The *Law* and the **Believer**

I. The **Mosaic Law Defined**

Last week we defined the **written** or **Mosaic Law** as a **conditional covenant** established by **God** with **Israel**. The **Law** promised **life** and **blessing** if **obeyed**, but **cursing** and **judgment** if not *fully* **obeyed** (Deuteronomy 28:1-2, 15). It expressed the **righteous will of God**, and **sanctified Israel** from among the pagan **nations**.

The **Law** provided the <u>means</u> by which **Israel** could **approach** and **worship** before a **holy God**, whose **presence** would now be **among them** in the **Tabernacle** they were constructing (Exodus 25:8-9). The "**Law**" is a **unit** of <u>613 laws</u> that can be separated into **three basic divisions**; the **Commandments**, the **Judgments**, and the **Ordinances**.

II. The Law and the Messiah

Last week we also looked at **Jesus** and the **Law of Moses**. We studied **four** areas regarding the **Law** and the **Messiah**:

- A. The Messiah's embrace of the Law
- B. The **Messiah's emphasis** on having an "<u>inward</u>" righteousness that was of greater priority than that of "external" Law-keeping
- C. The **Messiah's expressed** intent <u>not</u> to "abolish" the **Law** and the **Prophets**, but to "fulfill" them (Matthew 5:17-18)
- D. The Messiah's establishment of a *New Covenant* (Luke 22:19-20)
 - 1. A *New Covenant* that was **promise**d to **Israel** (Jeremiah 31:31-34)
 - 2. A *New Covenant* inaugurated through Messiah's <u>death</u> (Luke 22:19-20) (Hebrews 9:15-20)
 - 3. A *New Covenant* based on "<u>better promises</u>", whose <u>blessing</u>s are now given to all (both Jews and Gentiles) who have <u>faith</u> in Jesus the Messiah, and His work of salvation (Hebrews 8:6) (Romans 1:16-17).

III. The **Mosaic Law**, the **New Covenant**, and the **Believer**

Having embraced by **faith Jesus the Messiah** as both **Lord** and **Savior** (John 3:16, 11:25-26), **believers** (both **Jews** and **Gentiles**) have become **partakers** of the **spiritual** *blessings* and *promises* of a **New Covenant** (Hebrews 8:6, 9:15).

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus the Messiah, who has <u>blessed us</u> with every spiritual <u>blessing</u> in the heavenly places in Messiah, (Ephesians 1:3)

But you (believers) are A CHOSEN RACE, A royal PRIESTHOOD, A HOLY NATION, A PEOPLE FOR <u>God's OWN POSSESSION</u>, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of **Him** who has called you out of **darkness** into **His marvelous light**;

for you once were **NOT A PEOPLE**, but **now** you are THE **PEOPLE OF GOD**; you had NOT RECEIVED **MERCY**, but **now** you have RECEIVED **MERCY**. (I Peter 2:9-10)

→ As *Jewish* believers, we were once bound by a covenant relationship to obey all that was written in the Mosaic Law (Romans 5:3). However, according to the New Covenant, we have <u>now</u> "died" to the covenant of the Law, *through* the body of Messiah, and are no longer under its jurisdiction. We have been "released" from the Law to <u>now</u> serve the Lord in a *new* relationship with Him through His Spirit.

Therefore, my **brethren**, you also were made to <u>die</u> to the Law through the body of Messiah, so that you might be joined to another, to Him who was raised from the dead, in order that we might bear fruit for God...

But **now** we have been *released* from the <u>Law</u>, having <u>died</u> to that by which we were *bound*, so that we serve in *newness* of the <u>Spirit</u> and not in *oldness* of the <u>letter</u> (the Law) (Romans 7:4, 6).

→ As *New Covenant* believers, we have been released from the Law to now serve the Lord "in *newness* of the <u>Spirit</u> and not in the *oldness* of the <u>letter</u>" (the Law) (Rom. 7:6). When we placed our **faith** and **trust** in **Jesus** as our **Savior**, we received a "spiritual" birth, and were <u>born again</u> (John 1:12-13:5-6). We are recipients of God's Holy Spirit, who was *poured out* upon the disciples during the Feast of Shavuot (Pentecost) (Acts 2:1-17), and now <u>indwells</u> all believers (Romans 8:9, I Cor. 6:19).

This was in accordance with **Old Testament scriptures** which **predicted** the "**pouring out**" of **God's Spirit** upon **all mankind** (Joel 2:28-29), and was a prerequisite to <u>Israel's</u> **spiritual transformation** as **promised** by the **New Covenant** given to them in the **last days** (Jeremiah 31:31-34)—

→ Moreover, I will give you (Israel) a new heart and put a *new spirit* within you; and I will remove the heart of *stone* from your flesh and *give you* a heart of flesh.

