## <u>Torah Portion</u> "Nasso"—"Lift Up" (Numbers 4:21-7:89)

## The <u>**Ritual</u>** for a **Woman** *suspected* of **Adultery** (5:11-31)</u>

<sup>11</sup> Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying,
 <sup>12</sup> "Speak to the sons of Israel and say to them,
 'If any man's wife goes astray and is unfaithful to him,
 <sup>13</sup> and a man has intercourse with her
 and it is <u>hidden</u> from the eyes of her husband
 and she is undetected, although she has defiled herself,
 and there is *no witness* against her and she has *not* been caught in the act,

<sup>14</sup> if a <u>spirit of jealousy</u> comes over him and he is <u>jealous</u> of his wife when she has defiled herself, or if a <u>spirit of jealousy</u> comes over him and he is <u>jealous</u> of his wife when she has *not* defiled herself,

<sup>15</sup> the man shall then bring his wife to the priest, and shall bring as an offering for her one-tenth of an ephah of barley meal; he shall <u>not</u> pour oil on it nor put frankincense on it, for it is a grain offering of <u>jealousy</u>, a grain offering of memorial, a reminder of <u>iniquity</u>.

<sup>16</sup> 'Then the priest shall bring her near and have her stand before the LORD,
 <sup>17</sup> and the priest shall take holy water in an earthenware vessel;
 and he shall take some of the <u>dust</u> that is on the floor of the tabernacle and put *it* into the water.

<sup>18</sup> The priest shall then have the woman stand before the LORD and let the hair of the woman's head go loose, and place the grain offering of memorial in her hands, which is the grain offering of jealousy, and in the hand of the priest is to be the water of bitterness that brings a <u>curse</u>. <sup>19</sup> The priest shall have her take an <u>oath</u> and shall say to the woman, "If no man has lain with you and if you have not gone astray into uncleanness, being under the authority of your husband, be <u>immune</u> to this water of bitterness that brings a <u>curse</u>;

<sup>20</sup> if you, however, have gone astray, being under the authority of your husband, and if you have defiled yourself and a man other than your husband has had intercourse with you"
<sup>21</sup> (then the priest shall have the woman swear with the <u>oath</u> of the <u>curse</u>, and the priest shall say to the woman),

"the LORD make you a <u>curse</u> and an oath among your people by the LORD'S making your thigh waste away and your abdomen swell;
<sup>22</sup> and this water that brings a <u>curse</u> shall go into your stomach, and make your abdomen swell and your thigh waste away." And the woman shall say, "Amen. Amen."

<sup>23</sup> 'The priest shall then write these curses on a scroll, and he shall wash them off into the water of bitterness.
<sup>24</sup> Then he shall make the woman drink the water of bitterness that brings a curse, so that the water which brings a curse will go into her and cause bitterness.

<sup>25</sup> The priest shall take the grain offering of <u>jealousy</u> from the woman's hand, and he shall wave the grain offering before the LORD and bring it to the altar;

<sup>26</sup> and the priest shall take a handful of the grain offering as its *memorial* offering and offer *it* up in smoke on the altar, and *afterward* he shall make the woman <u>drink</u> the water.

<sup>27</sup> When he has made her <u>drink</u> the water, then it shall come about, if she has *defiled* herself and has been *unfaithful* to her husband, that the water which brings a <u>curse</u> will go into her and *cause* bitterness, and her abdomen will swell and her thigh will waste away, and the woman will become a <u>curse</u> among her people.

<sup>28</sup> But if the woman has <u>not</u> defiled herself and is clean, she will then be free and conceive children.

<sup>29</sup> 'This is the **law of** <u>jealousy</u>: when a **wife**, *being* under *the* **authority** *of* her **husband**, goes **astray** and **defiles herself**,

<sup>30</sup> or when a spirit of <u>jealousy</u> comes over a man and he is <u>jealous</u> of his wife, he shall then make the woman stand before the LORD, and the priest shall apply all this <u>law</u> to her.

> <sup>31</sup> Moreover, the **man** will be **free** from *guilt,* but that **woman** shall *bear* her *guilt*."
