The *Law* and the **Believer**

I. The **Mosaic Law Defined**

The written or Mosaic Law was a conditional covenant established by God with Israel. According to Jewish tradition, and the New Testament, Moses received the Law by means of angels (Acts 7:53, Galatians 3:19, Hebrews 2:2).

The **Law** promised **life** and **blessing** if **obeyed**, but **cursing** and **judgment** if not **fully obeyed** (Deuteronomy 28:1-2, 15). It expressed the **righteous will of God**, and served to set **Israel apart** from other **nations**. The **Law** provided the means by which **Israel** could **approach** and **worship** before a **holy God**, whose **presence** would now be **among them** (Exodus 25:8-9). The "Law" is a **unit** of <u>613 laws</u> that can be separated into **three basic divisions**, each essential to the other:

The Commandments—expressing the righteous will of God
The Judgments—governing the social life of Israel
The Ordinances—governing the religious life of Israel

II. The Law and the Messiah

A. Messiah's *Embrace* of the Law

1. **He** was born a **Jew** *under* the **Law**

But when the *fullness* of time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a *woman*, born under the Law, (Galatians 4:4)

And when the days for their (Mary's) purification according to the <u>Law of Moses</u> were completed, they brought **Him (Jesus)** up to **Jerusalem** to **present Him** to **the Lord**... (Luke 2:22)

2. **He fended off** the *temptations* of <u>Satan</u> using the <u>command</u>ments of the Law (Matthew 4:4-10).

He (Messiah) answered (the **devil)** and said, "It is **written,** 'Man shall **not live** on **bread alone**...(Deut. 8:3)"

'You shall **not** put the **LORD your God** to the **test** (Deut. 6:16)."

'You shall worship the LORD your God, and serve Him only (Deut. 6:13)."

3. **He used** the <u>Law</u> of Moses to *defend* His ministry on the <u>Sabbath day</u>.

Departing from there, **He (Messiah)** went into their **synagogue**.

And a man was there whose hand was withered. And they questioned Jesus, asking, "Is it lawful to heal on the <u>Sabbath</u>?"—so that they might accuse Him.

And **He** said to them, *"What man is there among you who has a **sheep**, and if it **falls** into **a pit** on the **Sabbath**, will he not take hold of it and **lift it out?**How much more **valuable** then is **a man** than **a sheep!**So then, it is **lawful** to **do good** on the **Sabbath**."

Then **He** said to the man, "Stretch out **your hand!**"
He stretched it out, and it was **restored to normal**, like the other.
(Matthew 12:9-14, *Deuteronomy 22:4)

4. **He taught** from the <u>Law</u> what **He knew** were its **great** <u>commandments</u>.

One of them, a **lawyer**, asked **Him (Jesus)** a question, **testing Him**, "**Teacher**, which is the **great** commandment in the **Law**?"

And **He** said to him,
" 'YOU SHALL **LOVE THE LORD** YOUR **GOD** WITH ALL YOUR **HEART,**AND WITH ALL YOUR **SOUL**, AND WITH ALL YOUR **MIND.**'

"This is the **great and foremost <u>commandment</u>**. The **second** is like it, 'YOU SHALL <u>LOVE</u> YOUR NEIGHBOR AS *YOURSELF*."

"On these **two <u>commandments</u>** depend the **whole <u>Law</u>** and the **Prophets**."

(Matthew 22:35-40, Deuteronomy 6:5)

5. After miraculously <u>healing</u> a leper, He instructed him to *go* to the priests, and fulfill what was required by the <u>Law</u>.

And a **leper** came to **Him (Messiah)** and **bowed down** before **Him**, and said, "Lord, if You are *willing*, You can make me <u>clean</u>."

Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed."

And immediately his leprosy was cleansed.

And **Jesus** said to him, "See that you tell **no one**; but go, show yourself to the **priest** and **present the <u>offering</u>** that <u>Moses commanded</u>, as a **testimony** to them." (Matthew 8:2-4, Leviticus 13:49, 14:2)

6. **He** appealed to the <u>Law</u> to establish the <u>truthfulness</u> of **His testimony**.

"Even in <u>your law</u> it has been *written* that the **testimony of** *two* men is <u>true</u>.

I am He who *testifies* about Myself, and the Father who sent Me *testifies* about Me."

(John 8:17-18, Deuteronomy 17:6, 19:15)

7. **He affirmed His Messiahship** and **Ministry** from the **Law** and the **Prophets**.