I will put **My Spirit** within you and cause you to walk in **My statutes**, and you will be careful to observe **My ordinances**. (Ezekiel 36:26-27)

When **the Messiah** *revealed* to **His disciples** that in accordance with **God's purposes**, **He** would be **crucified**, **raised** from **the dead**, and would **ascend** back

to heaven, **He declared** that **He** would <u>send</u> them "another comforter," who would be with them forever. This would be the <u>Holy Spirit</u> who would <u>indwell</u> them, <u>comfort</u> them, <u>teach</u> them, and <u>guide</u> them into all <u>truth</u> (John 14:16-20, 26, 16:13).

He declared that it would be through the <u>power</u> of the <u>indwelling Spirit</u> among them (and *all* believers) that would carry the <u>message</u> of the <u>gospel</u> even to the "remotest part of the earth" (Acts 1:8). To this day this <u>ministry</u> of spreading the <u>gospel</u> message, and making <u>Messianic disciples</u> (Matt. 28:19-20) continues. Please note that this dynamic ministry is <u>not</u> being accomplished by those who are focused on the keeping of the covenant of the Law, but by *New Covenant* believers who are empowered and led by the indwelling Spirit of God \rightarrow

- → *Who* gives us "life" through a spiritual <u>birth</u>, and spiritual <u>renewal</u> (John 1:12-13) (Titus 3:5-6) (Ephesians 2:4-6)
- → Who indwells all believers

Or do you not know that **your body** is a **temple** of the **Holy Spirit** who is **in you**, whom you have **from God**, and that you are **not your own?**

For you have been **bought** with a **price**: therefore **glorify God** in your **body**. (I Corinthians 6:19-20)

→ Who baptizes believers into the body of Messiah

For by **one Spirit** we were all **baptized** into **one body**, whether **Jews** or **Greeks**, whether **slaves** or **free**, and we were all made to drink of **one Spirit**. (I Corinthians 12:13)

→ Who sanctifies believers

Peter, an apostle of Jesus the Messiah, to those...
who are *chosen* according to the **foreknowledge** of **God**,
by the *sanctifying work* of the <u>Spirit</u>,
to obey Jesus the Messiah and be sprinkled with His blood:.. (I Peter 1:1-2)

→ *Who* brings about our **adoption as <u>sons</u>**, and *affirms* to us **inwardly** that we are <u>sons</u> and <u>children</u> of God

For you have **not** received a **spirit of slavery** leading to **fear again**, but you have received a **spirit of adoption** as **sons** by which we cry out, "**Abba! Father!**"

The <u>Spirit</u> Himself testifies with our spirit that we are <u>children</u> of God, (Romans 8:15-16)

→ *Who* "spiritually circumcises" the *hearts* of believers

For he is not a **Jew** who is one **outwardly**, nor is **circumcision** that which is **outward** in the **flesh**.

But he is **a Jew** who is one *inwardly*; and **circumcision** is that which is of the <u>heart</u>, by the <u>Spirit</u>, *not* by the <u>letter</u>; and his **praise** is not from **men**, but from **God**. (Romans 2:28-29)

→ Who empowers believers to do the work of the ministry (Acts 1:8)

I (Paul) was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling, and my message and my preaching were <u>not</u> in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the <u>Spirit</u> and of <u>power</u>,

so that **your faith** would not **rest** on the **wisdom of men**, but on the **power of God**. (I Corinthians 2:3-5)

→ Who intercedes for believers when we struggle in prayer

In the same way **the <u>Spirit</u>** also **helps** our **weakness**; for we do **not know** how to <u>pray</u> as we should, but the **Spirit Himself** *intercedes* for *us* with **groanings** too deep for **words**;

and **He** who **searches the hearts** knows what the **mind** of **the Spirit** is, because **He intercedes** for the **saints** according to **the will of God**. (Romans 8:26-27)

- → Who writes upon the hearts of believers, making them a "letter" of testimony to the world
- ...being manifested that **you (believers)** are a *letter* **of Messiah**, cared for by us, *written not* with **ink** but with the <u>Spirit</u> of the <u>living God</u>, *not* on tablets of **stone** but on tablets of **human** <u>hearts</u>. (II Corinthians 3:3)
- → *Who* manifests **His** "fruit" in our lives— the characteristics of godliness and righteousness

Now the **deeds** of the **flesh** are evident...
But the **fruit** of the **Spirit** is **love**, **joy**, **peace**, **patience**, **kindness**, **goodness**, **faithfulness**, **gentleness**, **self-control**; against such things there is **no law**. (Galatians 5:19a, 22-23)

→ Who enables believers to walk <u>righteously</u> through the <u>presence</u> and <u>power</u> of the <u>indwelling Spirit</u>.

But if the <u>Spirit</u> of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells *in you*,

He who raised Messiah Jesus from the dead will also give <u>life</u>
to your mortal bodies *through* <u>His Spirit</u> who dwells *in you* (Rom.:8:11).
