## Celebrating our Eternal "Covering"

#### Man's Need for God's Covering

{Biblical/Historical Overview}

#### God's Covering in Eden

The **LORD God commanded** the **man**, saying, "From **any tree** of the garden you **may eat freely**; but from the **tree** of the **knowledge of good and evil** you shall **not eat**, for in **the day** that you **eat** from it you shall **surely die**."...

When the **woman** saw that the tree was **good for** *food*, and that it was a **delight to the eyes**, and that the **tree** was desirable to **make** *one wise*, **she took** from its fruit and **ate**; and **she gave to her husband** with her, and **he ate**.

Then the **eyes of both** of them **were opened**, and **they knew** they were **naked**, and they **sewed fig leaves** together and **made themselves loin coverings**.

They heard the **sound** of the LORD God **walking** in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife <u>hid</u> themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.

Then the **LORD God** called to **the man**, and said to him, "Where are you?"

He said, "I heard the **sound** of **You** in the garden, and **I was a afraid** because **I was naked**; so **I hid myself**..."

The **LORD God made garments of skin** for **Adam** and **his wife**, and **clothed them.** (Genesis 2:16-17, 3:6-10, 21)

#### God's Covering of Noah

Then the **LORD** saw that the *wickedness* of man was great on the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually...

Then **God** said to **Noah**,

"The **end of all flesh** has come before **Me**; for the **earth is filled**with **violence** because of **them**; and behold, I am about
to **destroy them** with the **earth**.

Make for yourself an <u>ark</u> of **gopher wood**; and you shall make the **ark** with rooms, and shall **cover it inside** and **out** with **pitch**..."\*

\*(va'<u>kaphar</u>'tah ...... ba-<u>kopher)</u>
(literally, "and shall <u>cover it</u>......with <u>a covering</u>")

So they went *into* the <u>ark</u> to Noah,..

Those that entered, male and female of all flesh, entered as God had commanded him; and the LORD closed *it* behind him.

Then the **flood** came upon the earth for **forty days**, and the **water** increased and **lifted up the ark**, so that it **rose above the earth.** (Genesis 6:5, 13-14, 7:15-17)

#### God's Covering of Israel in Egypt

Now the LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt,...

"Speak to all the **congregation of Israel**, saying,
'On the **tenth** of **this month** (Nisan-April) they are each one to take **a lamb** for themselves, according to their fathers' households, **a lamb** for each household...

Your lamb shall be an unblemished male a year old; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats.

You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month, then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel is to kill it at twilight.

Moreover, they shall take some of the **blood** and put it on the **two doorposts** and on the **lintel** of **the houses** in which they **eat it** (the lamb)...

For I will go through the land of **Egypt** on that night, and will **strike down** all the **firstborn** in the land of **Egypt**, both **man and beast**; and **against all the gods** of Egypt I will **execute judgments—I am the LORD.** 

The <u>blood</u> shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live; and when I see the <u>blood</u> I will <u>pass over</u> you, and **no plague** will befall you to **destroy** you when I strike the land of **Egypt**. (Exodus 12:1, 3, 5-7, 12-13)

#### God's Covering in the Law

1. His Institution of an atonement through blood

"For the <u>life</u> of the flesh (for sacrifices) is in the <u>blood</u>, and I have given it to you on the altar to make atonement for your souls;

for it is **the <u>blood</u>** by reason of the <u>life</u> that makes <u>atonement.</u>" (Leviticus 17:11, Hebrews 9:22)

- 2. **His** *Institution* of the **laws of** <u>sacrifice</u> for a *continual* <u>covering (atonement)</u> of the **people** for sin
  - a. **Sacrifices offered** through the **Levitical Priesthood** (Leviticus 8:1-10:20)
  - b. **Sacrifices offered continuously** for **atonement** and **cleansing** (Leviticus 1:1-7:38) (Exodus 29:38-42) (Hebrews 10:11)
  - c. **Sacrifices offered yearly** on "<u>Yom Kippur</u>" (Day of Atonement) for both <u>national</u> and <u>individual sins</u> (Leviticus 16)

# God's <u>Eternal</u> Covering—through His <u>Messiah</u>

But when **Messiah** appeared as a **high priest** of the **good things** to come, **He entered** through the **greater** and more **perfect tabernacle**, not made with hands, that is to say, **not** of **this creation**; and **not** through the **blood** of **goats** and **calves**,

but through <u>His own blood</u>, He entered the holy place <u>once for all</u>, having obtained <u>eternal redemption</u>.

For the Law, since it has *only* a **shadow** of the **good things to come** *and* not the very **form** of things, can **never**, by the <u>same</u> <u>sacrifices</u> which they offer <u>continually</u> year by year, <u>make <u>perfect</u> those who draw near...

But in **those** <u>sacrifices</u> there is a <u>reminder</u> of <u>sins</u> year by year.</u>

For it is *impossible* for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins...

And every priest stands <u>daily</u> ministering and offering time after time the <u>same</u> sacrifices, which can *never* <u>take away sins</u>; but **He** (Jesus), having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time,

SAT DOWN AT THE **RIGHT HAND OF GOD**,...
For by **one offering He** has **perfected** for **all time** those who are **sanctified**. (Hebrews 9:11-12, 10:1, 3-4, 11-12, 14)

Discussion Question...
Without a *Temple, Priesthood*, and *Sacrifices*, how do the **Jewish people <u>presently</u>** receive an **atonement/covering** for **sins**?

#### Answer↓

The **destruction** of the **second Temple** brought <u>an end</u> to **Yom Kippur service** as **practiced** in the <u>Temple</u>,..

But Yom Kippur did not lose its importance in Jewish life...

...its importance grew outside the Temple...

There was no longer a special Temple service nor a high priest to act as intermediary between man and God.

But Jews continued to observe the day, without any intermediary, addressing themselves directly to God through prayers and confessions.

Characteristic of the **Jews** in Palestine to **Yom Kippur after** the **destruction** of the **Temple** is the following **tale** from the **Talmud:** 

Rabbi Jochanan ben Zakkai, together with his pupil, Rabbi Joshua, once stood gazing at the ruins of the Temple. And Rabbi Joshua said, "Woe to us, that the place where the Jews were forgiven for their sins is destroyed." To which Rabbi Jochanan answered, "My son, regret it not. We have another medium, just as good, for the forgiveness of sin. It is:

Do good to mankind. For it is written: 'I desire mercy and not sacrifice.' "

How then does a man find **forgiveness** when he does **sin**? **After** the **second Temple** was destroyed in **70 A.D.**, **Judaism** was **restructured** to be a **religion without a sacrifice**.

Jewish leaders and scholars put a premium upon the Great Three as the atonement for sin: Repentance, Prayer, and Good Deeds. When one did wrong, he sought repentance, prayed for forgiveness, and then made a practice of following his good inclinations so as to do what is helpful and commendable in the moral, political, social, and economic areas of life.