Then **beginning** with **Moses** and with **all** the **prophets**, **He (Jesus)** explained to them the **things** concerning **Himself** in **all** the **Scriptures**.

(Luke 24:27)

B. Messiah's *Emphasis* on having an "inward" <u>righteousness</u> that exceeded that of "external" Law-keeping.

"For I say to you that unless **your righteousness** <u>surpasses</u> that of the scribes and **Pharisees**, you will <u>not</u> enter the kingdom of heaven."

(Matthew 5:20)

"You have heard that the **ancients** were told, 'YOU SHALL **NOT COMMIT <u>MURDER</u>**' and '**Whoever** commits **murder** shall be **liable** to the **court**.'

But *I say* to you that everyone who is **angry** with **his brother** shall be **guilty** before the **court**;...(Matthew 5:21-22a)

"You have heard that it was said, 'YOU SHALL **NOT COMMIT <u>ADULTERY</u>'**; but *I say* to you that everyone who **looks** at a woman with *lust* for her has already **committed** <u>adultery</u> with her in <u>his heart</u>. (Matthew 5:27-28)

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!
For you tithe mint and dill and cumin,
and have neglected the weightier matters of the law;
justice and mercy and faithfulness; but these are the things
you should have done without neglecting the others." (Matthew 23:23)

Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!

For you are like whitewashed tombs which on the <u>outside</u> appear beautiful, but <u>inside</u> they are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness.

So you, too, <u>outwardly</u> appear righteous to men, but <u>inwardly</u> you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness. (Matthew 23:27-28)

And **He (Jesus)** said to them,..

Do you not understand that whatever goes <u>into</u> the **man** from the **outside** cannot **defile** him, because it does **not go** into <u>his heart</u>, but into his **stomach**, and is **eliminated?**" (*Thus* **He** declared **all foods clean**.)

And **He** was saying, "That which proceeds <u>out</u> of the man, that is what **defiles** the **man**.

For from <u>within</u>, out of the <u>heart</u> of men, proceed evil thoughts, fornications, thefts, murders, adulteries, deeds of coveting and wickedness, as well as deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride and foolishness.

All these evil things proceed from <u>within</u> and <u>defile</u> the man." (Mark 7:18-23)

C. Messiah's *Expressed* intent→not to "abolish" the <u>Law</u> and the <u>Prophets</u>, but to "fulfill" them.

"Do **not** think that I came to **abolish** the Law or the Prophets; I did **not** come to **abolish** but to fulfill.

For truly I say to you, until **heaven** and **earth** pass away, **not** the smallest **letter** or **stroke shall pass** from the <u>Law</u> until **all is accomplished**." (Matthew 5:17-18)

D. Messiah's Establishment of a New Covenant

And when **He (Jesus)** had taken *some* **bread** *and* given **thanks**, **He broke it** and gave it to them, saying,

"This is *My body* which is **given** for **you**; **do this** in **remembrance of Me**."

And in the same way *He took* **the cup** after they had eaten, saying, "**This cup** which is **poured out** for you is the <u>new covenant</u> in <u>My blood</u>. (Luke 22:19-20) (Jeremiah 31:31)

Expanded Study → As *Believers*, We are under a New Covenant *in* Messiah

- A. A **New Covenant** *promised* to <u>Israel</u> (Jeremiah 31:31-34)
- B. A **New Covenant** *inaugurated* through the **Messiah's** <u>death</u> (Luke 22:19-20)
- C. A **New Covenant** *based* on "better promises," whose blessings are given to *all* who <u>believe</u>:

Not that **we (Paul)** are **adequate** in ourselves to consider anything as *coming* from **ourselves**, but our **adequacy** is *from God*,

who also made us **adequate** as servants of a **new covenant**, **not** of the **letter** but of the **Spirit**; for the **letter kills**, but the **Spirit gives life**. (II Corinthians 3:5-6)

Now if **He (Jesus)** were on **earth**, **He** would **not** be **a priest** at all, since there are **those** who offer the gifts according to **the** <u>Law</u>; who serve a **copy** and **shadow** of the **heavenly things**,

just as **Moses** was **warned by God** when he was about to erect the **tabernacle**; for, "SEE," **He** says, "THAT YOU **MAKE all things**ACCORDING TO THE **PATTERN** WHICH WAS **SHOWN YOU** ON THE **MOUNTAIN."**

But now **He** has obtained a **more** *excellent* **ministry**, by as much as **He** is also the *mediator* of a <u>better covenant</u>, which has been **enacted** on **better promises**. (Hebrews 8:4-6)
