Yom Kippur Our Belief in Yeshua <u>fulfills</u> the *Requirements* for our Eternal <u>Atonement</u>

A. Our *Belief* in Yeshua means that we have a <u>Kohain Gadol</u>, a great <u>High Priest</u> who intercedes for us in a Heavenly Tabernacle "*not* made with hands." (Hebrews 4:14, 7:24-25, 8:1-2, 9:11-12, 24, 10:11-12)

Therefore, since we have a great <u>high priest</u> who has **passed through** the **heavens**, <u>Jesus</u> the Son of God, let us hold fast our **confession**. (Hebrews 4:14)

1. *We have* an *eternal* <u>Priest</u> that was **ordained by God** according to the **order** of <u>Melchizedek.</u> (Psalm 110:4) (Hebrews 5:5-6, 10, 6:20, 7:11, 17)

So also **Messiah** did *not* glorify Himself so as to become a high priest, but He who said to Him, "YOU ARE MY SON, TODAY I HAVE BEGOTTEN YOU";

> just as **He says** also in another *passage*, "**YOU** ARE A <u>PRIEST FOREVER</u> ACCORDING TO THE **ORDER OF** <u>MELCHIZEDEK</u>." (Hebrews 5:5-6)

We have a <u>Priest</u> who also was "flesh and blood," and having experienced temptation and suffering as a man, could *truly* be <u>sympathetic</u> to the needs of men. (Hebrews 2:17-18, 4:15-16)

For we **do not** have a <u>high priest</u> who *cannot* <u>sympathize</u> with our **weaknesses**, but **One** who has been *tempted* in **all things** as *we are, yet without sin*.

Therefore let us **draw near** with **confidence** to the **throne of grace**, so that we may receive **mercy** and find **grace to help** in time of **need**. (Hebrews 4:15-16)

3. We have a Priest who is Sinless and Perfect

For it was fitting for us to have such a <u>high priest</u>, *holy, innocent, undefiled, separated* from sinners and *exalted* above the heavens; (Hebrews 7:26, 4:15)

- 4. *We have* a <u>Priest</u> who holds **His Priesthood** <u>Permanently</u>. (after the order of **Melchizedek**) (Hebrews 6:19-20, 7:1-3, 23-25)
- The *former* priests (Levitical), on the one hand, existed in greater *numbers* because they were prevented by <u>death</u> from *continuing*,

but <u>Yeshua</u>, on the other hand, because **He continues** <u>forever</u>, holds **His priesthood** <u>permanently</u>.

Therefore **He** is **able** also to **save** <u>forever</u> those who *draw near* to **God** *through* **Him**, since **He** <u>always</u> lives to make intercession for them. (Hebrews 7:23-25)

5. *We have* a <u>Priest</u> who is **now** the **Mediator** of a **new** and *better* <u>Covenant</u>, enacted on *better* **promises** (Hebrews 7:22, 8:6-13, 9:15, 12:24)

Now the **main point** in what has been said *is this*: we have such a <u>high priest</u>, who has taken **His seat** at the **right hand** of the **throne** of the **Majesty** in the **heavens**,..

Now if **He (Jesus)** were on **earth**, **He** would **not** be a **priest at all**, since there are **those** who **offer the gifts** according to the **Law**;...

But *now* He has obtained a more excellent ministry, by as much as He is also the <u>mediator</u> of a *better* <u>covenant</u>, which has been **enacted** on *better* **promises**. (Hebrews 8:1, 4, 6)

- B. Our *Belief* in Yeshua means that, not only do we have a High Priest, but we have an *Eternal* <u>Atonement Offering</u> for our Sins.
 - 1. We have an <u>Offering</u> that is a *Final* <u>Sacrifice</u> for <u>Sin</u> (Hebrews 7:26-27, 9:24-28, 10:10-14)

By this (God's) will we have been *sanctified* through the <u>offering</u> of the body of Jesus Messiah <u>once for all</u>.

Every **priest** stands **daily ministering** and **offering** time after time the **same sacrifices**, which can *never* **take away sins**;

but **He (Messiah)**, having **offered** <u>one sacrifice</u> for <u>sins</u> for *all time*, *SAT DOWN* AT THE **RIGHT HAND** OF **GOD**, waiting from that time onward UNTIL **HIS ENEMIES** BE MADE A **FOOTSTOOL** FOR **HIS FEET**.

