C. The *Beginning* of **Deliverance**— The **Call** of **Moses** (Part 1)

1. A "Marvelous" Sight (3:1-6)

3 Now Moses was pasturing the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian; and he led the flock to the west side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God.

²The **angel of the LORD appeared** to him in a **blazing fire** from the **midst** of a **bush**; and he looked, and behold, the **bush** was **burning with fire**, yet the **bush** was **not consumed**.

³ So **Moses** said, "I must *turn aside* now and **see** this <u>marvelous sight</u>, *why* the **bush** is <u>not</u> burned up."

⁴ When the **LORD saw** that he **turned aside** to **look**, **God** called to him from the **midst** of the **bush** and said, "**Moses, Moses!**" And he said, "**Here I am.**" ⁵ Then **He said**,

"Do **not** come **near** here; **remove** your **sandals** from your feet, for the **place** on which you are standing is **holy ground**."

⁶ He said also, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob."

Then Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.

2. A *Mission* Decreed (3:7-10)

⁷ The LORD said, "I have surely seen the affliction of My people who are in Egypt, and have given heed to their cry because of their taskmasters, for I am aware of their sufferings.

⁸ So I have come down to <u>deliver them</u> from the power of the Egyptians, and to bring them up from that land to a good and spacious land, to a land flowing with milk and honey, to the place of the Canaanite and the Hittite and the Amorite and the Perizzite and the Hivite and the Jebusite.

⁹ Now, behold, the **cry** of the **sons of Israel** has **come to Me**; furthermore, **I have seen** the **oppression** with which the **Egyptians** are **oppressing** them.

¹⁰ Therefore, come now, and I will <u>send you</u> to **Pharaoh**,

so that you may bring My people, the sons of Israel, out of Egypt."

3. A Misgiving Expressed (3:11-12)

¹¹ But **Moses** said **to God**, "<u>Who am I</u>, that I should go to **Pharaoh**, and that I should **bring** the **sons of Israel out** of **Egypt?**"

¹² And **He said**, "Certainly **I will be with you**, and this shall be the **sign** to you that it is I who have **sent you**: when **you have brought** the people **out** of **Egypt**, you shall **worship God** at **this mountain**."

4. A *Matchless* Name Revealed (3:13-15)

¹³ Then **Moses** said to **God**, "Behold, I am going to the **sons of Israel**, and I will say to them, 'The **God** of **your fathers** has **sent me** to you.' Now they may say to me, 'What is <u>His name</u>?' What shall I say to them?"

¹⁴ God said to Moses, "<u>I AM WHO I AM</u>"; and He said, "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, '<u>I AM</u> has sent me to you."

¹⁵ God, furthermore, said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, '<u>The LORD</u>, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.' This is <u>My name</u> forever, and this is My memorial-name to all generations.

5. A *Miraculous* Deliverance Predicted (3:16-22)

¹⁶ Go and gather the elders of Israel together and say to them,
'The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, has appeared to me, saying, "I am indeed concerned about you and what has been done to you in Egypt.

¹⁷ So I said, I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt to the land of the Canaanite and the Hittite and the Amorite and the Perizzite and the Hivite and the Jebusite, to a land flowing with milk and honey."

¹⁸ They will pay heed to what you say; and you with the elders of Israel will come to the king of Egypt and you will say to him, 'The LORD, the God of the Hebrews, has met with us. So now, please, let us go a three days' journey into the wilderness, that we may sacrifice to the LORD our God.'

¹⁹ But I know that the king of Egypt will <u>not</u> permit you to go, except under *compulsion*. ²⁰ So I will stretch out My hand and strike Egypt with all My <u>miracles</u> which I shall do in the midst of it; and *after that* he will let you go.

²¹ I will grant this people <u>favor</u> in the sight of the Egyptians; and it shall be that when you go, you will <u>not</u> go empty-handed.
²² But every woman shall ask of her neighbor and the woman who lives

in her house, articles of silver and articles of gold, and clothing; and you will put them on your sons and daughters. Thus you will plunder the Egyptians."

Summary Observations → Exodus Chapter 3 gives us "Glimpses" of the Nature and Character of God

Closing Commentary

The God of Israel {YHVH}, has revealed to us another important personal name, the name of His Son, Jesus the Messiah

A. A *Name* that was **named** while **in the womb** of **His mother**

Listen to Me, O islands, and pay attention, you peoples from afar.

The LORD called Me from the womb;

from the body of My mother He named Me.

(Isaiah 49:1)

The **angel** (**Gabriel**) said to her (**Miriam**),...

"And behold you will **conceive in your womb** and **bear a son**, and you will **name Him Jesus (Yeshua)** (Luke 1:30a, 31)

B. A *Name* by which we receive **Salvation**

"And there is <u>salvation</u> in **no one else**; for there is **no** other <u>name</u> under heaven that has been given among men by which we must <u>be saved</u>." (Acts 4:12) (see also Acts 10:42-43, Rom. 10:9-10)

C. A *Name* by which we become children of God

But as many as **received Him**, to them He gave **the right** to become **children of God**, even to those who **believe in <u>His name</u>**, (John 1:12-13)

D. A *Name* that is <u>central</u> in our *life* and *walk* with <u>God</u>

→our words—our deeds—our prayers

Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father (Colossians 3:17)
(see also John 14:13-14, 16:23-24, Eph. 5:20)

E. A *Name* that has been <u>exalted</u> "above every name"

Therefore also **God** *highly exalted* **Him** (**Jesus**), and **bestowed on Him the name** which is **above every name**, (Philippians 2:9)

F. A Name that glorifies God the Father, the God of Israel

...so that at the <u>name of Jesus</u> EVERY KNEE WILL **BOW**, of those who are in *heaven* and on *earth* and *under* the earth, and every tongue will **confess** that **Jesus the Messiah is Lord**, to the <u>glory of God the Father</u>. (Philippians 2:10-11)

G. A *Name* by which we receive <u>revilement</u> and <u>glory</u>

If you are <u>reviled</u> for the <u>name</u> of Messiah, you are blessed, because the **Spirit of glory** and **of God** rests on you.

(I Peter 4:14)
