<u>Sukkot</u>

"You shall celebrate the Feast of Booths seven days...

...**because** the **LORD your God will bless you** in all your **produce** and all the **work of your hands**, so that **you** shall be altogether **joyful.**" (Deuteronomy 16:13, 15)

God would have us be Joyful {Selected Verses}

Then **Nehemiah**, who was the **governor**, and **Ezra** the **priest** *and* **scribe**, and the **Levites** who *taught* the **people** said to all the people,

"This day is **holy** to the **LORD your God**; do <u>not</u> mourn or weep." For all the people were weeping when they heard the words of **the law**.

Then he said to them, "Go, **eat** of the *fat*, **drink** of the *sweet*, and **send** *portions* to him who has **nothing prepared**; for this day is **holy** to **our Lord**.

Do <u>not</u> be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your <u>strength</u>." (Nehemiah 8:9-10)

> The **hope** of the *righteous* is <u>gladness</u>, But the **expectation** of the *wicked* perishes.

A joyful heart is good medicine, But a broken spirit *dries up* the bones. (Proverbs 10:28, 17:22)

Sing *praise* to the LORD, you His godly ones, And give *thanks* to His holy name.

> For **His** anger is but for a moment, **His** favor is for a lifetime;

<u>Weeping</u> may last for the *night*, But a <u>shout of joy</u> *comes* in the *morning*. (Psalm 30:4-5)

Restore our captivity, O LORD,

As the streams in the South.

Those who **sow in** *tears* shall **reap** with <u>joyful shouting</u>. **He** who goes to and fro *weeping*, carrying *his* **bag of seed**, Shall indeed **come again** with a **shout of** <u>joy</u>, bringing his **sheaves** *with him*. (Psalm 126:4-6)

> Though the **fig tree** should <u>**not</u> blossom** And there be <u>**no**</u> fruit on the **vines**,</u>

> *Though* the **yield** of the **olive** should <u>fail</u> And the **fields produce** <u>no</u> food,

Though the **flock** should be <u>**cut off**</u> from the **fold** And there be <u>**no**</u> **cattle** in the **stalls**,

Yet I will <u>exult</u> in the LORD, I will <u>rejoice</u> in the God of my salvation. The Lord GOD is my strength,

And **He** has made **my feet** like **hinds'** *feet*, And makes **me walk** on my **high places**. (Habakkuk 3:17-19)

I will <u>rejoice</u> greatly in the LORD, My soul will <u>exult</u> in my God; For He has clothed me with garments of *salvation*, He has wrapped me with a robe of *righteousness*, As a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, And as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. (Isaiah 61:10)

> And the *ransomed* of the LORD will return And come with <u>joyful</u> shouting to Zion, With everlasting <u>joy</u> upon their heads. They will find <u>gladness</u> and <u>joy</u>, And *sorrow* and *sighing* will flee away. (Isaiah 35:10)

When **my anxious thoughts** *multiply* **within me**, Your consolations <u>delight</u> my soul. (Psalm 94:19)

I have **inherited Your** *testimonies* forever, For they are the <u>joy</u> of my heart. (Psalm 119:11) Be devoted to one another in brotherly love;...

rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer,..

<u>Rejoice</u> with those who <u>rejoice</u>, and *weep* with those who *weep* (Romans 12:10a, 12, 15)

Instruct those who are *rich* in this present world not to be conceited or to fix their *hope* on the *uncertainty* of riches, but <u>on God</u>, who richly supplies us with *all things* to <u>enjoy</u>. (I Timothy 6:17)

Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of *witnesses* surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily *entangles us,* and let us **run with** *endurance* the **race** that is **set before us**,

fixing our eyes on Jesus, the *author* and *perfecter* of <u>faith</u>, who for <u>the joy</u> set before Him *endured* the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

> For **consider** <u>Him</u> who has *endured* such **hostility** by **sinners** *against Himself*, so that **you** will <u>not</u> grow **weary** and **lose heart**. (Hebrews 12:1-3)

Now may the **God of** *hope* fill you with <u>all joy</u> and peace in believing, so that you will abound in *hope* by the **power** of the **Holy Spirit**. (Romans 15:13)

His lord said to him (his servant), 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord.' (Parable of the <u>Talents</u>, Matthew 25:21)
