# III. The Mosaic Law, the New Covenant, and the Believer—a <u>Summary</u>

- As *believers*, (both Jews and Gentiles) we have become partakers of the spiritual blessings and promises of the <u>New Covenant</u> (Hebrews 8:6, 9:15) (Ephesians 1:3)
- As Jewish *believers*, we were once bound by a covenant relationship to obey all that was written in the Mosaic Law (Galatians 3:10). However, according to the <u>New Covenant</u>, we have now "<u>died</u>" to the covenant of the Law, *through* the body of Messiah, and are no longer under its jurisdiction (Romans 7:1-6)

Therefore, my brethren, you also were made to <u>die</u> to the Law through the body of Messiah, so that you might be joined to another, to <u>Him</u> who was raised from the dead, in order that we might bear fruit for God...(Romans 7:4)

As New Covenant *believers*, we have been "released" from the Law, to now serve the Lord "in *newness* of the <u>Spirit</u> and not in the *oldness* of the <u>letter</u> (the Law) (Rom. 7:6)."

But **now** we have been *released* from the <u>Law</u>, having <u>died</u> to that by which we were *bound*, so that we serve in *newness* of the <u>Spirit</u> and not in *oldness* of the <u>letter</u> (the Law) (Romans 7:6).

4. As **New Covenant** *believers*, when we placed our **faith** and **trust** in <u>Jesus</u> as our **Savior**, we received a "spiritual" birth (John 1:12-13:5-6) from the <u>Spirit</u> of God who now <u>indwells</u> all believers (Romans 8:9, I Cor. 6:19).

**Messiah** promised that it would be the <u>Spirit</u> of God that would now *comfort*, *teach*, and *guide* them into all truth (John 14:16-20, 26, 16:13). It would be by the work of the indwelling <u>Spirit</u> of God that they would be *baptized* into the body of Messiah (I Cor. 12:13), *sanctified* (I Peter 1:1-2), *adopted* as sons (Rom. 8:15-16), *"circumcised"* in their hearts (Rom. 2:28-28), and *empowered* for service (Acts 1:8, I Cor. 2:3-5).

When *believers* live lives that are <u>led</u> by the <u>Spirit</u>, they manifest the *fruit* of the <u>Spirit</u>, the fruit of "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; *against* such things there is <u>no law</u> (Gal. 5:18, 22-23)."

### IV. The Mosaic Law—A New Testament

#### Perspective

A. The Covenant of the Law and the Covenant of Promise—

Before the **covenant of the <u>Law</u>**, **God** had given to **Abraham** and his **descendants** what has been called the **Abrahamic covenant**, or **covenant of** <u>**Promise**</u> (Genesis 12:1-3). Unlike the **Law**, the **covenant of** <u>**Promise**</u> was *unconditional*, for **God** <u>**promised**</u> **Abraham**:

- → that **He** would make **Abraham** a **<u>great nation</u>**,
- → that He would bless Abraham and make his name great,
- → that he (Abraham) would be a <u>blessing</u>,
- → that He would <u>bless</u> those who <u>bless</u> Abraham, and <u>curse</u> those who <u>curse</u> Abraham,
- → and that "<u>in</u> Abraham (his seed) all the families of the earth would be <u>blessed</u> (Genesis 12:1-3)

According to the **New Testament**, the **"seed"** that would <u>bless</u> all nations is **Jesus the Messiah**, whose **death** and **resurrection** would bring <u>salvation</u> and <u>eternal life</u> to "*all* families of the earth." These promises are given to *all* who <u>believe</u> and have <u>faith</u> in Jesus the Messiah.

"For **God** so *loved* the world, that **He** *gave* **His only begotten Son**, that whoever <u>believes</u> in **Him** shall *not perish*, but have <u>eternal life</u> (John 3:16

For I am **not ashamed** of the **gospel**, for it is the **power of God** for **salvation** to everyone who **believes**, to the **Jew** first and also to the **Greek** (Romans 1:16).

Even so Abraham BELIEVED GOD.

AND IT WAS <u>RECKONED</u> TO HIM AS **RIGHTEOUSNESS.** Therefore, be sure that it is those who are of **faith** who are **sons of Abraham**.

The **Scripture**, foreseeing that **God** would <u>justify</u> the **Gentiles by** <u>faith</u>, preached the <u>gospel</u> beforehand to **Abraham**, *saying*, "ALL THE **NATIONS** WILL BE <u>BLESSED IN YOU</u>." So then those who are of <u>faith</u> are <u>blessed</u> with **Abraham**, the *believer*. (Galatians 3:6-9)

B. The Law could not declare a man Righteous and Justified before God

Now we know that whatever the <u>Law</u> says, it speaks to those who are **under the** <u>Law</u>, so that **every mouth** may be **closed** and all the **world** may become **accountable to God**;

because by the *works* of the <u>Law</u> *no flesh* will be <u>justified</u> in His sight; for *through* the <u>Law</u> *comes* the *knowledge* of <u>sin</u>.

But now *apart* from the <u>Law</u> the righteousness of God has been manifested, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, even the righteousness of God through <u>faith</u> in Jesus the Messiah for *all* those who <u>believe</u>; for there is no distinction; (Romans 3:19-22) C. The *Purposes* of the <u>Law</u>—{New Testament Perspective}

 $\rightarrow$  1. The *Law* reveals the <u>Righteous</u> character and <u>Will</u> of God

So then, the <u>Law</u> is *holy*, and the <u>commandment</u> is *holy* and *righteous* and *good* (Romans 7:12).

