Sukkot Exhortation

On **Sukkot** we are **Commanded** to **Rejoice**. But it's been a **Tough Year**, what can we be **Joyful about**?

A. We can be *Joyful* that we are <u>alive</u> (both physically and spiritually), and that we can still **gather** "fruit for life eternal." (John 4:36)

For whoever is **joined** with all the **living**, there is **hope**; surely a **live dog** is **better** than a **dead lion**.

For the **living** know they will **die**; but the **dead** do **not know anything**, nor have they any longer **a reward**, for their **memory** is **forgotten**.

Indeed their **love**, their **hate** and their **zeal** have already **perished**, and they will no longer have **a share** in all that is done under the sun.

B. We can be *Joyful* that God has given us another day.

This is <u>the day</u> which <u>the LORD</u> has made; Let us <u>rejoice</u> and be <u>glad in it.</u> (Psalm 118:24)

For **His (God's) anger** is but for *a moment*, **His favor** is for a **lifetime**; **Weeping** may **last** for *the night*,

But a **shout of joy** *comes* in *the morning*. (Psalm 30:5)

C. We can have Joy in our Salvation

I will <u>rejoice</u> greatly in the LORD, My soul will exult in my God;

For **He** has **clothed me** with **garments of <u>salvation</u>**, **He** has **wrapped me** with a **robe of <u>righteousness</u>**, As a **bridegroom** decks himself with a garland, And as a bride **adorns** herself with her jewels. (Isaiah 61:10)

Though the **fig tree** should **not blossom**And there be **no fruit** on the **vines**,
Though the **yield** of the **olive** should **fail**And the **fields** produce **no food**,
Though the **flock** should be **cut off** from the **fold**And there be **no cattle** in the **stalls**,
Yet I will **exult** in the **LORD**,
I will **rejoice** in the **God of my salvation**. (Habakkuk 3:17-18)

D. We can be *Joyful* in the <u>Blessings of God</u>

Bless the LORD, O my soul,
And all that is within me, bless His holy name.
Bless the LORD, O my soul,
And forget none of His benefits;
Who pardons all your iniquities,
Who heals all your diseases;
Who redeems your life from the pit,

Who crowns you with lovingkindness and compassion; Who satisfies your years with good things, So that your youth is renewed like the eagle. (Psalm 103:1-5)

E. We can be *Joyful* in the **Provision of God**

He causes the grass to grow for the cattle,
And vegetation for the labor of man,
So that he may bring forth food from the earth,
And wine which makes man's heart glad,
So that he may make his face glisten with oil,
And food which sustains man's heart...

There is the sea, great and broad, In which are swarms without number, Animals both small and great...

They all wait for You

To give them their food in due season.

You give to them, they gather it up;

You open Your hand, they are satisfied with good...

I will sing to the LORD as long as I live;
I will sing praise to my God while I have my being.
Let my meditation be pleasing to Him;
As for me, I shall be glad in the LORD. (Psalm 104:14-15, 25, 27-28, 33-34)

F. We can be *Joyful* in the **midst of <u>trials</u>** and <u>suffering</u>, *knowing* that they often result in **our spiritual** *growth* and *maturity*.

Consider it <u>all joy</u>, my brethren, when you encounter various <u>trials</u>, **knowing** that the **testing** of your faith <u>produces</u> endurance. (James 1:2-3)

...and you have forgotten the **exhortation** which is addressed to **you as sons**,

"MY SON, DO NOT REGARD LIGHTLY THE <u>DISCIPLINE</u> OF THE LORD, NOR FAINT WHEN YOU ARE <u>REPROVED</u> BY HIM;..

All discipline for the moment seems <u>not</u> to be <u>joyful</u>, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the *peaceful fruit* of <u>righteousness</u>. (Hebrews 12:5, 11)

G. We can have Joy in the study and knowledge of the word of God

The <u>precepts</u> of the LORD are right, <u>rejoicing</u> the heart; The <u>commandment</u> of the LORD is *pure*, enlightening the eyes. (Psalm 19:8)

Your words were found and I ate them,
And Your words became for me a joy and the delight of my heart;
For I have been called by Your name,
O LORD God of hosts. (Jeremiah 15:16)

H. We experience Joy by the Holy Spirit

Now may the **God of hope** *fill you* with <u>all joy</u> and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.

(Romans 15:13)

But the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> is love, <u>iov</u>, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control;..(Galatians 5:22)

I. We can experience Joy when we connect with others in fellowship

Day by day continuing with **one mind** in the **temple**, and **breaking bread** from **house to house**, they (the **disciples**) were taking their **meals <u>together</u>** with **gladness** and **sincerity of heart**, **praising God** and having **favor** with all the **people**.

And **the Lord** was **adding** to their **number** day by day **those** who were **being saved**. (Acts 2:46-47)

<u>Rejoice</u> with **those** who <u>rejoice</u>, and <u>weep</u> with **those** who <u>weep</u>. (Romans 12:15)

J. We can have Joy in the future hope (and joy) of our final salvation

He (the Lord) will swallow up death for all time,
And the Lord God will wipe tears away from all faces,
And He will remove the reproach of His people from all the earth;
For the Lord has spoken.
And it will be said in that day,
"Behold, this is our God for whom we have waited that He might save us.

This is **the Lord** for whom **we have** *waited*; **Let us** <u>rejoice</u> and **be** <u>glad</u> in <u>His salvation</u>."(Isaiah 25:8-9)

K. We can *Rejoice* that God, our sovereign and <u>righteous Judge</u>, will soon come and <u>judge</u> the world in <u>righteousness</u>.

Say among the **nations**, "The LORD <u>reigns</u>; Indeed, the **world** is **firmly established**, it will **not be moved**; **He** will **judge** the **peoples** with **equity**."

Let the **heavens** be **glad**, and let the **earth rejoice**; Let the **sea roar**, and all it contains; Let the **field exult**, and all that is in it.

Then all the **trees** of the forest will **sing for joy**Before **the Lord**, for **He is coming**,
For **He is coming to judge the earth**.

He will <u>judge</u> the world in <u>righteousness</u>
And the peoples in His faithfulness. (Psalm 96:10-13)
