1. The *Parable* of the <u>Sower</u> (4:1-20)

- a. *Introduction* of the <u>Parable</u> (4:1-12)
- **4 He** began to **teach again** by the **sea**. And such a very **large crowd** gathered to **Him** that **He** got into a **boat** in the sea and sat down; and the **whole crowd** was by the **sea** on the land.
 - ² And **He** was **teaching** them many things in <u>parables</u>, and was saying to them in **His teaching**,
 - ³ "Listen to this! Behold, the sower went out to sow;
 - ⁴ as he was **sowing**, some *seed* fell beside the <u>road</u>, and the **birds** came and **ate it up**.
- ⁵Other *seed* fell on the <u>rocky ground</u> where it did **not** have **much soil**; and **immediately** it **sprang up** because it had **no depth** of **soil**.

⁶ And after the sun had risen, it was scorched; and because it had *no root*, it withered away.

- ⁷Other **seed** fell among **the** <u>thorns</u>, and the **thorns** came up and **choked it**, and it yielded **no crop**.
- ⁸ Other seeds fell into the <u>good soil</u>, and as they grew up and increased, they yielded a crop and produced thirty, sixty, and a hundredfold."
 - ⁹ And **He** was saying, "He who has **ears** to *hear*, let him *hear*."
 - ¹⁰ As soon as **He** was alone, **His followers**, along with the **twelve**, *began* **asking Him** *about* the **<u>parables</u>**.

¹¹ And He was saying to them,
"To you has been given the mystery of the kingdom of God, but those who are outside get everything in parables,

¹² so that WHILE SEEING, THEY MAY SEE AND NOT PERCEIVE, AND WHILE HEARING, THEY MAY HEAR AND NOT UNDERSTAND, OTHERWISE THEY MIGHT RETURN AND BE FORGIVEN."

b. *Interpretation* of the <u>Parable</u> (4:13-20)

¹³ And He said to them, "Do you not understand this <u>parable</u>? How will you understand <u>all</u> the parables?

¹⁴ The **sower sows the word**.

¹⁵ These are the ones who are beside the <u>road</u> where the <u>word</u> is sown; and when they hear, *immediately* Satan comes and <u>takes away</u> the <u>word</u> which has been sown *in them*.

¹⁶ In a similar way these are the ones on whom seed was sown on the <u>rocky places</u>, who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it with joy;

¹⁷ and they have <u>no firm root</u> in themselves, but are *only* **temporary**; then, when **affliction** or **persecution** arises because of the **word**, **immediately** they *fall away*.

¹⁸ And others are the ones on whom seed was sown among the <u>thorns</u>; these are the ones who have heard the word,

¹⁹ but the worries of the world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things enter in and <u>choke</u> the word, and it becomes <u>unfruitful</u>.

²⁰ And **those** are the ones on whom **seed** was **sown** on the **<u>good soil</u>**; and they **hear the word** and **accept it** and **bear** <u>**fruit**</u>, **thirty, sixty**, and a **hundredfold**."

Summary/Application—The Parable of the Sower

The **"Seed"** of **God's Word** is being *Sown* throughout the **World**. The various **"Soils"** are the *hearts* of men that <u>hear</u> and <u>respond</u> to the **"Seed"** of <u>God's Word</u> being *Sown* upon them.

To which "Soil" can you be likened to?

A. Are you like the *seed* that fell on *hardened* <u>highways</u> which the **birds** came and **ate up**? These are **likened** to **those** who **hear** the **word of God**, but have it *immediately* **snatched** from their **hearts** by **Satan**? (4:4, 15)

- B. Are you like the *seed* that fell on <u>rocky ground</u> that *immediately* sprang up because there was no <u>depth</u> of soil? As a result, after the sun came up and scorched the plant, it withered away since it had <u>no root</u>. These are likened to those that hear the word of God with joy. However, because they have <u>no</u> firm <u>roots</u>, they immediately "fall away" when affliction and persecution arise because of the word. (4:5-6, 16-17)
- C. Are you like the *seed* that fell among <u>thorns</u>. When the <u>thorns</u> came up they <u>choked</u> the plant, and it yielded <u>no crop</u>? These are likened to those who hear the word of God, but the worries of the world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts for other things enter in and <u>choke</u> the <u>word</u>, making them <u>unfruitful</u>. (4:7, 18-19)
- D. Are you like the *seed* that fell into <u>good soil</u>, who grew and increased and became <u>fruitful</u>. These are they who hear the word and <u>accept it</u>, and bear fruit thirty, sixty, and hundredfold. (4:8, 20)

Personal Application As **Believers**, we are **called** to be **Sowers** of the **"Seed"** of the **Word of God**, and **Bear Fruit** for **God**

A. Sowing God's Word of Salvation

For I (Paul) am not ashamed of the <u>gospel</u>, for it is the **power of God** for <u>salvation</u> to <u>everyone</u> who <u>believes</u>, to the **Jew first** and also to the **Greek**. (Romans 1:16)

Now I **make known** to you, brethren, the **gospel** which I **preached** to you, which also you **received**, in which also you **stand**, by which also you are **<u>saved</u>**, if you **hold fast** <u>the word</u> which I **preached** to you, unless you **believed in vain**. (I Corinthians 15:1-2)

B. Sowing God's Word of Eternal Life

Simon Peter answered **Him (Jesus)**, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of <u>eternal life</u>. (John 6:68)

...prove yourselves to be **blameless** and **innocent**, **children of God** above reproach in the **midst** of a **crooked** and **perverse** generation, among whom **you** appear as <u>lights</u> in the **world**, **holding fast** the <u>word of life</u>, (Philippians 2:15b-16a)

C. Sowing God's Word of Truth

In **Him (Messiah),** you also, after **listening** to the **message of** <u>truth</u>, the <u>gospel</u> of your *salvation*—having also *believed*,

you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise, (Ephesians 1:13)

Be **diligent** to present yourself **approved to God** as a **workman** who does **not need** to be ashamed, **accurately** handling the **word of** <u>truth</u>. (II Timothy 2:15)

D. Sowing God's Words of Spiritual "Nourishment" and Growth

...you have been **born again** not of <u>seed</u> which is *perishable* but *imperishable*, *that is*, through the **living** and **enduring** <u>word of God</u>.

like **newborn** *babies*, long for the **pure milk** of the <u>word</u>, so that **by it** you may <u>grow</u> in respect to <u>salvation</u>, (I Peter 1:23, 2:2)

E. Sowing God's Word of <u>Righteousness</u>

All <u>Scripture</u> is *inspired* by God and profitable for *teaching*, for *reproof,* for *correction*, for *training in <u>righteousness</u>;*

so that the **man of God** may be **adequate**, **equipped** for every <u>good work</u>. (II Timothy 3:16-17)

F. Sowing God's Word of Reconciliation

...God was *in Messiah* <u>reconciling</u> the world to Himself,... and He has committed to <u>us</u> the word of <u>reconciliation</u>.

Therefore, we are *ambassadors* for Messiah, as though God were making an appeal *through* us; we beg you on behalf of Messiah, be <u>reconciled</u> to God. (II Corinthians 5:19-20)

G. Sowing God's Word of Hope

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus the Messiah, who according to His great *mercy* has caused us to be *born again* to a *living hope through* the <u>resurrection</u> of Jesus the Messiah from the dead,...

,...but *sanctify* Messiah as Lord in your <u>hearts</u>, always *being* ready to make a *defense* to everyone who asks you to give an account for the <u>hope</u> that is **in you**, yet with **gentleness** and **reverence**; (I Peter 1:3, 3:15)
