# Yom Kippur Being Restored to a Holy God

I. **Definition - Yom Kippur—Day** of <u>Atonement</u>, "Day of <u>Covering</u>"—From the Hebrew verb→"Kapar"—to cover over, atone, propitiate, pacify

Atonement - a "covering," a ransom, a payment for our sins

II. The *Need* for the **Day of** Atonement—

,..for it is on **this** day that <u>atonement</u> shall be made for you to **cleanse you**; you will be **clean** from all your <u>sins</u> before the LORD...

Now you shall have this as a **permanent statute**, to make <u>atonement</u> for the **sons of Israel** for *all* their <u>sins</u> *once* every year."

(Leviticus 16:30, 34a)

And according to **the Law**, one may almost say,

<u>all</u> **things** are **cleansed with <u>blood</u>**,
and without **shedding of <u>blood</u>** there is <u>no</u> **forgiveness**. (Hebrews 9:22)

## III. The Requirements for Israel's Atonement

- A. The <u>High Priest</u>  $\rightarrow$  A <u>Mediator</u> for the **people** before **God** 
  - 1. Who first bathed in water and put on linen garments (Lev. 16:4)
  - 2. Who first made atonement for himself and his family (Lev. 16:3, 6, 14)
  - 3. Who is the *only* one who could "mediate" <u>atonement</u>, on behalf of **Israel** in the <u>Holy place</u>, and this he could do *only* on the **Day of Atonement** (Lev. 16:1-17)
- B. The Atonement Sacrifices
  - 1. A <u>sin offering</u> (one **bull**) to *atone* for the <u>High Priest</u> and <u>his family</u> (Lev. 16:6, 11)
  - 2. <u>Two male goats</u> for a <u>sin offering</u> to *atone* for the <u>sins</u> of the <u>people</u>, and to *atone* for the <u>holy place</u>, the <u>tent of meeting</u>, and the <u>altar</u> (Lev. 16:5, 7-10, 15-22)

- a. One *goat* to be <u>slain</u> as a <u>sin offering</u> before the LORD (Lev. 16:9, 15)
  - 1) its <u>blood</u> to be *sprinkled* on, and in front of the <u>Mercy seat</u>, <u>atoning</u> for the sins of the <u>people</u> (Lev. 16:15)
  - 2) its **blood** to be *sprinkled* to **atone** for the **holy place**, the **tent of meeting**, and the **altar** of burnt offering(Lev. 16:16-20)
- b. **One** *goat* to be **presented** "alive" as a <u>scapegoat</u>, to make *atonement* before the LORD (Lev. 16:10, 21-22)
  - 1) having *received* the <u>sins</u> of Israel through the **confession** the **High Priest** (Lev. 16:21)
  - 2) being then *released*, bearing Israel's <u>iniquities</u>, "taking *them* away" to a solitary land, and into the wilderness (Lev. 16:21b-22)
- 3. Two <u>burnt offerings</u>, *one* for Aaron, and *one* for the people (Lev. 16:5, 23-24)
- C. The Place of Propitiation  $\rightarrow$  The Mercy Seat

#### The LORD said to Moses:

"Tell your brother **Aaron** that he shall **not** enter at **any** time into the **holy place inside** the **veil**, **before the mercy seat** which is **on the ark**, or he will **die**; for **I** will appear in the cloud over the **mercy seat**...

- "...he (Aaron the High Priest) shall slaughter the goat of the sin offering which is for the people, and bring its blood inside the veil and do with its blood as he did with the blood of the bull, and sprinkle it on the mercy seat and in front of the mercy seat.

