# The Messiah and the Adulteress

(John 8:1-11)

# A. The **<u>Teacher</u>** (8:1-2)

But **Jesus** went to the **Mount of Olives**.

Early in the morning He came **again** to the **temple**, and all the **people** were **coming to Him**; and **He sat down** and *began* to **teach** them.

## B. The <u>Test</u> (8:3-6)

The **scribes** and the **Pharisees** brought a **woman** caught in **adultery**, and having set her in the **midst**, they said to **Him**,

"Teacher, this woman has been caught in adultery, in the very act.

Now in the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women;

what then do You say?"

They were saying this, testing Him, so that they might have grounds for accusing Him.

But Jesus stooped down and with His finger wrote on the ground.

# C. The **Tactful Response** (8:7-8)

But when they **persisted** in asking **Him**, **He** straightened up, and said to them,

"He who is <u>without sin</u> among you, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." Again **He** stooped down and wrote on the ground.

# D. The <u>Turnaround</u> of the <u>Accusers</u> (8:9)

When they **heard it**, they *began* to **go out one** by **one**, beginning with the **older ones**, and **He** was left **alone**, and the **woman**, where she was, in the **midst**.

# E. The **Tender Admonition** (8:10-11)

Straightening up, **Jesus** said to **her**, "Woman, where are they? Did *no one* condemn you?"

She said, "No one, Lord."
And Jesus said,
"Neither do I condemn you; go.
From now on sin no more."

# Summary Observations Jesus and the Adulteress— A *Portrait* of the Coming Messiah

1. According to the *Scriptures*, the **Messiah** would be a <u>Teacher</u>.

Now it will come about that in the last days
the mountain of the house of the LORD will be established
as the *chief* of the mountains, and will be raised *above* the hills;
and all the nations will stream to it.

And many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that He may teach us concerning His ways and that we may walk in His paths."

For the law will go forth from Zion and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. (Isaiah 2:2-3)

"In the future the **Holy One**, blessed be **He**, will seat the <u>Messiah</u> in the supernal **Yeshiva** (House of **Study**), and they will call him "the Lord," just as they call the **Creator**...

And the **Messiah** will sit in the **Yeshiva**, and all those who walk on **earth** will come and **sit** before him to hear a **new Tora** and **new commandments** and the **deep wisdom** which **he <u>teaches</u> Israel..."**(**Yemenite Midrash**, pp. 349-50, **The Messiah Texts**, Raphael Patai, pp. 256-257)

Now there was a man of the **Pharisees**, named **Nicodemus**, a **ruler** of the **Jews**; this man came to **Jesus** by night and said to Him,

"Rabbi, we know that You have come from God as a teacher; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

(John 3:1-2)

2. According to the *Scriptures*, the **Messiah** would have a **ministry characterized** by **Wisdom**.

Then a **shoot** will spring from the **stem of Jesse**, and a **branch** from his **roots** will **bear fruit**.

The **Spirit** of **the LORD** will **rest on Him**,

the **spirit** of **wisdom** and **understanding**, the **spirit** of **counsel** and **strength** the **spirit** of **knowledge** and **fear** of **the LORD**. (Isaiah 11:1-2) -----

He (Jesus) came to His hometown and began teaching them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished, and said, "Where did this man get this wisdom and these miraculous powers?

(Matthew 13:54)

3. According to the *Scriptures*, the **Messiah** would have a **ministry characterized** by **Compassion** and **Mercy**.

The **Spirit** of the **Lord GOD** is upon **me**, because the **LORD** has **anointed me**, to bring **good news** to the **afflicted**; **He** has sent me to **bind up** the **brokenhearted**, to proclaim **liberty** to the **captives** and **freedom** to **prisoners**; to proclaim the **favorable year** of the **LORD**... to **comfort** all who **mourn**,.. (Isaiah 61:1-2)

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When **Jesus** went ashore, **He** saw a **large crowd**, and **He felt <u>compassion</u>** for them because they were like **sheep without** a **shepherd**; and **He** began to **teach** them many things. (Mark 6:34)

"For the **Law** was given through **Moses**; **grace** and **truth** were **realized** through **Jesus the Messiah**." (John 1:17)

4. According to the *Scriptures*, the **Messiah** would be **characterized** by **Righteousness**.

"Behold, *the* days are coming," declares the LORD,

"When I will raise up for David a <u>righteous</u> Branch;

And He will reign as king and act wisely

And do justice and <u>righteousness</u> in the land. (Jeremiah 23:5)

Then a **shoot** will spring from the **stem of Jesse**, and a **branch** from **his roots** will **bear fruit**.

The **Spirit** of **the LORD** will **rest on** <u>Him</u>,..

...and **He** will **not judge** by what **His eyes see**, nor make a **decision** by what **His ears hear**; but with **righteousness He** will **judge the poor**, and decide with **fairness** for the **afflicted** of the **earth**; (Isaiah 11:1, 3-4)

And **Jesus** said (to the **adulteress**), "**Neither do I condemn you**; go. From now on **sin no more**." (John 8:11)

The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified His servant Jesus, the one whom you delivered and disowned in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release Him.

But **you disowned** the **Holy** and **Righteous One** and asked for a **murderer** to be granted to you, (Acts 3:13-14)

# Personal Application

# So *who* can we **relate to** in this text tonight? → The **adulterous woman**. Like her, **we too** have been:

#### → Arraigned as an "Adulterer"

You <u>adulteresses</u>, do you not know that **friendship** with the **world** is **hostility toward God**?...(James 4:4a)

And <u>you</u> were *dead* in your trespasses and sins, in which <u>you</u> formerly walked according to the **course of this world**, according to the <u>prince</u> of the **power of the air**, of the **spirit** that is now working in the **sons of disobedience** (Ephesians 2:1-2)

#### → *Accused* by **powerful** <u>Adversaries</u>

Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, saying,
"Now the salvation, and the power, and the kingdom of our God
and the authority of His Messiah have come,
for the accuser of our brethren has been thrown down,
he who accuses them before our God day and night."

(Revelation 12:10)

## → *Acquitted* by a divine <u>Advocate</u>

My little children, I am writing these things to **you** so that **you** may **not sin**. And if **anyone sins**, we have an **Advocate** with the **Father**, **Jesus the Messiah** the **righteous**; and **He Himself** is the **propitiation** for our **sins**;.. (I John 2:1-2a)

#### → Admonished to walk in Righteousness

Now flee from youthful lusts and pursue <u>righteousness</u>, faith, love and peace, with those who call on the Lord with a pure heart. (II Timothy 2:22)
