to me,

'Pick up your pallet and walk.'"

They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Pick up your pallet and walk?"

But the **man** who **was healed did not know** who it was, for **Jesus** had **slipped away** while there was **a crowd** in *that* place.

#### IV. The *Denunciation* of $\underline{\mathbf{Sin}}$ (5:14-15)

Afterward **Jesus found him** in the **temple** and said to **him**, "Behold, **you** have **become well**; **do not sin** anymore, so that nothing **worse** may befall you."

The **man** went away, and **told** the **Jews** that it was **Jesus** who had **made him well**.

## <u>Summary Observations</u> →

#### A. The *Persistence* of <u>Hope</u>, in the *face* of <u>Hopelessness</u>

Now there is in **Jerusalem**...a **pool,**...having five porticoes.

In these lay a **multitude** of those who were **sick, blind lame, and withered**, [waiting for the moving of the waters;..] (5:1-2)

#### B. The *Presence* of the <u>Divine</u>, in the *midst* of <u>Desperation</u>

The **Spirit of the Lord GOD** is upon **me**, because **the LORD** has **anointed me** to bring **good news** to the **afflicted**;

He has sent me to <u>bind</u> the <u>brokenhearted</u>, to proclaim **liberty** to *captives* and **freedom to** *prisoners*; (Isaiah 61:1) (see also Matthew 11:2-5, Psalm 72:11-13)

#### C. The *Power* of the Messiah to <u>Heal Miraculously</u>

A man was there who had been thirty-eight years in his sickness...

Jesus said to him, "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk."

Immediately the man became well,..(5:5, 8-9a)

#### D. The *Posturing* of the <u>Jewish Leaders</u>

So the **Jews** were saying to him who was cured,

"It is the Sabbath, and it is not permissible for you to carry your pallet."

But **he** answered them, "<u>He</u> who <u>made me well</u> was the **one** who said to me, "Pick up *your pallet* and walk." (5:10-11)

#### E. The *Priority* of a <u>Walk</u> of <u>Righteousness</u>

"Behold, you have become well; do not sin anymore, so that nothing worse may befall you." (5:14b)

# Personal Application So **How** do we regain **Hope** when we *feel* **Hopeless**?

#### 1. We *Renew* our <u>Faith</u> in God's <u>Love</u> for us

I (Jeremiah) am the man who has seen affliction because of the rod of *His wrath*...

My soul has been rejected from *peace;*I have forgotten *happiness*.

So I say, "My strength has perished, and so has my hope from the LORD..."

This I recall to my mind, therefore I have hope.

The LORD"S lovingkindnesses indeed never cease, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.

(Lamentations 3:1, 17-18, 21-23)

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But in **all these things** we overwhelmingly **conquer** through **Him** who **loved us**. For I am **convinced** that neither **death**, nor **life**, nor **angels**, nor **principalities**, nor things **present**, nor things **to come**, nor **powers**, nor **height**, nor **depth**, nor any other **created thing**, will be able to **separate us** from the **love of God**, which is **in Messiah Jesus** our **Lord**. (Romans 8:37-39)

#### 2. We *Rest* in our **Eternal Salvation**

But we should always **give thanks** to **God** for **you**, brethren **beloved** by the **Lord**, because **God** has **chosen you** from the **beginning** for **salvation** through **sanctification** by the **Spirit** and **faith** in the **truth...** 

Now may our Lord Jesus the Messiah Himself and God our Father,

who has *loved us* and given us <u>eternal comfort</u> and <u>good hope</u> by <u>grace</u>, <u>comfort</u> and <u>strengthen</u> your hearts in every <u>good work</u> and <u>word</u>.

(II Thessalonians 2:13, 16-17)

3. We *Remember* that we have a "Living Hope" in Messiah

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus the Messiah, who according to His great *mercy* has caused <u>us</u> to be born again to a <u>living hope</u> through the resurrection of Jesus the Messiah from the dead,

to obtain an inheritance which is imperishable...

reserved in heaven for you,..

(I Peter 1:3-4)

4. We *Recall* past **Examples** of **Hope** and **Perseverance** 

For whatever was written in earlier times
was written for our instruction,
so that through perseverance and the encouragement
of the Scriptures we might have hope. (Romans 15:4)

5. We *Reflect* on the "Blessed Hope" of the Return of the Lord

For the grace of God has <u>appeared</u>, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to deny <u>ungodliness</u> and <u>worldly desires</u>

and to live **sensibly**, **righteously** and **godly** in the present age, looking for the **blessed hope** and the **appearing** of the **glory** of our great **God and Savior**, **Messiah Jesus**,.. (Titus 2:11-13)

6. We *Revive our* **Hope** by **committing** ourselves to **share** the **good news** of our **Messianic Hope** 

...but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence;.. (I Peter 3:15)

7. We *Rely* on the **God of <u>Hope</u>**, who **empowers us** with <u>Joy</u> and <u>Hope</u>

Now may the **God of <u>hope</u>** fill you with **all joy** and **peace** in **believing**, so that you will **abound in hope** by the **power** of the **Holy Spirit**. (Romans 15:13)

Closing Text→"For I know the plans that I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans for your welfare and not for calamity to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)