All Scripture is *inspired by God* and profitable for *teaching,* for *reproof*, for *correction*, for *training* in <u>*righteousness*</u>; so that the **man of God** may be adequate, **equipped** for every **good work** (II Timothy 3:16-17).

→2. The *Law*, which came 430 years after the covenant of Promise, was added to Restrain sin and transgression

Why the Law then? It was added because of transgressions, (Galatians 3:19a)

 $\rightarrow$  3. The *Law* gives <u>Knowledge of Sin</u>

...for *through* the <u>Law</u> comes the *knowledge* of <u>sin</u> (Rom. 3:20b).

What shall we say then?...I would **not** have come to **know sin** *except* through **the** <u>Law</u>; for I would **not** have known about **coveting** if the <u>Law</u> had **not said**, "YOU SHALL **NOT COVET**." (Romans 7:7a, c)

 $\rightarrow$ 4. The *Law* served as a "Tutor," *leading us* to <u>Faith</u> in Messiah

But **before** *faith* came, we were **kept in custody** under the <u>law</u>, being **shut up** to the *faith* which was **later** to be **revealed**.

Therefore the <u>Law</u> has become our <u>tutor</u> to *lead us* to Messiah, so that we may be *justified* by <u>faith</u>. (Galatians 3:23-24)

→5. The *Law* caused <u>Transgression</u> to increase, but *through* Messiah we receive <u>Grace</u>

For if by the **transgression** of the **one (Adam)**, **death** *reigned* through the **one**, *much more* those who receive the abundance of <u>grace</u> and of the gift of <u>righteousness</u> will *reign* in life through the **One**, Jesus The Messiah.

> The <u>Law</u> came in so that the <u>transgression</u> would *increase*; but where *sin increased*, <u>grace</u> abounded all the more, so that, as <u>sin reigned</u> in death, even so <u>grace</u> would reign *through* righteousness to *eternal life through* Jesus the Messiah our Lord. (Romans 5:17, 20-21)

For the <u>Law</u> was *given* through **Moses**; <u>grace</u> and <u>truth</u> were *realized* through Jesus the Messiah. (John 1:17)

**D.** The <u>Law</u> is revealed as a Ministry of <u>Condemnation</u>, with a "fading" *glory*, compared to the New Covenant's more *glorious* Ministry of <u>Righteousness</u>

For if the **ministry of** *condemnation* (the Law) has *glory*, much more does the **ministry of** *righteousness* (New covenant) abound in *glory*. (II Cor. 3:9)

E. The Law is Holy, Righteous, and Good, but could make nothing "Perfect"

For the <u>Law</u>, since it has *only* a *shadow* of the good things to come and not the very form of things, can *never*, by the same sacrifices which they offer continually year by year, make <u>perfect</u> those who draw near.

Otherwise, would they not have *ceased* to be offered, because the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have had *consciousness* of sins?...

For by **one offering He** (Messiah) has <u>perfected</u> for *all time* those who are **sanctified**. (Hebrews 10:1-2, 14)

#### **Closing Summary/Exhortation**

As *believers*, we have embraced the **New Covenant in Messiah**, and have been freed from the **jurisdiction** of the Covenant of **the Law**. We have been **"released"** to now **serve God** in **"newness** of the <u>Spirit</u> and **not** in **oldness** of the <u>letter</u> (the <u>Law</u>)" (Romans 7:6).

However, the **New Covenant** also has numerous **laws, instructions**, and **principles**; many of them **found** in the **Mosaic Law**. Much of the <u>righteousness</u> of the <u>Law</u> is **contained** in the **teachings** and **instructions** of the <u>New Testament</u>. Nine of the **Ten Commandments** are specifically **found** in the **scriptures** of the **New Testament**.

As *believers* we are not "*under* <u>law</u> but *under* <u>grace</u> (Rom. 6:14)." However, we are <u>not</u> to sin that "<u>grace</u> may abound." Instead, we are to consider ourselves "<u>dead</u> to sin, but <u>alive</u> to God" *in* Messiah, and are to present the members of our body as "instruments of <u>righteousness</u>." (Rom. 6:11, 13)

As *believers*, we are now serving God in "*newness* of the <u>Spirit</u>," who now indwells us. We are seeking to <u>walk</u> *according* to the <u>Spirit</u>, and manifest His *fruits* of righteousness in our lives (Gal. 5:22-23). We are not under the <u>Law</u> of Moses, but are following the "<u>Law</u> of Messiah," which can be summarized by Jesus' command to "<u>love</u> one another, even as I have <u>loved</u> you, that you also <u>love</u> one another (John 13:34)." In the New Testament we read that "the whole Law is *fulfilled* in one word, in the *statement*, "YOU SHALL <u>LOVE</u> YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF (Galatians 5:14)."

As **New Covenant believers**, we walk in a "**new** and *living* **way** (Heb.10:20)," being **transformed** *inwardly* through the <u>work</u> of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> (Rom. 12:2), and are being *conformed* in our **person** to the very <u>image</u> of the **Son of God** (Rom. 8:29).