  (Leviticus 16:2, 15)
- II. The *Requirement* for <u>Our Atonement</u> → *Faith* in the <u>Person</u>, and the work of <u>Atonement</u> provided through Jesus the Messiah, (Romans 1:16-17, 3:21-25)
  - A. Who became *our* Great <u>High *Priest*</u> → our <u>Mediator</u>
    - 1. A **High** *Priest* who is **now** <u>exalted</u> **above** the **heavens**, <u>interceding</u> for us in the *heavenly* **tabernacle**, one that is "**not made** with **hands**" (Romans 8:34, Hebrews 4:14, 7:24-25, 8:1-2, 9:11, 24, 10:11-12)
    - 2. A **High** *Priest* who is **now** the **Mediator** of a **new and** *better* **covenant**, enacted on *better* **promises** (Hebrews 8:6-13, I Timothy 2:5)

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- 3. A **High** *Priest* who has an **eternal priesthood**, being a *Priest* after the **order** of **Melchizedek** (Psalm 110:4, Hebrews 5:6, 10, 6:19-20, 7:1-3, 23-24)
- 4. A **High** *Priest* who is **sinless** and **perfect**, yet, having been **tempted** like us, can be **truly sympathetic** to the **needs of men** (Hebrews 2:17-18, 4:14-16)
- 5. A *Priest* who has **entered** into the **holy place** of the *heavenly* **tabernacle**, and has, *through* **His own priceless blood**, obtained for us **sanctification** and *eternal* **redemption** (Hebrews 9:11-12, 13:12, I Peter 1:18-19)

### B. Who became our Atonement Sacrifice

1. Having become our eternal Sin Offering

Every **priest** stands daily ministering and offering time after time the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins; but **He (Messiah)**, having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, SAT DOWN AT THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD...

For by <u>one offering</u> He has perfected for all time those who are **sanctified**. (Hebrews 10:11-14)

;..but **now <u>once</u>** at the **consummation** of the **ages He** has been **manifested** to **put away** <u>sin</u> by the <u>sacrifice of Himself</u>.

(Hebrews 9:24-26)

2. Having been "sprinkled" and cleansed the Blood of His Sacrifice

Peter, an apostle of Jesus the Messiah, to those...

who are **chosen** according to the **foreknowledge** of **God the Father**, by the **sanctifying work** of the **Spirit**, to **obey Jesus the Messiah** and **be sprinkled** with **His blood**:.. (I Peter 1:1-2)

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And in the same way **he** (Moses) **sprinkled** both the **tabernacle** and **all the vessels** of the **ministry** with the **blood**.

And according to **the Law**, one may almost say, all things are <u>cleansed with blood</u>, and without shedding of <u>blood</u> there is no forgiveness. (Hebrews 9: 21-22)

3. Having become our eternal Scapegoat Offering

He (God) made Him (Messiah) who knew no sin <u>to be sin</u> on our behalf, so that **we** might become the **righteousness of God in Him**. (II Cor. 5:21)

You know that **He (Messiah) appeared** in order to <u>take away sins</u>; and **in Him** there is **no sin**. (I John 3:5)

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As far as the <u>east</u> is from the <u>west</u>, So far has **He** <u>removed our transgressions</u> from **us**. (Psalm 103:12)

## C. Who became our Place of Propitiation → "Mercy Seat"

But now **apart** from the **Law**the **righteousness of God** has been **manifested**,..

even the **righteousness of God** through <u>faith</u> in **Jesus the Messiah**...

...being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Messiah Jesus;

whom **God** *displayed* <u>publicly</u> as a <u>propitiation</u> in <u>His blood</u> through **faith**. (Romans 3:21a, 22, 24-25a)

## **A Vital Question**

If we Jews are required by Torah Law to have

→a High Priest to offer sacrifice

→a Sin offering for Atonement

→a Scapegoat offering for Atonement

→a Place of <u>Propitiation</u> (the <u>mercy seat</u> in the Holy Place),

do *we* really have an **Atonement** for **our sins** before a **holy God**?

What about **Believers**???

My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin.

And if anyone <u>sins</u>, we have <u>an Advocate</u> with the Father, Jesus the Messiah the righteous;

and <u>He Himself</u> is the <u>propitiation</u> for our <u>sins</u>; and *not* for ours only, but also for *those of* the whole world. (I John 2:1-2)