For by <u>one offering</u> He has *perfected* for all time those who are *sanctified*. (Hebrews 10:10-14)

 We Have an <u>Offering</u>, whose shed <u>blood</u> has brought about our eternal <u>Redemption</u>. (I Peter 1:18-19, Ephesians 1:7)

But when **Messiah appeared** *as* a <u>high priest</u> of the good things to come, *He entered* through the greater and more **perfect tabernacle**, *not made* with **hands**, that is to say, not of this **creation**; and *not through* the *blood* of goats and calves, but *through* His own <u>blood</u>, He entered the holy place *once* for all, having obtained <u>eternal redemption</u>. (Hebrews 9:11-12)

3. *We have* an <u>Offering</u> by which *we have* been are "<u>sprinkled</u>" and <u>cleansed</u> from our <u>Sins</u>

For when every **commandment** had been spoken by **Moses** to all the people according to the **Law**, he took the **blood** of the **calves** and the **goats**, with **water** and **scarlet wool** and **hyssop**, and **sprinkled** both the **book** itself and **all the people**,..

And in the **same way** he **sprinkled** both the **tabernacle** and all the **vessels** of the **ministry** with the **blood**.

And according to the **Law**, *one may* almost *say*, *all things* are <u>cleansed</u> with <u>blood</u>, and without shedding of <u>blood</u> there is <u>no</u> forgiveness. (Hebrews 9:19-22)

Peter, an apostle of Jesus the Messiah, to those ...

who are *chosen* according to the **foreknowledge** of **God the Father**, by the *sanctifying work* of the **Spirit**, to *obey* Jesus the Messiah and <u>be sprinkled</u> with <u>His blood</u>:...(I Peter 1:1-2)

But you have come to **Mount Zion** and to the **city** of the **living God**, the **heavenly Jerusalem**, and to myriads of **angels**,..

and to <u>Jesus</u>, the **mediator** of a **new covenant**, and to the <u>sprinkled blood</u>, which speaks better than *the blood* of Abel. (Hebrews 12:22, 24)

4. *We have* an <u>Offering</u> by which we have received <u>propitiation</u>, *through* Messiah's <u>sacrifice</u> on the cross, and His Priestly <u>intercession</u> in Heaven.

Therefore, **He (Jesus)** had to be made like **His brethren** in all things, so that **He might become** a *merciful* and *faithful* high priest in things pertaining to **God**, to make <u>propitiation</u> for the sins of the people.

(Hebrews 2:17)

But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been manifested,... even the righteousness of God through <u>faith</u> in Jesus the Messiah...

...being **justified** as a **gift** by **His grace** through the <u>redemption</u> which is **in Messiah Jesus**;

whom **God** *displayed* <u>publicly</u> as a <u>propitiation</u> <u>in His blood</u> through faith. (Romans 3:21a, 22, 24-25a) My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may <u>not sin</u>.

And if **anyone** <u>sins</u>, we have <u>an Advocate</u> with the Father, Jesus the Messiah the *righteous*;

and <u>He Himself</u> is the <u>propitiation</u> for our <u>sins</u>; and *not* for ours only, but also for *those* of the **whole world.** (I John 2:1-2)

Personal Exhortation — A Vital Discussion

If Torah Law <u>requires</u> that we need both a <u>High Priest</u> to mediate and the <u>blood</u> of a <u>Sin Offering</u>, on *Yom Kippur*, the **Day of Atonement** (Lev. 16), do we Jews actually *have* an **Atonement**, and **Forgiveness** of our sins before a holy God *today*?

Now **one** might say, "We **don't** have these <u>requirements</u> *now* because we **neither** have a **Priesthood** nor a **Temple**."

Well, **why not? Why** do we <u>not</u> have a **Temple**, or a **High Priest**, or a **true <u>Torah</u> Atonement**, and **why** have **we not** had them for over **2,000 years** ?

Could it possibly be because **Israel** had *rejected*, at that time, their *long anticipated* **Messiah** and **King sent** to them **by God**?

Now with regard to **Believers**, both **Jews** and **Gentiles**→

- → *We do* have a Kohain Gadol, a great <u>High Priest</u> who intercedes and mediates for us *eternally* in the heavens.
- → We do have an <u>Atonement</u> for our <u>sins</u> through the "once for all" <u>sacrifice</u> of Yeshua—the Lamb of God (John 1:36).
- → We can now <u>draw near</u> to God to a "throne of grace," so that we may receive mercy and grace to help in time of need (Heb. 3:16).

Therefore, **brethren**, since we have **confidence** to **enter** the *holy place* by the <u>blood</u> of Jesus, by a <u>new</u> and <u>living</u> way which **He inaugurated** for us *through* the <u>veil</u>, that is, **His flesh**,... (Hebrews 10:19-20)
